Star Prow

IACK LASRY, square dance coordinator, reports an old timer. Star Prowl, is the feature for August.

It is a member of the Grand Square family and gives dancers and callers a change from the usual. Many will already know the figure, but a quick teaching job will give everyone a relaxed break during summer dances.

Call will be, sides back to back, Star



JACK LASRY

Prowl. Figure for heads: heads forward 4 steps, star thru; back out 4 steps, turn back on partner, walk forward 4 steps, turn corner; walk forward 4 steps toward head position and star thru-repeat.

Figure for sides is: sides back to back with partner, walk forward 4 steps, turn corner, walk forward 4 steps toward head position and star thru; walk forward 4 steps and star thru, back away 4 steps, turn back on partner-repeat.

Figure takes 32 beats and dancers will be returned to home position.

In teaching star prowl callers may wish to teach only the heads part while sides rest. Reverse situation and finally put them together. It is suggested you walk heads slowly, then call figure for heads without music, followed by call with music. Repeat for sides and put the different parts together and walk and call the figure. It is a smooth flowing call, so try it for summer relayation.

Jake Shelnutt sends a figure aptly named Round and Spread, combining Roundoff and the "spread" portion of Wheel and Spread. Dancers first do a roundoff and the outside squeeze in to form a line. (This can be called directionally to dancers by calling "roundoffoutsides in"). Examples follow:

Round and Spread

Heads lead to the right, circle to a line, pass thru, roundoff, outsides in, cast off 3/4, cross trail, left allemande.

Colin Waltons's record review follows: Who's World?/Blue Star 1832, Caller: Al Brownlee-This tune was unfamiliar to me.

There is very little about this record that I could recommend.

Baby That's Living/Hi Hat 361. Caller: Ernie Kinney-Another piece of unsuitable music from Hi Hat. Ernie Kinney sings his way through it.

In Your Heart/Hi Hat 362, Caller: Dick Weaver-Apart from a couple of bars of music this sounds like a very poor version of 'Freight

Train.' Dick Weaver sings it nicely.

Foggy Mountain/Red Boot 107. Caller:
Don Williamson—I don't whether it was only the copy I received but this was a very poor quality pressing, which doesn't help to sell a record. This is very 'country music' in flavor.

Little Green Apples/Wagon Wheel 114. Caller: Don Franklin-Don is obviously a Roger Miller fan (so am I for that matter) but this one would have been better left on the 'pop' charts. In any case, Don should have stayed off the instrumental side as only he could successfully harmonize with his own voice.

L. David Sloane/Green 12103. Caller: Earl Johnston-Another 'pop' which Earl Johnston calls very successfully, but the club caller is
