

CALLER'S CORNER

One of the real nice basics that I would like to explore is Dixie Style To An Ocean Wave. A very smooth figure and a good tool for the caller as the zero possibilities and equivalents that are easily danced but with variety give the dancer and caller alike good smooth materila to work with.

Alot of the smoothness in dancing Dixie Stlye can be lost by the poor choice of a preceding call or poor position of the dancer in relation to getting into the figure. For example: Observe, or better yet DANCE the start of a Dixie Style while standing still in a static square, or from lines pass thru on to the next Dixie Style. Do get the feeling men, that you are caught up short? Now compare the difference to feel and flow when you first do a right and left thru then ladies lead Dixie Style. The courtesy turn allows the men to head the girl right into the call and the man is not caught up short as the girls go forward. Some other good basics to precede Dixie Style with are square thru 3/4 courtesy turn (a zero) Calif. twirl - ladies lead works well. Partner trade ladies lead is good. Dixie chain on to the next Dixie Style also works well. If you use single wheel with your group it is a natural for a set up..... Think SMOOTH when working our your figures and watch how much nicer the dancers move....

FROM ANY TWO COUPLES FACING POSITION, IN NORMAL COUPLES. THE FOLLOWING FIGURES USING DIXIE STYLE TO A OCEAN WAVE WILL RETURN YOU TO YOUR EXACT STARTING POSITION AND WILL ZERO OUT. Be sure to precede the Dixie Style with a good choice of basics to set a smooth flow.

LADIES LEAD DIXIE STYLE TO AN OCEAN WAVE

1. Left swing thru-girls run-bend the line

2. Girls trade-boys run-bend the line-box the gnat right and left thru.

3. Boys trade-left swing thru-girls trade-girls run bend the line-right & left thru.

FROM A DIXIE STYLE THE FOLLOWING ARE WAYS TO CHAIN TWO LADIES.

LADIES LEAD DIXIE STYLE TO A WAVE

1. Boys trade-left swing thru-girls trade-girls run bend the line.

2. Boys trade-boys run-bend the line-box the gn at right and left thru.

3. Boys trade-cast off 3/4 girls run.

The Dixie Style sets up left handed waves and the LEFT swing thru is a necessary tool. If your dancers are not very quick with the left, good directional calling can be helpful. Say, something like-- "with a left, left swing thru" the added direction takes nothing away from the dance but can be a little aid to help those who need it to keep dancing.....

The Dixie Style to a wave to set up two parallel waves from which to call all eight circulate is also a very handy circle tool as you will see. From two lines in sequence with partner in normal position the waves set up by calling a Dixie Style will be in sequence. Calling an all 8 circulate has kept us in sequence and our partner relationship has not changed from the original wave before the circulate. Add any of the basic principals we set up and you can see how easy you can build a good dance.





ODDS AnD eNDs

BY EMILY LEACH

SIMPLE EASY SQUARE DANCE PETTICOAT FROM 10 YARDS OF NYLON NET.

The following article was sent to us by K.O. & Phyllis Williams. K.O. is Fres. of the Round Dance Council of Fla. for this year. The article was clipped from a publication and originally submitted by Judy Ross Smith of Mass.

MATERIALS NEEDED: 10 yds. stiff Nylon Net 1 yd. matching sheath lining or other soft material.

STEP 1. Feld material to 5 yd. length leaving in one piece. Lay out on floor or large table, then fold this into four 18" widths, smoothing out wrinkles as you go along. Pin in several places to hold even & steady.

STEP 2. Trim off 1/2" on long edges to remove folds. Unpin.


STEP 3. Feld each strip in half, long way of goods. Stitch together $1/2^n$ from edge. Stitch all four strips individually. Use heavy duty thread and long basting stitches if hand gathering, or #50 if gathered by machine.




STEP 4. Each of the 4 strips should be gathered to a 32 yard length. Machine stitch three of the gathered strips onto the fourth piece, everlapping where they meet. This will give you your two bottom tiers. The folded edges should be toward the inside, and rough edges to the outside away from the body.

STEP 5. Top tier is done last and you should figure your length from here. Gather about 3 yds. of the lining or other material onte a waist band, then add tier #2 to the top layer, easing in as you go along. The net should be on top of the soft material so that rough edges will be away from the body.

STEF 6. Stitch up side seam of entire petticeat, allowing for side opening, starting at bettem and werking up. Add hook & eye, or other type of fastener at waistband. Fine finishing is not necessary. It should take no more than 3 hrs. or less to make.



Haven't tried this myself yet, but it certainly is an easy and inexpensive way to add coler & variety te your petticoat wardrobe. I know I will as soon as I have a few hours available.


