"YOUR BASIS GUIDE"

In a recent (April) issue of the South Pacific Square Dance Review this article caught my eye. Under the 10th National Convention news this suggested "List of Basics", as a guide for visiting Callers attending the Melbourne (Australia) Convention. Style Balance, Cast off, Centers in, Circulate, Dixie Chain, Eight Chain thru, run, Slide thru, Spin the Top, Substitute, Swing thru, Swing Star thru. Turn thru. Wheel and Deal. The following article was also found in the magazine and it expresses my thought about Cross Trail and how it should be taught and standardized. It was headed "Your Basis Guide" - (Ed.)

CROSS TRAIL: Have you ever noticed dancers reacting in various ways to the command to Cross-Trail Thru. We have all been brainwashed more or less - to cross-trail to a left allemande or a U Turn back. Actually, the command has been loosely used in the past. It should be made clear to the dancers exactly how the movement is executed and what results should technically be.

A sample call could be:
"Promenade, Head couples wheel

An Editorial:

Henry Purcell



First let me add my congratulations to the City of Tampa Recreation and Convention Departments for the wonderful people working in those departments. The outstanding facilities furnished the Square Dance Convention and the conscieniously helpful attitude of all the personnel involved in making the 16th Annual Square Dance Convention a TREM-ENDOUS SUCCESS.

I enjoyed the convention immensely, yet there was a few things that bothered me. I saw and met a lot of old friends but there were numerous old friends who were conspicuous by their absence. Friends, who have not missed a convention for the past five years. At this edition I am in the midst of writing inquiries to these people, asking WHY? (I hope all were and are in good health) Another worrisome happening at the convention was the lack of dancers at the HOT HASH hall and the WORK SHOPS. I have seen the attendance at these events steadily going down-hill for the past four years and after researching the problem came up with this conclusion. One, the "Hot Hash" sessions are not really "Hot Hash". Two, the Workshops are not really workshops. Three, the dancers are being given too much dancing and too many choices of participation. Recommendations: One, eliminate "Hot Hash" sessions and substitute "Challenge" sessions. Limit these sessions to those dancers of at least two years of experience, who have been exposed to the more difficult movements needed to dance this type of calling. Two, Workshop only those movements which are considered "Basics" and not the movements which are merely experimental. Three, eliminate all morning dance sessions and start the dancing at 1:00 P.M. and stop at 4:00 P.M.

Further Recommendations: One, establish a club level session for those dancers who do not wish to Workshop or dance in the "Challenge" session. This session would offer "something for everyone", where good plain basics are used to furnish "Fun for Everyone". Two, advertise the mode of dress at the daytime sessions as "informal". Three, here comes the 'bombshell' change the convention date from the third week-end in June to mid-April.

I would like to hear from you dancers and callers regarding this last recommendation. None of this editorial is meant to cast reflection, nor should any be inferred, upon the wonderful job done by all the people who worked so hard to make the convention a most successful event and above all no aspersions are meant to be cast on the dancers, without whom the convention would have been a dismal failure. However, in these changing times, established precedents must be overthrown for the good of all Square Dancing activities. Readers, Callers and Dancers please take a few minutes of your time and write me your recommendations for future conventions. All correspondence will be confidential unless permission to publish accompanies your letter. ED.

GATEWAY CALLERS ASS'N.

The Gateway Callers Association of Jacksonville elected Frank Clements to be their Chairman for the next six months. We want to thank Bobby Keefe for a job "well done" as past Chairman.

The Educational Committee, composed of Johnny Robbins, Scotty Thomas and Harold Pillmore presented their program of instructions for new callers. Their lesson plans would last six months with one lesson each week making a total of 26 lessons. Each caller will be responsible for teaching a certain phase to the beginner caller. The learning caller would agree to call only at meetings of the GCA and will not call at any organized dance. We kope to be able to put this program plan into effect by this fall.

The Northeast Florida Square Dancers Association has asked the Gateway Callers Association to program their Friday night dance for the Fall Roundup to be held November 7th and 8th. Marshall Flippo will be the caller for the dance on Saturday night.

There was a discussion of the Gold Ribbon report and the article written by Henry Purcell concerning this. A committee composed of Frank Clements, James Maxey and Harold Pillmore was appointed to evaluate the possibilities of using this plan in this area. They will make a report at the July meeting after discussing it among their dancers to get their opinions.

Swap Around

AUTHOR UNKNOWN

Swap around can be done from lines of 4, or 2 couples facing, i.e. heads Swap Around, the ladies will walk straight across and take the opposite mans place, but stay facing out, as the ladies are moving across the man will turn 1/2 to the right taking his original partners place, but facing out. At this time the active are now both facing out. The movement amounts to 2 ladies chain and a calif. twirl. However the movement can be called with 2 men and 2 women as partners, the right hand person walks across and the left hand person turns half to the right, again all people are facing out.





From the Mike

An Editorial gives the author an opportunity to "Sound Off" about a particular subject or problem. I would like to express a few thoughts on the "Guest Caller" at your club or the caller at your Association dances and festivals. These special dances add a bit of spice to your yearly club program. Gives you, the dancers, an opportunity to dress up and enjoy the festive atmosphere of a large crowd and enjoy the dance called by a caller who you do not dance to on a regular schedule. As a dancer you know this should be a real big fun dance with the opportunity to enjoy dancing with members of other clubs in the area and cementing together the feeling that we can enjoy the open dance level even if we are not members of a "Hot Rod" club, or even if you are.

Now, how does the caller feel when he is a guest caller in your area, After all when all is said and done, he is the one on the spot! But the caller has concern. Will the sound be good? Will the hall be air conditioned and the dancers comfortable?

The latter two play a big race in the success of the dance and the crowd response to the caller. Beyond the physical condition of the hall, what does the caller concern himself with? The guest caller is usually hired because he has "something to offer" you, the dancers.. No matter what, the caller wants to see the floor dance. He may "push" you to the limit of your experience but with the use of standard and often directional basics he works to reach an interesting level of dance that the newest dancer can enjoy and the "old timer" will have to "listen up" and be kept on his dancing toes. This is not always easy to do. However, in all cases you can be sure the caller is going to keep the floor moving. The reaction of the dancer on the floor has a great deal to do with the caller in turn really reacts to his floor. A whoop and holler crowd that is

having a good time usually brings out the best in a caller. A quiet crowd may be enjoying themselves just as much - but when a caller puts together a bit of cute material and there is no response. when the left allemander is called. he begins to wonder if they are enjoying the dance.

In doing quite a bit of traveling, I have learned to judge the reaction to my dance by how many are left for the last tip! This is usually a pretty good way because in some areas the styling of the dancers is such that they do not show any enthusiasm to the left allemander, while other areas whoop and holler. Another criteria is when you start the music - do the dancers fill out the squares quickly? Speaking about filling out squares, the June issue of Sets in Order has two letters to the Editor written from Florida and remarking about pre-made up squares - Fellow Callers - this is the fastest way to kill a club. To allow the squaring up to become prevalent. If the caller will take the initiative and break up the squares two or three times a night with a quick mixer, this problem will soon vanish.

Dancers and clubs alike are always talking about too many basics and the careless use of them. I feel one reason we seem to have less visiting between clubs of intermediate level is because people don't like to be embarrassed by a call they don't know how to do. I would like to suggest a solution to the problem: I suggest the Florida Callers Association select several callers who have the respect of the callers and dancers in their various areas and as new experimental material is tried out, these callers will report back to the callers Workshop Editor of Bow & Swing and each month one figure is featured. Now every caller in the state calling intermediate club and open dances should teach and call the figure at every dance. In a short time the newer calls will be danced by all groups and the level of dance will be growing closer and closer in all clubs around the state.

News A-Round Florida:

The beginner class of Ted and Lois Mack have reached a nice smooth intermediate level, so reports Mary Vollmer, reporter for the Holiday Steppers of Ft. Lauderdale. The class recently invited the Holiday Steppers to join them in a 'Pot-luck' dinner and dance. Ted and Lois started the evening with a R/D Mixer. During the evening Gladys and Carl Wioskill gave an exhibition of a German Folk Dance, "Dillenthaler Lander" which was well received. Ted's new class is now known as the Holiday Rounders and will dance at Holiday Park in Ft. Lauderdale every Tuesday night at 7:30 P.M. Visitors are always welcome.

President's Corner



In the past several months I have received several complaints from dancers about callers who are not actively calling for a club or teaching classes, who are using their FCA badge as a means to attend dances free. In the past it has been more or less the custom to let active callers in to any dance free of charge and quite often he was asked to call a tip. This was and is a courtesy extended by the host club and/or caller. I might add here that it has not been, is not now, and I hope never will be a request of the FCA to let all callers go to dances free of charge.

All members of the FCA receive for their dues the privilege of attending two clinics a year at no additional cost, plus a subscription to Bow & Swing as well as free registration at the State convention if they participate on the program. This seems to me ample return for dues paid.

I would agree that any caller actively teaching and/or calling regularly for a club or workshop should in most cases be admitted free because more than likely he is out with a group on a night when he might be content to stay home for a change. I would think that a benefit dance where several callers are on the program, everyone, caller and dancer alike should be expected to pay.

I would ask that any club officer who is or has been confronted with a situation described above, please feel free to let me or one of the other officers know so that we may take the matter up with the offender. All information will be held in the strictest confidence, and only the FCA officers and the offender will be involved.

EXAMPLES: By Johnny Walter Heads SWAP AROUND, partners trade, Sides SWAP AROUND, partners trade, Heads lead right circle 4 break to a line, SWAP AROUND and bend the line SWAP AROUND and partners trade. Do the right and left thru, cross-trail thru to the corner, L.A.

Sides square thru 4 hands, right and left thru, dive thru, SWAP AROUND Circle 4 break to a line, pass thru wheel and deal, substitute, SWAP AROUND L.A.

Heads SWAP AROUND, partners trade; Heads star thru, SWAP AROUND, Split 2 around 1 make a line of 4; Pass thru wheel and deal, dbl. pass thru; First two left, next two right, swing thru, do the right and left thru, SWAP AROUND and bend the line, star thru, dive thru, square thru 3/4, L.A.

Heads SWAP AROUND, separate around 1 into the middle, do the right and left thru, pass thru, square thru, 3/4, pass thru, centers in, cast off 3/4, slide thru, SWAP AROUND, L.A.

Sides square thru 3/4, separate around 1 into the middle, SWAP AROUND, circle 4 break to a line, SWAP AROUND and partners trade, star thru, dive thru, double pass thru, first two left, next two right pass thru wheel and deal, SWAP AROUND, L.A.

around, Cross Trail thru, go on to the next.

Cross Trail thru, go on to the next, Cross Trail thru, U turn back, Cross Trail thru, to the corner, left allemande".

If the call is given to pass thru, the dancers do not turn back. However, as soon as they hear Cross Trail Thru, they start to fudge and end up back to back with their partners instead of alongside of them, half

sashayed, facing out.

The "On to the next" part of the call should be executed as a bend the line motion to keep the centre people from getting ahead of the end who might be galloping wildly on the outside trying to keep up. The Cross Trail Thru should be taught and executed to be a pass thru and half-sashay to remain facing in the same direction the dancers had been moving in until the next command is given. Dancers should never Cross Trail before the pass thru. The confusion is overwhelming to say the least and the dancers' noses get bent a bit in the process.

Breaking down the above commands into dancer movement, it should be done as follows:

"Promenade, Heads wheel around (sides hesitate).

(sides hesitate). Pass thru, half-sashay (men slide

step right behind the ladies as they slide step left in front).

On to the next (bend the line.

centres step slightly back),

Pass thru, half-sashay, bend the line.

Pass thru, half-sashay, all about face.

Pass thru, lady go left, gent go right,

Find your corner, left allemande". The term, Cross Trail without the "thru" part should mean to Cross Trail with partner, ending up back to back or thereabouts. An example would be from a squared set, have everyone California Twirl, Cross Trail to a left allemande. There is no way to go "Thru" so you just Cross Trail.
