At Fort Lauderdale's Holiday Park Recreation Park, the Holiday Steppers will hold their annual Sweetheart Dance on Feb. 9 with Ted and Lois Mack.

Fort Myers' annual Edison Pageant of Light will have its annual square dance with Danny Robinson calling in Exhibition Hall on Feb. 12, and on Feb. 14 Danny will call the Valentine dance for the Whirl & Twirl Club in the San Juan Hotel in Orlando.

On Feb. 15 the Key West Squares with the help of other area clubs will entertain members of the Southeast Florida Square and Round Dancers Association during their official visit. Submariner and Southern-most badges will be earned by most of the visitors.

Peterson is calling for the Kiss-A-Me Squares Annual Rodeo Dance to be held in Tupperware Auditorium in Kissimmee on Feb. 21. The Bookmillers will handle rounds. Event ties in with the semi-annual Silver Spurs Rodeo which will include afternoon performances on Feb. 21, 22, and 23.

## Dear Bow & Swing

Editor, Bow & Swing:

YOUR EXPLANATION of Tea Cup Chain is wrong. It's courtesy turn unless Florida is different from the West Coast.

(A quotation from the Wentworth book refers in this manner to the situation in which the ladies are transferred from their first takedown: "The gentleman takes the lady by her right hand with his right hand, places his right behind her waist and courtesy turns her and places her in the center in a left hand star. The ladies then go 1/4 turns to the other side gent who takes lady by the right hand with his right hand and courtesy turns her and passes her on to the gent at his right which is the lady's partner." She also encloses clipping from 1968 *Sets in Order* which states: "In some areas the men may turn the ladies with either a courtesy turn or reverse courtesy turn instead of with forearm. The men do not alternate hands but use one hand twice and then the other hand twice.")

Now, really, have you tried to come out of a three quarter turn and have a man take my right arm with a forearm swing. Where do I end? Really! The forearm swing is not done "universally" by good dancers.

You've embarrassed me. I thought I could help to correct a bad habit in Florida, but I find no one cares.

THERE'S SOMETHING in what Sue Amacher says, but it's not the whole story. A club president gets up to welcome visitors, yet one notices how few members make any effort to dance with strangers. As some admit openly, they pay their money to dance, not to stand around, at least until they see the quality of the newcomer's dancing. And lots of visitors from away aren't up on some of the calls commonly used in intermediate and advanced clubs (Change the Web, Cross Circulate, Partner Trade and a Quarter More to name a few).

Why not urge clubs to compromise? Set aside a few tips for sets to be made up ahead of time, such as the workshop tip and final hash, but keep the majority free. There are special award badges for Square Angels; why not urge club members to "angel" newcomers for a couple of dances each evening without having to be publicly labeled?

"As to the Teacup Chain, best authorities agree it's a smoother dance with the forearm swing, but perhaps a prettier dance with the courtesy and reverse courtesy. As to making new dancers welcome, that's the business of any club; it will perish otherwise.

# Kopy Kat

KOPY KAT is the Round of the Month for February, according to Coordinator Tom McRorie of Gainesville. It's done to a Belco (B-228-A) and the dance was written by Art and Evelyn Johnson of Long Beach. Footwork is opposite, dance starts after three pickup notes in semi closed position:

### PART A

- 1-4 FWD TWO-STEP; FWD TWO-STEP; (Double Hitch) FWD, CLOSE, BK, —; BK, CLOSE, FWD, —;
- 1-2 In SCP facing LOD start M's L to 2 fwd two-steps L,R,L, —; R,L,R, —;
3. (Hitch) M step fwd L, close R to L, step bk L, —;
4. (Hitch) Step bk R, close L to R, step fwd R, —turning to face wall.
- 5-8 (Box) SIDE, CLOSE, FWD, —; SIDE, CLOSE, BK, —; TWIRL/VINE, 2,3, TCH; REVERSE TWIRL/VINE, 2,3,TCH (to Open);
5. Closed-Pos facing wall M steps side L, close R to L, step fwd L, —;
6. Step side R, close L to R, step bk R, —;
7. (Hitch) M step fwd L, close R to L, R in bk of L, side L, tch R to L;
8. Repeat Meas 7 in reverse (RLOD) end in Open-Pos facing LOD.

- 1-4 VINE APART, 2,3,TCH; VINE TOG, 2,3, TCH; SWAGGER WALK, —, 2, —, 3, —, 4, —;
1. M's L & W's R R Open-Pos facing LOD step side L, XRIB of L, step side L, tch R to L;
2. Step side R, XLIB of R, step side R, tch L to R;
3. Moving down LOD step fwd L, —, XRIB of L, —;
4. VLF of R, —; XRIB of L, —; (this is a "swagger" walk down LOD)
- 5-8 VINE APART, 2,3,TCH; VINE TOG, 2,3, TCH; SWAGGER WALK, —, 2, —, 3, —, 4, —;
- 5-8 Repeat Meas 1-4 of Part B.

### PART C

- 1-4 CIRCLE AWAY TWO-STEP; TOG TWO-STEP; (Seis) SIDE, CLOSE, CROSS, —; SIDE, CLOSE, CROSS, —;
  1. In Open-Pos facing LOD M turns LF (W turn RF) in a small circle away two-step L,R,L, —;
  2. Together two-step R,L,R, —;
  3. Face ptr & Wall lead hands joined step side L in LOD, close R to L, step L over R in RLOD (W XIF), —;
  4. Step side R, close L to R, step R over L (W XIF), —;
  - 5-8 TURN TWO-STEP; TURN TWO-STEP; TWIRL, —, 2, —; BOTH WALK, —, 2, —;
  - 5-6 In Closed-Pos facing wall do 2 turning two-steps L,R,L, —; R,L,R, —; (End in SCP facing LOD)
  7. M walks 2 slow steps at W twirls, —, 2, —;
  8. Both walk, —, 2, —;
  - 9-12 CIRCLE AWAY TWO-STEP; TOG TWO-STEP; (Seis) SIDE, CLOSE, CROSS, —; SIDE, CLOSE, CROSS, —;
  - 9-12 Repeat Meas 1-4 of Part C.
  - 13-16 TURN TWO-STEP; TURN TWO-STEP; TWIRL, —, 2, —; BOTH WALK, —, 2, —;
  - 13-16 Repeat Meas 5-8 of Part C.
- SEQUENCE: DO ENTIRE ROUTINE TWO AND TWO-THIRDS TIMES  
TAG: —On last measure of PART B (meas 8) M steps bk on L, point R twd ptr (W bk on R, point L twd ptr), with M's R & W's L hands joined.
