This Editorial is being written not to complain or gripe about a situation but rather to try to point out a problem that has plagued this magazine since it first began.

Everybody wishes the magazine well and hope we can succeed in up grading and improving the format, etc. Thanks for the kindly wishes, but how's about some help!!! In checking thru rather extensive files, I find less than one letter per month from Dancers and are mostly about personal pet gripes of the Writer. No Editorials, No Helpful suggestions (except minor ones). A lot of criticism (not constructive). Nothing that if printed, would or could help the overall picture of Square Dancing.

Letters have been written to Callers. Round Dance Instructors and other Leaders in Square Dancing, literally begging them to send in some kind or type of Editorial. The response has been awfully poor! The few editorials I have printed have been given by officers the Florida of Callers Association and the Round Dance Council. Why?? Because by telephoning and writing, I asked, no demanded, help from these people. In some cases, the people I have asked have expressed their eagerness to help BUT nothing was forthcoming. I have expressed a need for Dancer Editorials at various dances. I have attended. Lots of questions, but no results. WHY?? Frankly, I don't know.

Trying to formulate a magazine, well balanced, with material from all facets of Square Dancing cannot be done without help and information from all of the facets. The magazine can quite easily become lop-sided and appear to lean toward one area more than others, simply because of lack of cooperation from all areas. A couple of examples: I have received personal letters from Square Dancers who wondered why their area was never written about in Bow & Swing. Simple answer. News is rarely re-

ceived from many areas, "Can't print news, without news". Or, "We never see anything about Round Dance activities". Answer, same old story--"Can't print news without news". Classic Example: I personally and publicly made this statement in front of about 200 people at a recent gathering. Quote, "The Bow & Swing is your magazine as well as anybody's and if I receive enough material, I promise you at least a 50/50 magazine". End of Quote. Everybody seemed enthused at that time. HOW-EVER. I have received a magnificent number of exactly 3 letters since making the above statement in April of this year.

As Editor of Bow & Swing, I could probably sit back and take the majority of material from other Square Dance publications and grind out the same old magazine month after month. I feel sure you, as a reader and as a Square Dancer, don't want this as I am sure I wouldn't. So in picking up the challenge of trying to publish a magazine that the majority will enjoy, I find that I must throw this challenge to all people who read Bow & Swing. Either PUT UP or don't gripe about the future magazine- It's in your hands as well as mine, or the Florida Callers Association, SEND YOUR MATERIAL NOW.

Lines Walk In, Lines Walk Out...

Both By: Deuce Williams Dearborn, Michigan

LINES WALK IN

From lines of 4 facing, the center 4 do a 1/4 grand square (pair in & back away) while the ends pass thru and 1/4 in to form new lines of 4 facing in toward each other.

LINES WALK OUT

From lines of 4 facing, center 4 do like a grand square but turn to walk out (pair off & step ahead) while the ends pass thru & 1/4 out to form new lines of 4 facing out and back to back.

Examples: By Johnny Walter

Heads cross-trail thru, separate around 2 make line Lines walk in, right & left, slide thru L.A. Heads lead right make line Pass thru wheel and spread (Continued on page 26)

The FCA President Speaks:

President's Corner

Are Callers being paid sufficiently for their services? This is a question I'm sure we as callers have asked ourselves many times and find it difficult to come up with an answer that fits all situations.

Let's take the situation of a caller who calls regularly for a club on a weekly or bi-monthly basis. Assuming he is married it is probable that his wife goes with him most all the time. the club then actually gets the services of two people since the wife is expected to help out at many spots during the night. In addition, the caller is usually expected to furnish a PA system, records and mike. It has been estimated a caller will have approximately two hours somewhere along the line, practicing, researching. studying notes attending clinics, all at his expense. for each hour spent at a dance. This then would make approximately 9 hours of work involved for the caller alone for each dance called. Add this to the time spent by the wife at the dance, not to mention the many and phone calls handled errands during the week, and you come up with a total of 12 - 14 hours total

work involved for the caller-wife team. Let us assume a good PA system rents for a minimum of \$15.00 per night. (Remember the caller delivers, sets up and removes the system in addition to furnishing the records and mike). Add to this the travel expense at a minimum of 10¢ a mile and we begin to get a picture of the revenue needed to break even. that is to cover expenses and put something aside for future equipment replacement. Let us now take a look at a hypothetical case. Caller "A" travels regularly 30 miles one way to call for club "X" weekly, and is paid \$45.00 each dance, 60 miles at 10¢ per mile --- \$6.00, equipment rental --- \$15.00 totals \$21.00 leaving a fee for calling services of only \$24.00 for approximately 12 hours work for the caller-wife team.

Is this enough? Hardly the standard of a professional. To the dancers and club officers I say It's time we some serious thinking and consider paying the caller well and in return expect a dance in proportion to the amount he is paid. I do not mean a hot rod, old Buster type dance but one that all dancers can enjoy. Pay him well and let him know you expect him to have good equipment, be on time and use variety in his dance. Also ask him when he last attended a clinic to improve himself. no one has yet become so good he need not improve. If your treasury wont stand an increase in your callers pay, you might check your dues and guest fees. Are they the same as they were 5 - 10 years ago? If so something should be done now to correct the situation, Everything else has gone up in price, how can we expect to stay down and survive and grow? I ask each and every club officer to stop and think, analyze your situation and be fair to your club and your caller. Let's upgrade Square Dancing not hold it down. Why not pay your caller better and expect a better caller. Vern Johnson
