BOW & SWING

Square Dancing is Fun

IT IS INDEED AN HONOR to write the first editorial in this the "new look" of Bow & Swing. Since we have included in this issue the Callers participation sheet for the State Convention, it might be well if we talked a few minutes about what we can do to improve this and all future Conventions. At a time when the National Convention seems to be dropping steadily in attendance it is indeed encouraging to note that our Conventions have usually increased, attendance-wise, each time they have returned to the host city. To continue this growth we must all share a portion of the work encountered.

The FCA President Speaks

As Callers we should encourage all our dancers to attend and participate but at the same time we should discourage dancers who have had only a few lessons from attending. sad experience at this stage may cause the loss of a dancer forever. A Caller should remember that the Convention program is set up to satisfy the dancing needs of those attending and not his own personal ego and when calling to use material that can be danced by most of the dancers on the floor, not just a few of his own "hot-shot" dancers in the front row. Callers should plan to attend the entire Convention if at all possible. We generally have many who attend only on Saturday and expect to be placed on the Saturday night program. Any Caller unable to fill his assigned spot should advise someone in sufficient time that an adequate replacement may be found. Dress appropriately, most dancers look to you as a professional whether you feel you are



or not.

Dancers-remember you are being observed by the non-dancing public before, during and after the dance and your conduct may well determine whether any of them would desire to make Square Dancing their Appropriate dress is also an important factor and we don't want to overlook proper dancing. By this I mean no unnecessary swinging, twirling and kicking and please remember for the Convention at least, let's make all lady chains end in a Courtesy Turn. It is a beautiful and comfortable maneuver and if you haven't tried it recently -try it-I'm sure you'll like it.

Many dancers in attendance will be at their first Convention and as such can expect unaccustomed circumstances such as larger crowds and accompanying noises, voices of strange Callers, etc. Sound in a large hall is not usually as good as the local hall however we have found the sound in the Curtis Hixon Hall to be exceptionally good.

Tampa Convention Shapes Up; Sales Tax Uniformity Sought

AN EFFORT to get to the bottom of the Florida sales tax law as it applies to square dancing will be made by the Florida Federation of Square Dancers, if a committee appointed by Chairman Al Martin is effective.

Enforcement of the tax is not uniform throughout the state, and interpretations vary according to such factors as guests, whether membership is paid quarterly in advance, whether instruction is included. Barney Weatherford heads the committee

7400 circulars are being distributed to promote the 1969 convention in Tampa, the Sheraton as head-quarters will set aside 150 rooms at \$15 double, advance registrations ribbons are ready. "We'd like to see a list of the callers for the Saturday night dance," commented Mori Sogolow.

L. H. Wiese, liaison from the Florida Callers Association, agreed that selection of callers for the Saturday night dance was a tough job. "It is important and the callers realize it."

Virgil Green observed that the wide spectrum of dancing ability at the state convention, requires "the best experienced callers we can get for Saturday night."

Mary McDonald, of the Orlando Recreation Department, promised that for the 1970 convention, daily janitorial service will eliminate the dust problem at Exhibition Hall, and Lu and Peg Winters were introduced as general chairmen.

Jack Lascola reported on the Southeastern Square and Round Dancers 4-bus excursion to Key West, talked of a similar package tour to Tampa at \$35 per couple.

The Sashay Thru

A CORRECTION to last month's "Square of the Month" is in order.

A "Sashay Thru" is done by 2 couples facing. Starting as a Do Sa Do, the two people passing by each other (backing up) in the middle of the line do a "nose to nose" sashay.

Square Action

A "Sashay Thru" followed by a Wheel & Deal is the equivalent of a right & left thru. Other equivalents of "Sashay Thru"—Sashay Thru—Men Run—Double Swing Thru—Men Run is equal to a Wheel Across or Counted Teachs.

"Part-Time Gentlemen." Not in Square Dancing!! Ah! but we do have them in square dancing! They show up, sometimes, only one or two, and then; other times, they appear to be the majority. You say

you haven't seen them. I'm sure you have. They are the men who refuse to Courtesy Turn, when the ladies chain.

Courtesy!! In Webster's Dictionary a courtesy is described as a "formal politeness." The opposite would be "Impolite, discourteous, rude;" any one of which could not be an attribute of a gentleman.

Why are these men impolite? I feel sure they were not taught this way in a square dance class. I

have heard some of them say, "It doesn't make any difference, the girl is in the right place." If this was a valid reason, then why don't they Pair Off instead of doing a Sauare Through, etc. I have heard them say "Some callers don't give us enough time to courtesy turn." If this is true, boys-don't take revenge on the ladies!! Tell the caller, he is being unfair to you as dancers. I have heard them say, "We went to so-and-so dance and they do it there." I don't think there is any reason good enough to warrant doing it, but the reason is not important! The important thing is to correct it.

The next time you go to a dance, make sure that after each tip is over, the lady can say, "I danced with a gentleman—he was polite and courtesy turned me." Or would you rather have them say

I know what I would want to hear! Courtesy Turn the Ladies!! Don't be a Part-Time Gentleman!!
