

# Bow & Swing

### Miami State Convention Drew 2500 Dancers

### Dancers, Callers and Round Dance Council Hold Business Meetings

CAUTIOUSLY called the biggest in Florida history the fifteenth annual Florida Square and Round Dance Convention taxed the capacity of the Miami Beach Auditorium and the Hotel DiLido Cotillion Room and raised the question of future sites in the Miami area.

Jim Kier, convention chairman, was warm in his praise for the committee, the callers and others who helped make it a success. The weekend came to a close on Sunday, June 15, when board members of the Florida Callers Association, the Florida Federation of Square Dancers and the members of Round Dance Council of Florida had their respective meetings in the DiLido.

No figures were available, although attendance of 2500 was announced at one time during the Saturday evening dance. Identical programs were run at both the auditorium and the hotel ballroom Saturday evening; both were crowded, some squares even danced in the hotel lobby.

Hindsight is always better than foresight, and at the federation meeting it was recommended that future conventions require written registration of all those in attendance, including callers, round dance instructors, and children of dancing couples. Advance registration in all cases would speed up admissions at the gate.

Kier warned that the cost of conventions is "growing by leaps and bounds," and thought the October meeting should review policies and regulations for the 1969 convention in Tampa.

Wally Stoltz reported Tampa dates were firm in Curtis Hixon Hall for June 19-21, that contracts were ready for signing, and that a new hotel would probably be ready with 250 rooms available.

Albert Martin said the 1970 convention is set in Orlando on June 11-13 and reviewed details of proposals received from the Fair concerning the exhibition hall, and the Robert Meyer Hotel which has doubled its number of available rooms.

George Oglesby called attention to federal legislation which he says has passed both houses changing national holidays to Mondays. Since mid-June Florida convention dates work hardships on many people attending the national convention the third weekend in June, he urged the consideration of the Memorial Day weekend for the Florida convention and proposed that the Florida Callers Association again be contacted with refer-

ence to a change in dates. Martin promised to try to get the Memorial Day dates reserved optionally for the 1970 convention, subject to final decision at the Labor Day board meeting in Clearwater.

Chairman Paul Lane said the North East Florida association expects to host the 1971 convention and has tentatively set the dates of June 18-20.

The suggestion by Dr. Al Hixon that dancers encourage their callers to attend the Florida Caller's Association Fall Clinic by canceling their club dances possibly in favor of large area dancers with out of state callers was discussed. Oglesby said dancers in the Southeast were willing to give up the dance for any callers who would attend the clinic.

A report on the traveling keys indicated some success in Central Florida after a change in rules so that clubs rather than individuals would have charge of the key, little enthusiasm in the Southeast, and static situations in Northeast Florida and the West Coast area where keys seem to be stuck.

At the Florida Callers meeting it was agreed that the round of the month would continue to be mailed in advance to callers. President Colin Walton thanked his officers and members for their cooperation in handling the programming of the convention. He was critical of the round dance programming, but felt overall it was a good convention. Tapes of the program were excellent, he said, in spite of acoustical problems, and the program material taped was "terrific."

Al Cody told both groups the Bow and Swing subscription dance effort did not meet with the success desired and that for the next twelve issues, the publication would be published within the limits of its income. Walton indicated the Florida Callers Association had some thoughts on the subject. "It would be a shame if it were to fold," commented Caller Bert Bennett.

Walton named Henry Purcell as chairman of the nominating committee and urged area members to make their nominations thoughtfully and early so that the October election would be smooth.

After considerable discussion the callers voted to reduce the share of convention proceeds transferred to the Round Dance Council, and in answer to no complaints whatever, Walton said the criterion for programming the Friday and Saturday evening dances was "to provide the best program possible" using callers of known dancer appeal.

At the meeting of the Round Dance Council Jim Infantino, who was appointed to serve as liaison to the convention, said he had no contact from the caller or dancer committees involved in the convention and insisted a lack of communication prevented smoother working of the interorganizational relationships. "I was never notified of any meetings of the committee," he said.

By Markle, president of the council, called on Bill Bliss and Ted Mack for details on the Fall and Spring festivals. Bliss said the George Washington Hotel in Jacksonville would be used on Nov. 1-3 and Mack said the Governor's Club Hotel in Fort Lauderdale would be the site on April 12-14.

Dorothea Brammaier thought it would be a good idea to try to program all members into the year's teaching activity rather than use the same couples over and over. She also urged members to respond now to her request for information for the year-by-year history of the organization "rather than wait until I have it all written up."

Bill and Betty Beattie were commended for their efforts in behalf of Round of the Month selections. It was thought that possibly six new rounds were too many for a convention, and it was also thought that six Rounds of the Month per year would be adequate, but no action was taken on these ideas.

## Partner Trade And 1/4 More

"PARTNER TRADE and ¼ more has been used for several months, but has not (in my opinion) been used to its fullest," says Jack Lasry, square dance coordinator. "The movement is extremely smooth, easy to learn and will fit any caller's style or level of dance."

Partner trade is no more than a California twirl, without using the hands. The same results can be obtained by calling a California twirl and ¼ more. The "¼ more" brings the dancers in face to face position with their partners.

The following are a couple of examples: Head couples pass thru, partner trade and ¼ more, box the gnat, square thru ¾, left alle-

mande. Head couples roll away ½ sashay, pass thru, partner trade and ¼ more, square thru ¾, left allemande.

Fred Christopher sent in some original dance figures with which to experiment:

Girls Spin A Web

Heads crosstrail thru, separate. Go around two, line up four. Pass thru, wheel & deal, girls do sa do. Then spin a web, that's what you do. In the middle, swing thru, step thru. Right & left thru the outside two. Dive thru, substitute. Centers
