

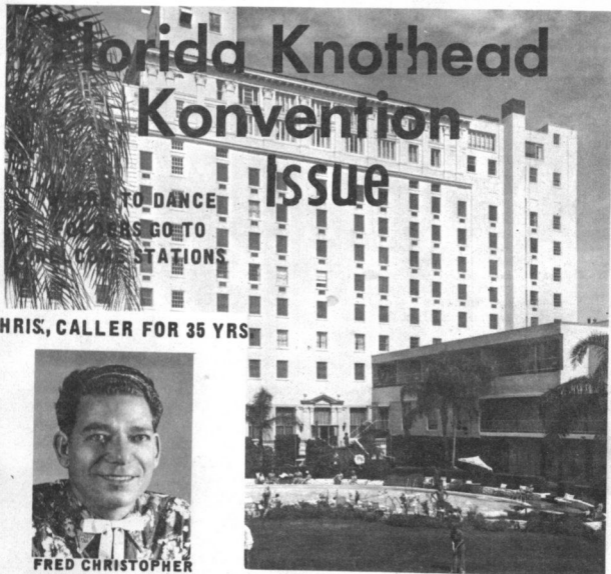

FRED CHRISTOPHER

Chris was only 18 years old when he first walked into the American Legion Hall in Maywood, Illinois in 1936 for his first square dance, needless to say his first impression was that you had to be out of your mind to get out on the floor, but like many others found himself going back, on his 3rd visit found himself too near a square that needed just one more man. No words could really describe what took place for the next 12 to 15 minutes, however, this was to start something new. Chris found that square dancing was a lot of fun!! What really caught his interest was how the caller knew what to call, so when the dance ended you were always back where you started. This intrigued him so much he found himself repeating the callers commands.

This being the kind of club where if the members knew the dance well enough to call it, they were given a chance at the mike, Chris got his chance, loved it so much he is still at it today.

Chris was a professional almost from the 1st time he picked up a mike, his first calling engagement was with W.L.S. National Barn Radio Program from Chicago. During this time he was a caller for several clubs in the area until called into the service in 1941 for a tour of duty with Uncle Sam.

When asked how many dancers he had taught, he estimated in the thousands.

In his early days of calling, he met the girl he married, we all know her as Butch, she took to the square dancing picture like a trooper, altho for the present she is recovering from major surgery.

They moved to Phoenix, Arizona and right into S/D, Chris called on top of South Mt. in schools and for clubs. Then they moved some friends in St. Petersburg, Fla and guess what? They made this their home.

In a sense you might say, Chris started Modern Western S/D to Fla.'s West Coast because within 2 wks. he was conducting beginner classes, workshops, and all the new calls.

In 1951 the 1st TV Station asked him to get a group of dancers together to perform. He also had his own radio program where he called singing calls, patter & hash. He was the

Chris is listed as one of the original National Traveling callers, recorded on 2 labels, 'Top' & 'Scope', has written for other recording companies 'MacGregor', 'Marlinda', 'Sets & Order' & 'Windsor'. He also wrote R/D, his most popular 'Hintustan'.

Chris's word to all callers, "KEEP 'EM SMILIN'", "KEEP 'EM DANCING'".

FEATURE FIGURE FOR THE MONTH

THE JACK LASRY CALLER'S CORNER BASIC CHOREOGRAPHY

This month there are several very good new ideas. They are easily taught, easily learned, dance nicely and have a place as good choreography tools. I suggest you give a close look to our selected experimental ideas this month.

Turn & Left Thru Author unknown

Don't let the name scare you off. The name is telling you just about what to do. Just like a right & left thru except instead of the right pull by courtesy turn you Turn Thru Then Courtesy Turn The Girl On Your Right. To start with the couples must be half sashay in order to courtesy turn the girl in the usual way. From facing couples a swing thru followed by a Turn & Left Thru is really a natural!

Heads rollaway half sashay - Turn & Left Thru---Zero
Heads swing thru-Turn & Left Thru---Is a two ladies chain

Dancing and getting acquainted with Turn & Left Thru

Heads rollaway-Turn & Left Thru-Square thru four-right & left thru-rollaway half sashay-Turn & Left Thru-slide thru left alle. box 1-4

Heads swing thru-Turn & Left Thru sides swing thru-Turn & Left Thru four ladies chain-left alle.

Heads lead right-circle to a line-rollaway half sashay-Turn & Left Thru-ladies led dixie style to a ocean wave-boys trade-boys run-bend the line-Turn & Left Thru cross trail-left alle.

Heads square thru four-swing thru Turn & Left Thru-right & left thru swing thru-Turn & Left Thru-dive thru-square thru 3/4-left alle. zero

Give Turn & Left Thru a good try I think you will find it quite acceptable with your dancers.

Flutter to a two face line - Jack Lasry

Flutter wheel is really a strong part of today's dance and looks like it may be around a long time. This little variation has proven to be very smooth and easily learned by the dancers no matter which way they flutter, boys falling in behind the girls or picking them up on the way around.

Start a Flutter Wheel Move-girls taking fore arms, boys move into position girls turn 3/4 and STOP boys follow and end besides the girl forming the ends of the two face line.

Note: From the two face line ending a bend the line will give you the exact flutter wheel ending.... You can easily teach the movement---tell the dancers a little about the figure then say "Start your flutter wheel motion-Girls turn 3/4 Stop-you have a two face line. This really dances nice.

Dancing and getting acquainted with Flutter To A Two Face Line

Heads Flutter To A Two Face Line-wheel & deal-star thru---zero
Heads Flutter To A Two Face Line-wheel & deal-pass thru-(square thru) left alle.

1P-2P right & left thru-Flutter To A Two Face Line-couples circulate-bend the line-right & left thru-Flutter To A Two Face Line-couples circulate-bend the line-bage thru-star thru crosstrail left alle.

Box 1-4 Swing thru-boys run-bend the line right & left thru-Flutter To A Two Face Line bend the line-slide thru-left alle. box 1-4 zero

Box 1-4 Slide thru-pass thru-arc twirl-Flutter To A Two Face Line-wheel & deal-dive thru square thru 3/4-left alle. zero

Box 1-4 Slide thru-pass thru-partner trade Flutter To A Two Face Line-tag the line right-wheel & deal-turn & left thru-left alle. box 1-4 zero

We use a two face line a lot in today's dance so give Flutter To Two Face Line a good try and see how the dancers like it
