## Gordon Blaum to Call for CFSRDA November 30 Shindig in Jacksonville

Blaum, one of Florida's finest callers, for your dancing pleasure at its' November 30 affair.

A real southerner, Blaum was born in Louisville, Kentucky, raised in Valdosta, Georgia, and moved to Lake Worth in his late teens.

Today he is one of the old masters of square dancing with 19

years of calling and teaching to his credit. Professionally, Blaum is a physical education director in an elementary school in Coral Gables. Avocationally, he conducts beginner classes, as well as calling for six clubs regularly at his Cross Trail Square Dance Center. One of

these clubs is the Guided Missiles, a blind square dance club.

Best known throughout the country for his choreography, Blaum has written over 2,000 breaks and figures. Many have been published through the years and perhaps his Centers, In-Centers Out and Singles Wheel are most widely used. He has recorded an advanced album on B&B label.

This year, Blaum and the Cross Trail Square Dance Center will be part of the magnificent New Year's Orange Bowl Parade. CBS and NBC will televise this with an hours re-run on New Year's Day. This will be the only American float in the parade and over 100 square dancers will be participating.

Attend the November 30 CFSRDA dance at Eustis Civic Center and enjoy square dancing at its' best. Ray and Lora Bookmiller will be cueing rounds. As an added attraction there will be an after party and skits by Orlando's Whirl & Twirl Club.

## Double the Dancer Promotion Nets Over \$400 for S.E. Fla.

THE DOUBLE the Dancer Jamboree, co-sponsored by the Southeast Florida Callers Association and Dancers Association, was a huge success.

Approximately 60 squares attended the dance with about 20 sets of non-dancers being introduced to square dancing. A color T. V. set and other door prizes were given away, with a profit of over \$400 to go toward the promotion of square dancing in the SE Florida area.

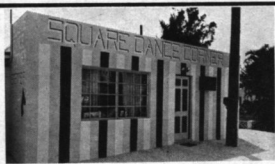

## Square to a Wave

SQUARE to a Wave, an old call originally known as Wave Thru, has been selected Square of the Month, by your coordinator, Jack Lasry.

We use the Ocean Wave a great deal in today's dance and Square to a Wave puts us into that position very nicely and has the variety of being a full Square to a Wave (4 hands) or the variations of 1/2 and 3/4 square to a wave.

Do the square thru, but on the last hand, hold it instead of pulling by, establishing an ocean wave. Heads square to a wave, then square thru 4 hands, holding the last hand (a left with original partner) and establish the wave.

If you call square to a wave 3/4—the dancers hold the third hand and make the wave. To call 1/2 square to a wave it is suggested you give the "1/2 square to a wave" because the 1/2 square thru is quick and, for better dancer reaction, they need the command first. Examples follow:

Square to a wave

1 & 3 square to a wave, boys run, bend line, box the gnat, cross trail to left allemande.

1 & 3 square to a wave, 3/4, swing thru, boys run, wheel & deul, cross trail, left allemande.

To report on the survey in the September issue, the number of blanks returned was quite disappointing—less than 25 were received. From those, it appears that *Spin a Web* was the most widely used; second was *Fan the Top*, then *Trade the Wave*.

Wait: Wait Apart, —, Point, —; Together, —, (SCP) Touch, —; 1-2 Wait 2 meas in Open-Facing pos with M's R hand and W's L joined; 3 Step apart on L, hold 1 ct, point R twd partner, hold 1 ct; 4 Step together on R, hold 1 ct, touch L to R while holding to Semi-Closed pos facing LOD, hold 1 ct; (SCP) Fwd Two-Step; Fwd Two-Step; Walk, —, 2, — (Pickup) 3, —, 4, —; 1-2 in Semi-Closed pos start on M's L and do 2

(Scis) Side, Close, Cross, —; (Scis thru) Side, Close, Thru, —; Turn Two-Step; Turn Two-Step (to Bfly);  
13-16 Repeat the action of Meas 5 thru 8 except end in Butterfly pos with M facing wall;  
(F to F) Side, Close, Side, —; (Bk to Bk) Side, Close, Side, —; (Circle) Away Two-Step; Together Two-Step (to Bfly);  
17 In Butterfly pos step swd LOD on L, close R to L, swd on L and turn face LOD in open pos, hold 1 ct;  
18 Blend to Back-to-Back pos and step swd LOD on R, close L to R, swd on R and remain in Back-to-Back pos;  
19 Release hand hold and starting on M's L circle away from partner in 1 two-step with M turning L-face and W R-face;

PLUS MEAS 1 THRU 8  
Ending: (SCP) Walk, —, 2, — (W twirl R-fc); Apart, —, Point, —;  
After completing Measures 1 thru 8, the last time with M walks fwd 2 slow steps LOD (L, —, R, —) with W twirls R-fc under joined M's L hand with W's R; Change hands and step apart and acknowledge as music ends.

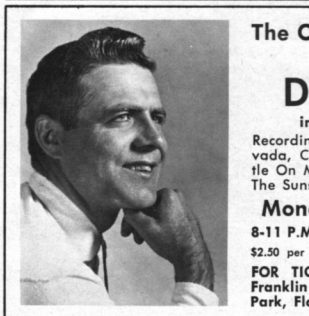
