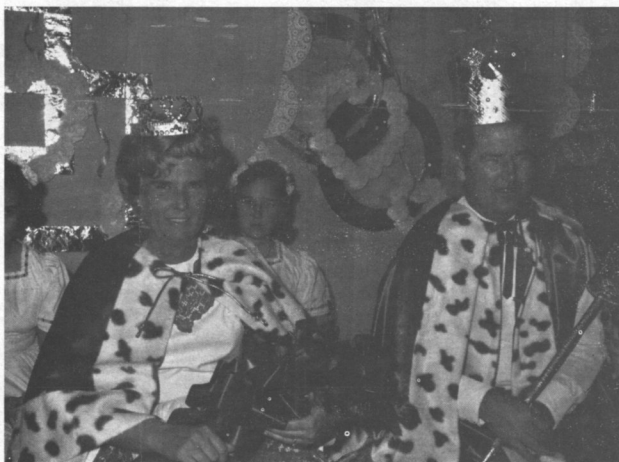

### Square Dance Coordinator:

CURLICUE, AN OLD-timer, was  
selected as the feature figure for March  
by Jack Lasry,  
square dance coord-  
inator.

Curlcue was  
written in 1961 by  
Clarence Watson,  
but at the time of  
its experimentation,  
it had very little  
lasting value. To-  
day, a great deal of  
our dance is based  
around the ocean  
wave figure as a  
start for circulate, swing thru, spin the  
top, etc., and curlcue can set up an  
ocean wave very smoothly.

This is a figure that can be used any  
time a man is facing a girl and can set up  
some interesting figures. In teaching  
curlcue, have the heads square thru and  
face their corner (this way, everyone is  
learning at the same time, not just the  
heads or sides). You may have the dancers  
place their right hands palms up to  
the one they face. For the men, the  
curlcue is the same as a star thru. The  
ladies make a left face  $\frac{3}{4}$  turn under the  
man's arm as they pass right shoulders.  
She ends up right beside him, but facing  
the opposite direction. At this point you  
have formed an ocean wave at the heads.  
For the sake of quick practice, have the  
ladies turn back, lines go up and back,  
curlcue, ladies turn back, curlcue,  
ladies turn back, curlcue, ladies turn  
back, left allemande.

Try curlcue with your dancers. It  
should make our dance even smoother  
and more interesting to the dancers.  
Here are some examples:

Heads square thru, curlcue, balance, girls  
run, left allemande.

Heads square thru, star thru, lines go up and  
back, curlcue, cast off  $\frac{3}{4}$ , right and left thru,  
star thru, left allemande.

Heads square thru, curlcue, balance, swing  
thru, centers run right, wheel and deal, left  
allemande.

Heads curlcue, follow your girl, split the  
sides, both turn left around one into the  
middle, dixie chain, lady left, man right, left  
allemande

Fred Christopher reported to your  
coordinator that in some areas the call,  
barge thru, was being called from an  
eight chain thru position, causing some  
confusion. This figure is usually called  
when lines of four are facing. In the  
interest of keeping the "gimmick" use  
of calls at workshop level, Lasry opin-  
ioned that Manny Amour, author of  
barge thru, intended the figure to be  
used only from two lines of four facing.

## Curlcue

He based this opinion on Amour's in-  
structions which require, after the  $\frac{1}{2}$   
square thru, the inside couples pass thru  
while the outside couples trade. After  
the  $\frac{1}{2}$  square thru from an eight chain  
thru position, there is no inside couple  
to pass thru, so why barge thru?

In the interest of good directional  
calling, you could say  $\frac{1}{2}$  square thru,  
partners trade. "We have enough con-  
fused dancers already, why not lend  
your support to good directional call-  
ing?" Lasry stated. He asks callers and  
dancers to please take the time to com-  
ment on this "hot potato." Write Jack

re-issued and has a better dance the second  
time around. Marshall does his usual superb  
job.

**Baby Blue Eyes/Inst.** (Jewel 143)  
Caller: Ted Joslin—Music is good though a  
trifle fast (144 MBM). The caller is unable to  
stay in tune.

**Just a Little Lovin'/Inst.** (Windsor 4889)  
Caller: Wayne West—The music is good - it  
is reminiscent of 'Walk, Walk'. Wayne West does  
an acceptable job.

**Yes, Yes/Inst.** (Windsor 4890)  
Caller: Bill Snaillum—This is a re-issue of 'Why  
Do They Always Say No.' The called side is  
usual Windsor standard.

**Snow Flakes/Inst.** (Square L 126)  
Caller: Jon Jones—This is not a familiar tune  
and has nothing special about it to recommend  
to you. The called side is good.

**My Gal County Style/Inst.** (Longhorn 166)  
Caller: Jerry Smith—This is another recording  
of 'Five Foot Two.' The called side would be  
improved if the caller were concentrating on  
the instructions rather than singing.

**It's Got To Be A Habit/Inst.** (Kalox 1076)  
Caller: Gaylon Shull—Another production  
number with nothing to recommend it. Called  
side is nice and clear.

**Free Wheeling Hobo/Inst.** (Sashay 109)  
Caller: Jack May—Same review as above.

**Something Stupid/Inst.** (Hi Hat 357)  
Caller: Ernie Kinney—This is the Sinatra hit  
and although at first it does not seem a  
suitable medium for a square dance the  
dancers like it. Ernie Kinney does a good  
job on the called side.

**Chinatown/Inst.** (Top 25161)  
Caller: Ralph Kinnane—This is a fast moving  
dance but if you already have a copy of  
Chinatown you don't need two. Called side  
is good.

**Humpty Dumpty Heart/Inst.** (Top 25162)  
Caller: Ben Baldwin—Club fare complete with  
a 'Barge Thru.' Called side is well done.

# Caprice

CAPRICE, A DANCE by Edna and Gene Arnfield, Skokie, Illinois, has been chosen by Pat and Bill Bliss, coordinators for the Florida Round Dance Council, as Round of the Month for March.

The choreographers say that in measures 20 and 24 some of the girls may find themselves becoming dizzy. It is acceptable for them to merely make a 1/2 right face turn instead of the 1 1/2 right face spin.

The dance starts in diagonal open facing position, dance is done in closed position with man facing line of dance. Footwork is opposite; directions are for the man except as noted:

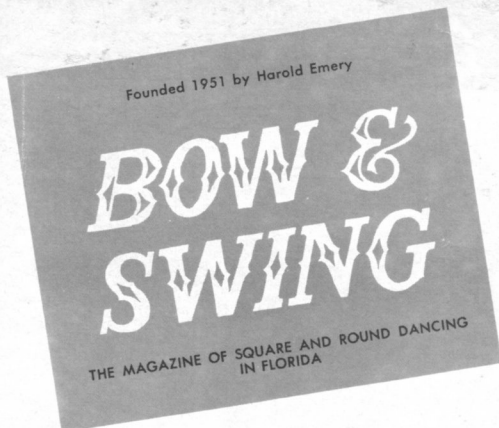
