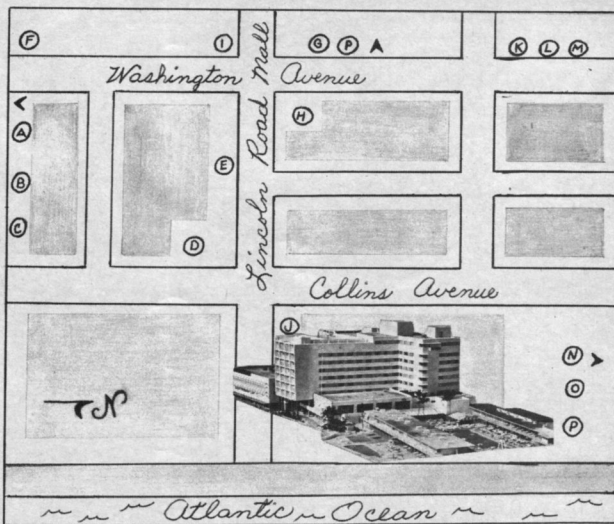

## Miami Hosts 15th Annual Meet

SQUARE DANCERS from around the state will be turning their steps and do-sa-doing in the direction of glamorous Miami Beach, playground of the world, when that city plays host to the 15th annual Florida State Square and Round Dance Convention, commencing June 13 at Miami Beach Auditorium.

Celebrated convention hotel, the Di-Lido on the corner of Collins Avenue and Lincoln Road, has been selected as main headquarters for this fun-filled, annual event, not only for its close proximity to the convention site, but its conveniently central location in the heart of Miami Beach's famed oceanside and shopping areas.

The DiLido offers delegates the same room rates for days preceding the convention and after . . . so you might possibly plan your entire summer vacation around the meeting. The hotel will coordinate tours, private meetings or parties, babysitters or nightclub reservations.

All those wishing to register should do so before May 15 for a fee of \$2.50 per square dancer, after which time it will be increased to \$3. No charge to children who do not square dance, but all who attend must be registered, so please enclose names on a separate sheet. Checks may be

## Box Circulate

BOX CIRCULATE, by Jim Stewart, is the feature call for June, as reported by Jack Lasry, square dance coordinator.

Circulate has become a standard call in our square dance picture, and really has more application from varied positions than most calls we use. The term "box" circulate is not new; it has been called



LASRY

"centers circulate" when centers are active, or "split circulate" when two separate boxes are active. The term box circulate seems very descriptive and to a large degree, directional to the dancer.

Box circulate means each person moves up one position in the group in which he is working. It needs a set up call, and if the caller does not use curlique, or the new call turn thru and  $\frac{1}{4}$  more, he still has two possibilities:

One, he may use a  $\frac{1}{4}$  cast off; or two, (the one Lasry feels is easiest to start with) is a star thru followed by U turn back by either girls or boys.

The following are a few examples:

Heads star thru, girls turn back, (curlique), centers box circulate, centers box circulate, girls U turn back, star thru, left allemande.

1 and 3 swing thru, cast off  $\frac{1}{4}$ , (check position), centers box circulate, girls turn back, left allemande.

1 and 3 square thru, swing thru, spin the top, cast off  $\frac{1}{4}$ , same 4, box circulate, same 4, box circulate, boys run, right and left thru, left allemande.

(Experimental position) Heads square thru, star thru, girls U turn back (curlique), box circulate, boys run, right and left thru, star thru, dive thru, square thru  $\frac{1}{4}$ , left allemande.

Try box circulate! It's really not a basic, but good usage of existing basics.

Fred Christopher sent in some original dance figures with which to experiment:

**Curlique &  $\frac{1}{4}$  More**

Heads lead right circle to a line, Slide thru, curlique and  $\frac{1}{4}$  more, Girls circulate, boys trade, Spin star thru, do a partners trade, Barge Thru, just don't stand. Corners all left allemande, etc.

**Spin Chain Thru Fun**

Heads pass thru, 'U' turn back, Slide thru, spin chain thru. Girls Double circulate, Girls trade, boys trade. Boys run, partners trade. Couples circulate, bend the line. Crosstrail thru, left allemande, etc. . .

**Girls Spin Chain Thru**

Heads swing thru, slide thru. Spin chain thru without a stop. Girls circulate, spin the top. Go right & left thru, turn your Sue. Slide thru, swing thru, make a wave. Rock it mate. Spin chain thru, boys circulate. Girls run, wheel & deal with that man. Turn thru, left allemande,

## Spin A Web

Heads slide thru, spin a web (Fill patter). Turn thru, split two, line up four. Dance up to the middle, back once more. Pass thru, wheel & deal. Square thru  $\frac{1}{4}$ 's man. Corners all left allemande, etc. . .

Colin Walton's record review for June follows:

**You Gotta Be Puttin' Me On/Inst.**

(Grenn 12101) Caller: Earl Johnston—A peppy dance with a peppy call from Earl Johnston. Although I do not recognize the tune, it is the right tempo and suitable for square dancing.

**Jackson/Inst. (Kalox 1079) Caller:**

Billy Lewis—This would have made a better head-down than a singing call, which goes to prove that a Hit Parade Country and Western number does not always make a good singing call.

**A Good Man/Inst. (Hi Hat 360) Caller:**

Dick Jones—Hi Hat does not seem to be able to decide whether to release a tune as a round dance or a square. This one should have been pressed under the round dance label. Apart from that, the dancers need running shoes to keep up with the figure.

**Rainbows are Back in Style/Inst.**

(Blue Star 1831) Caller: Marshall Flippo—This is not one of Marshall's better releases, but it is still better than 70% of the singing calls with which we are plagued today.

**Puddy Cat Square/Inst. (Windsor 4895)**

Caller: John Shallow—This tune was released some years ago and was very popular then. This is a new version, it has good music, is well called and has novelty.

**Little Red Sports Car/Inst. (Windsor 4896) Caller:** Al Brundage—This is a brand new version of "Little Reg Wagon". A perfectly timed dance as you would expect from Al Brundage, beautifully called.

Some callers may wish to speed up this record a little.

**Whoa Sailor/Inst. (MacGregor 2030)**

Caller: Frank Lesterance—I do not think this record will make the Hit Parade, however the music is good despite one ten count line. The caller presents it very well.

**I'm a Swinger/Inst. (MacGregor 2031)**

Caller: Allen Tipton—This is one of many releases for this tune. So far this is the only one I've enjoyed and it has the merit of presenting a novel figure.

**So Long Charlie Brown/Inst. (Top 25167) Caller:** George Peterson—The

Tiajuana Brass sound will not save this record from being a flop. Indeed "So Long, Charlie Brown"!!!

**Bare Necessities/Inst. (Top 25169)**

Caller: "Happy" Harry Pearson—Another usable singing call, but it won't last very long.

**Bare Necessities/Inst. (Square L 127)**

Caller: Tommy Farris—Same remarks as other version, but very 'thin' music. If you didn't need it on Top you won't need this one either.

## Round of the Month:

## Snow Flake

BILL AND PAT BLISS, round dance coordinators, report Snow Flake, recorded on Belco No. B-227-A, was chosen at the first Sunday Round of the Month Dance, to be their June selection.

Snow Flake was composed by Jerry and Jo Gierok of St. Paul, Minnesota, and was demonstrated by Jim and Shirley Vail. It is a good, easy square dancer level round.

Position is open facing for intro, M facing wall; dance—butterfly, M facing wall. Footwork opposite. Twirls in both "A" and "B" are slow. Tag is slow.

**1-4 Wait; Wait; Apart,-, Point,-; Together (To Bfly),-, Tch,-;**

1-2 In Open-Facing pos wait 2 measures;;  
3-4 Step apart L, hold, point R twd pr, hold;

**1-4 (Bfly) Face to Face; Bk to Bk; Two-Step Away; Two-Step Together;**

1 (Bfly) Prog LOD step swd L, close R to L, swd L, swing R ft & trailing hands thru (M turn away LF & W RF to bk-to-bk position);

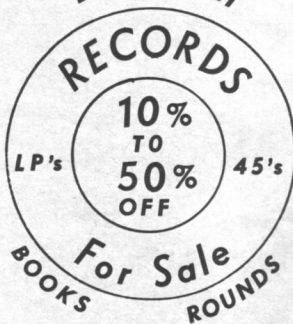
