Round Dance Instructor of The Month



Carl and Joyce Bornmann

CARL AND JOYCE BORNMANN are both native Floridians and long-time residents of Daytona Beach he since birth and she since 1952. However, it is rumored that a move to the Melbourne area is contemplated later this year.

Carl and Joyce were first introduced to square dancing in 1962 when friends invited them to join a beginners' class, and they have been "hooked" since the first night. The following year they took basic round dance lessons from Naomi and Chuck Durant (square-dance caller boosting rounds in Daytona), and, as far as the Bornmanns are concerned, squares and rounds have gone together ever since.

Carl and Joyce first tried teaching in 1965 when they were asked to teach a beginners' class in nearby Sanford. So with borrowed equipment and knocking knees they jumped right in. 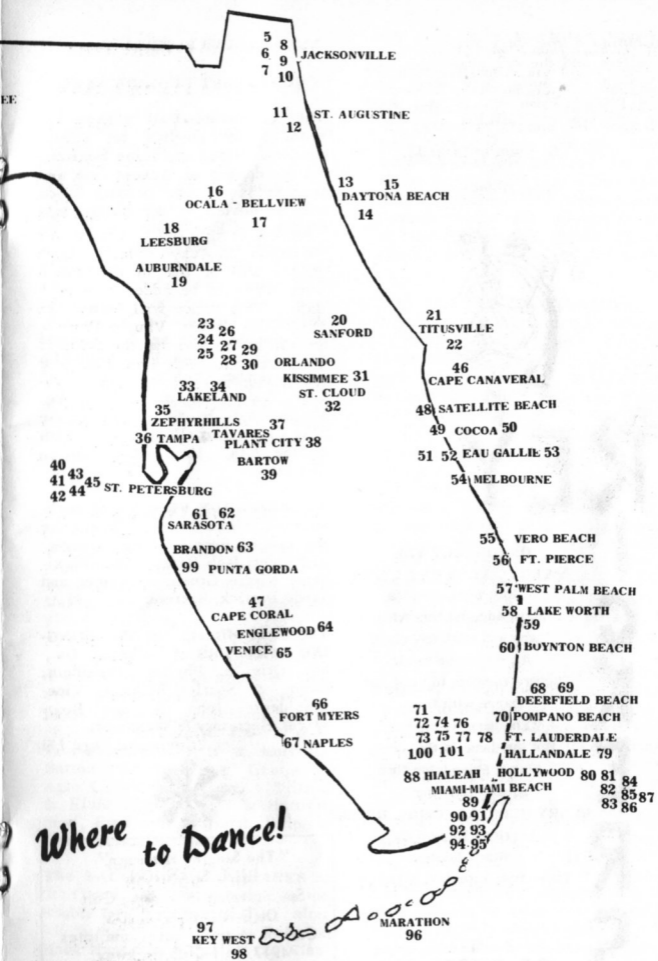

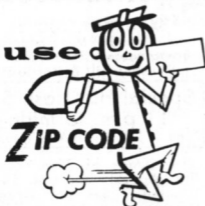

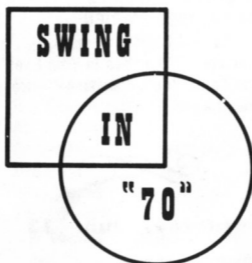
