Thanks for your thoughtful letter. We'll keep the magazine on file until the next time.—Sol Koved, Cranford, N. J. REGARDING the 4% sales tax on dues and admissions for square dances: to me it is absurd. Florida is the only state in the U. S. A. which imposes such a tax.

Masonic Freemasonry has been declared exempt from the tax and we as square dancers should be exempt also.

I propose a Jurisprudence Committee to study Rule 5, "Taxable Status of Club Dues Defined," and hopefully come up with the same results as the Masonic Lodge has accomplished.

The payment of money to a caller is taxable income to him; so is rent income taxable in a non-civic building. As a Senior Citizen I resent having to pay for social association, such as for square dancing.—R. F. Sharpe, Deerfield Beach.

Bow & Swing agrees that 4% sales tax on club memberships, paid at the rate of 50 cents per week becomes an intolerable administrative burden for the amount of income it will yield to the state. We believe that open dances at which admission

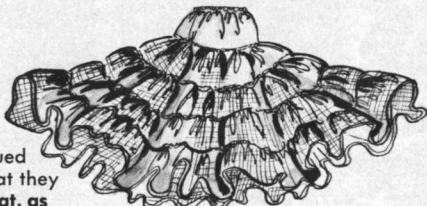

Square Dance Coordinator:

Cross Circulate

JACK LASRY, square dance coordinator, reports the experimental basics released for September leave much to be desired. "In my opinion, not one has any lasting value, or even any real fun value," he said, "only adding confusion to the already too long list of basics."



JACK LASRY

Cross Circulate, a variation of the basic Circulate, was chosen as most worthy.

From two parallel ocean waves the call will be, Ends Cross Circulate, or Centers Cross Circulate. If the ends (usually boys) cross circulate, they start out doing a regular circulate, but walk to the inside position of the ocean wave. The ends circulate and become the centers. If the centers cross circulate, they circulate as usual, but walk out to become the ends of the ocean wave.

This sounds easy, but usually takes a few minutes for the dancers to catch on. Lasry suggests working the ends for a while; then if the dancers like the call, work with the centers. He cautions all callers to try this out under workshop conditions before using it at club or open dances. Examples follow:

Cross Circulate

Heads square thru—4 hands, do-so-do to ocean wave—boys cross circulate, boys run, bend the line, box the gnat, barge thru, star thru, left allemande.

4 ladies chain, heads square thru 4 hands, do-sa-do to ocean wave, boys cross circulate, boys run, bend the line, box the gnat, cross trail to left allemande.

Heads square thru 4 hands, swing thru, girls cross circulate, girls trade, girls run, bend the line, cross trail to a left allemande.

Heads square thru 4 hands, do-sa-do to ocean wave, centers cross circulate, balance, centers

cross circulate, balance, ends cross circulate, girls run, 4 couples circulate, bend the line, right and left thru, pass thru, partner trade and ¼ more, grand right and left.

Position is open-facing for intro, butterfly to start dance. Footwork is opposite, directions for M except where noted.

INTRODUCTION

Wait; Wait; Apart-, Tch-; Tog (to Bfly), Tch-; In Open-Facing pos (M's hand & W's L joined) wait 2 meas; Step apart on L, hold 2 ct, touch R, hold 1 ct; Step together on L, hold 2 ct, touch R, hold 1 ct; Step together on R, hold 1 ct, touch L, hold 1 ct;

(Face to Face) Two-Step; (Back to Back) Two-Step; Turn Away Two-Step; Together Two-Step (to Bfly);

1 In Butterfly pos step swd LRD on L, close R to L, swd L, hold 1 ct while bringing the trailing hands thru and starting turn to back-to-back pos;

2 Turn to back-to-back pos and step swd LRD on R, close L, swd on R, hold 1 ct;

3-4 Starting on M's L circle away from partner in 2 two-steps (M L-fc, W R-fc) and come back to face partner in Butterfly pos with M facing wall;

(Hitch) Back, Close, Fwd (to Bfly-Banjo),; Wheel (1/2), 1, 3,-; (Hitch) Back, Close, Fwd,-; Lady Under, 2, 3,-;

5 In Butterfly pos retain hands step away from partner on L, close R to L, step fwd on L blending to Banjo-Butterfly pos (Have R hips adjacent and arms full extended, hold 1 ct);

6 In Banjo-Butterfly wheel forward (clockwise) a 1/2 turn in 3 steps R, L, R;

7 Step away from partner on L, close R to L, release M's L hand and W's R and step fwd twd partner on L and hold joined hands high, hold 1 ct;

8 Starting on M's R change sides in 3 steps with W moving under the joined hands to end in Open-Facing pos with M facing wall;

(Face to Face) Two-Step, (Back to Back) Two-Step; Turn Away Two-Step; Together Two-Step (to Bfly);

9-12 Repeat the action of Meas 1 thru 4;

(Hitch) Back, Close, Fwd (to Bfly-Banjo),; Wheel (1/1), 2, 3,-; (Hitch) Back, Close, Fwd,-; Lady Under, 2, 3 (to SCP),;
