

JIM PEARSON

A whole new, wide, wonderful world opened to Jim Pearson (and his taw, Noriene) when he met the late Gus Walsh of Mass. Something new was just taking place in the Sqr. Dance picture on the Suncoast of Florida. could be recreation (along with what was termed "couple dancing") was just beginn-ing to be taught in a regular organized class (6 nites and this included the "couple danc-ing" too). This form of recreation (along with what was

Jim plunged in, the year 1958. In March of that year found Jim introduced into calling by his friend and teacher. With mike in hand his taw at his side (in June of this same year) Jim met with a group of friends at the new Masonic Hall at Maderia Beach to teach his first class (8 sqrs. plus). Jim contends, "They didn't learn a thing, but I sure learned how to teach in a hurry".

March 1959 found the Pearsons opening the Nations first Air Conditioned Square Dance Hall at Treasure Island, Fla. The program was workshops in "Wagon Wheel", "Ox-Bow Loop", Allamande Thar" and a couple dance every other Thur. nite & the format was three squares and two couple dances (this developed into a 5 yr. program). September of this year saw the Pearsons teaching classes for St. Petersburg Rec. Dept. and classes at St. Petersburg Jr. College. Two clubs,"Mr. Sun Sets" & Beaux & Belles" formed within this year (both clubs still dancing with Jim as their caller).

An even bigger year followed. Jim & Noriene opened the first "Ox-Bow" in downtown St. Petersburg and opened the first all Western Square & Round Dance Institute at Brevard,

These folks are all pro in this wonderful recreation or ours. Jim served in several of the chairs for the Fla. State Callers Assn; twice president of the (Westcoast) Suncoast Callers Assn. & Noriene served as program chairman and two years as Secretary for the Suncoast Callers Assn. The Pearsons did a bit of traveling too: 8 & 16 week Spring & Summer tours for nearly 9 years. Cont'd Pa. 8





#### CALLER'S CORNER

There are really lots and lots of very good choreography ideas in the picture today. If you are still calling "Swing thru- spin the top-with out a stop right & left thru" all night you are not being fair to the dancers. Much of the newer material can be easily danced by our club people if we approach the dance in an up to date way.....

#### BASIC CHOREOGRAPHY

- I thought this month I would present some easy equivalents to some of the newer polular basics
- 1. FLUTTER WHEEL: A flutter Wheel equals a right and left thru and two ladies chain.
- "'f you call a right and left thru then a Flutter Wheel you have chained two ladies.
- 1. Heads lead right circle to a line Right and left thru-Flutter Wheel (two ladies have chained)
  - Slide thru-swing thru-turn thru-Left Alle.
- 2. Heads lead right-circle to a line Flutter Wheel (right & left thru -two ladies chain) Slide thru-swing thru-box the gnat Square thru 36 Left Alle.
- 2. SCOOT BACK: A Scoot Back is the same as ends of the wave swing half, so a Scoot Back followed by the centers trade is the same as a swing thru....
  - Scoot back-Boys trade-Boys run Wheel & Deel-Left Alle. box 1-4 Zero from all waves.
  - 1. Heads square thru four-Do so do to a wave 2. Heads lead right-circle to a line Star thru-Do sa do to a wave Scoot back-Boys Trade-Boys Run Wheel & Deel-Square thru 3/4 Left Alle.
- 3. CIRCLE TO A TWO FACED LINE: The same end result as a swing thru centers run.

#### PEARL CHAIN BELT

MATERIALS NEEDED: #20 Crochet Cotton

Beeswax

Crewel Needle

2 pcs. Jewelry Chain - Waist Measurement

3 pcs. Gold Rings - about 1/4" diameter

1 pc. Gold Hook

1 pc. 7" Chain - Used as fastener

2 Pearl Drop Pendants - for end of 7" chain

2 pkgs. #5 Pearls

#### INSTRUCTIONS:

Lay the two ends of chain side by side and attach both loose ends to one ring at each end. On one end fasten hook to one ring. At the other end attach the 7s chain length, another ring and then the pearl pendants. Now you are ready to weave the pearls.

Wax six lengths of #20 crochet cotton with beeswax and thread a crewel needle. Starting at top, and at one end, skipping first link, thread on peeper land insert needle downward thru one line of chain, thread on three pearls and insert needle in link of chain directly below the upper link and thread on three more pearls. Now moving toward the top of chain insert needle thru the next link. Add one pearl and insert needle thru the center pearl. Add one more pearl and insert needle upward thru upper chain in next link. Then securely tie the thread to the end of thread to anchor pearls. Repeat the process, only this time before inserting needle downward, put on three pearls, insert needle in lower chain in link directly below the link used above. Add three more pearls, insert upward thru next link, add one pearl and insert needle in upper chain, then add three more pearls. Continue until all chain is used.

Tried hard to make a sketch of this, but my artistic ability just didn't come thru, but I think that the instructions are clearly defined by Mrs. Jerry Magley of Clearwater. Jerry copied this from a belt that I had purchased on a trip to Aruba, and hers turned out beautifully. Thanks loads Jerry for all the trouble you went to in defining the details of making this belt.


