I WOULD like to mention that last month's figure "Curlique" was incorrectly spelled—not by your coordinator but by whoever gets the material ready and printed up at Cody's. I wish whoever gets the copy ready would accept the spelling of square dance terms sent in and not change them because they "appear" incorrect. Curique is always spelled with a Q not a C.—Jack Lasry.

A great many liberties have been taken with the English language by sign painters who made it BAR BQ instead of spelling it properly (BAR BEGUE) that Cody's proofroom and office style manual require changing of BAR BEQUE and other crudities to conform to the style. After consultation it was agreed that "curlique" should be pronouned CURLY-CUE and if so should not be spelled to rhyme with "physique." We'll admit our fight should be with the original author who has the right to spell his proper name any way he wants to.

THROUGH Bow & Swing I would like to thank all the dancers who attended the benefit dance held in my behalf. My special thanks to the callers of the SEFCA who gave of their time and talent to make the dance the huge success it was.

Joe Curtis to be Honored in Orlando With Appreciation Dance March 31

Curtis celebrated his 74th birthday last December. He and his wife, Ruth, have been married for twenty years. He has one daughter, Mrs. Carl Horwich, who lives in Bedford, New York with her husband and two children.

Beginning his long career in square dancing in Oklahoma City in 1943, Curtis called at American Legion Saturday night barn dances. He learned to dance in 1944 and called for clubs and taught classes until 1954. He and Ruth then moved to Tennessee where he continued to call and teach there, as well as in Arkansas, Mississippi and Alabama. They came to Florida in March, 1957.

He helped to organize square dance clubs in Sanford, Winter Park and Orla Vista, turning outsome of the most qualified dancers in the state. With Ruth's help, he has also taught round dances for the past 15 years.

In his earlier calling years, Curtis attended callers' clinics in Texas and New Mexico; attended and participated in several national square dance conventions,

For several years Joe has suffered with duodenal ulcers. In January of this year he was hospitalized for surgery and spent five weeks in the hospital. Back at home now, he is doing well, learning to eat again and has just been allowed to return to his bookkeeping job for a couple of hours a day.

All square and round dancers who wish to show their appreciation for all the hard work and time that Curtis has devoted to their favorite pastime won't forget the date, March 31, and be on hand to wish him a speedy recovery.



Spin a Web is by Bob Kent of Warwick, Rhode Island. Set it up from a double pass thru position; lead couples in an ocean wave. The ocean wave can be left out later after positions are well esta-

On the call Spin a Web, the ocean wave couple starts the i

On the call Spin a Web, the ocean wave couple starts the figure by the ends swinging half-new centers turn 3/4 and form a three-hand right hand star with the inactive couples. Turn the star one full turn and a little more to allow the dancer behind the active one to move into the center and turn 3/4 to re-form an ocean wave in the center. The outside couple face to the center awaiting the next call.

The following are some examples by

Heads star thru, do an ocean wave, spin a web, (swing ½-boys turn left ¾ to a right hand star, turn once around and a little bit more, side men turn left 34, balance).

Spin a web, (swing½-girls turn left ¾ to a right hand star, turn once around and a little bit more, side ladies center turn 34, balance), right and left thru, pass thru, left allemande.

Heads swing thru, spin the top, spin a web-spin a web-, step thru, left allemande.

It will take a little work on the part of caller and dancer to enjoy it, but try spin a web and determine for yourselves.

I'm a Swinger/Inst. (113A) Caller: Walt McNeel-An acceptable dance to the currently popular western tune. Walt McNeel does a very good job on the called side.

Cincinnati Ohio/Inst. (Hi Hat 358) Caller: Dick Cary-An unsuitable, undistinguishable tune with a nasal western croon on the called side. This is a terrible record.

Two Timin' Gal/Inst. (Sunny Hills 6001) Caller: Earl Neff—This is the traditional style of Sunny Hills complete with vamp piano and two bar break. Competent call on reverse side.

Gentle on My Mind/Inst. (Wagon Wheel 113) Caller: Don Franklin-A good dance set to the Grammy Award winner. Don does a very good job with just the right amount of echo chamber. I like this one.

Texas Plains/Inst. (Windsor 4891) Caller: Bob Van Antwerp-A lightly disguised version of "When Payday Rolls Around." A good dance; listen to Bob Van Antwerp and learn how to deliver a singing call. Key change on this record.

Loves to Swing/Inst. (Windsor 4892) Caller: Dick Hoffman-This is "Last Night on the Back Porch." Dick does a good job on the called side. Standard Windsor fare.

Interstate 35/Jet Stream (Kalox 1077) Hoedowns-Keys "A" and "G". Solid beat, Interstate is a well-disguised version of "Boil the Cabbage." Jet Stream is a quiet chord progres-

Round Dance Council Plans Fall Festival For November 1-3

And next year's Spring Workshop Festival will be held in Fort Lauderdale in the fine wood-floored ballroom of the Gover-

nor's Club Hotel. More than 150 people attended the Spring event in Lakeland's Municipal Auditorium which included Saturday morning and afternoon sessions and a Sunday afternoon session. Lora Bookmiller was chairman of the meeting, assisted by Bill Bliss as vice chairman. Helen Danklefs handled publicity and reservations. Lu Markle the program, and Phil Betts was responsible for sound. President By Markle of Venice expressed his appreciation for the work represented.

New dances introduced at the festival include Sweetheart Waltz (McGregor 5000) presented by Charles and Madeline Lovelace of Tampa, and Sweetie Pie (Coral 62547) presented by Ted and Lois Mack of Miami.

Three workshop sessions were presented on Saturday. The Markles' notes on 'posture, position, leading and styling" included this advice:

"If you want to look well on the dance floor, stand tall with a straight line going through the ear, shoulder, hip, knee and ankle, feet together, toes pointed straight ahead, weight on balls of the feet, knees relaxed, hips level, chest lifted, shoulders in a free and easy position, head up."

The Macks of Miami presented the national panel recommendations on standardization of terms and cues. In punctuating round dance instruction or cue sheets, it was recommended the diagonal be used only to indicate two steps to one beat. (Run, 2, 3, step/step).

Art and Dorothea Brammeier of Melbourne conducted a Saturday morning workshop on basic steps and common

At the council's business meeting on Sunday morning President Markle reported that the 10th Street Auditorium would be reserved for round dancing purposes on Friday and Saturday during the State Square Dance Convention in Miami in mid-Tune.

Iim and Aline Infantino of Miami have been named chairman of a committee to represent the council in arrangements for the convention.

The council approved a plan whereby members of the Florida Callers Association would be given advance notice and cue sheets of the square dancers' round of the month. Tom McRorie of Gainesville urged that they can be taught in ten minutes to square dance clubs. Bill Bliss, round dance coordinator, agreed this was the objective.

Dances programmed for the Spring Festival, Markle said, were picked from preferences sent in by members. From the list he had compiled the "top 20" rounds: Doodley Cha, Marnie and In the Arms of Love headed the list.

"Half of those requested were on pop labels," Markle added.

(½ Box) Side, Close, FWD, -; (Scis Thru) Side, Close, Thru, - (to SCP); FWD Two-Step; FWD Two-Step (to face);

1 In Loose-Closed pos M's back to COH step swd L, close R to L, fwd L, hold 1 ct; 2 Step swd R, close L to R, cross thru on R, (both XIF) blend to Semi-Closed, hold; 3-4 In semi-closed pos do 2 fwd two-steps LOD & blend to Closed pos M's back COH;

(Vine) Side, Behind, Side, Front; Pivot, -, 2, -; Turn Two-Step; Turn Two-Step;

5 In Loose-Closed pos vine LOD swd L, cross R in back (both XIB), swd L, cross R in front (both XIF);

6 Staring on M's L in Closed pos do a couple pivot in 2 slow steps;

7-8 Starting M's L do 2 R-face turning twosteps LOD to end with M's back to COH; (½Box) Side, Close, Fwd, -; (Scis Thru) Side, Close, Thru, - (to SCP); FWD Two-Step. FWD Two-Step (to face)

9-12 Repeat the action of Meas 1 thru 4; (Vine) Side, Behind, Side, Front; Pivot, -, 2, -;

Turn Two-Step; Turn Two-Step; 13-16 Repeat the action of Meas 5 thru 8 EXCEPT end in Open pos facing LOD;

(Open) Rock Apart, -, Recov, -; Cross, Side, Cross, -; Rock Apart, -, Recov, -; Cross, Side, Cross (to Open),-;

17 In Open pos facing LOD rock swd apart on L (retain hand hold), hold 1 ct, recover on R, hold 1 ct;

18 Release hands to change sides (M passes in back of W) cross L over R (both XIF), swd R, again cross L over R, hold 1 count (join hands in L-Open pos) (face LOD);

19 Rock swd apart on R (keep inside hands joined), hold 1 ct, recover on L, hold 1 ct; 20 Again release hands and change sides (M in back of W) cross R over L (both XIF), swd L, cross R, hold 1 ct and blend to Open pos facing LOD:

(Open) Rock FWD, -, Recov, -; (Hitch) Back, Close, FWD (to SCP), -; FWD, -, Pickup, -; (CP) FWD Two-Step;

21 In Open pos facing LOD rock fwd on L, hold 1 ct, recover on R, hold 1 ct; 22 Do a bwd hitch stepping bwd on L, close on R to L, fwd L (blend to SCP), hold 1 ct;

26 Step diag COH and LOD on L, close R to L, cross L in front of R (W XIB) blending to Sidecar pos M facing diag LOD and twd wall, hold

27 In Sidecar pos move diag fwd twd wall and LOD 2 slow steps R, -, L, -;

28 Step diag swd and fwd on R, close L to R, cross R over L (W XIB) and blend to Closed pos M facing wall, hold 1 ct;

(CP) Turn Two-Step; Turn Two-Step; Twirl, -, 2, -; (SCP) Walk, -, 2, - (to CP);

29-30 In Closed pos do 2 R-face turning twosteps LOD;

31 As M walks LOD 2 slow steps (L, -, R, -) the W W twirls R-face under joined lead hands blending to Semi-Closed pos and facing LOD; 32 In Semi-Closed pos walk LOD 2 slow steps (L, -R, -) blending to CP M facing wall;
