20th Anniversary of the Florida Callers Association: On Sunday March 23, 1952 a small group of Florida Square Dance Callers and Folk Dance Leaders, met in St. Petersburg to form an association. This meeting was arranged by Don Armstrong and was held at the Jaycees Beach Club, with Don Armstrong as Chairman of the meeting.

Temporary officers, and proposals were made for the By-laws and Constitution, Don Armstrong was chosen as the President during the formation period, R.R. Orcutt Treas., Corb Echols Jr. and Bill Embury on the planning commission.

On Sunday May 18, 1952 about thirty callers, leaders and wives met at the River Bend Trailer Village, New Port Richey, and formerly organized the Florida Square & Folk Dance Callers and Teachers Association tentative Constitution and By-Laws was read and discussed, various suggestions and revisions were made and the final decisions were to be adopted at the Fall meeting.

The Fall meeting in Orlando Nov. 9, 1952 was held with callers from as far away as Miami and Jacksonville, where the Constitut on was formerly adopted and a permanent organization set up, with Harold Emery elected as the first offical President, Don Armstrong presented an invitation from the Tampa Recreation Dept. to hold the first State Convention in Tampa, in the spring of 1953, with Don Armstrong named as Chairam of the first convention.

From this early beginning has blossomed the the present Florida Callers Association who now number about 150 members from all parts of the state, and own and operate the Bow & Swing, the offical Square and Round Dance Magazine in Florida.

Charter members at the first State Convention was 54. Following is the past presidents:

BY EMILY LEACH HELPFUL HINTS

Do you have a problem getting the shells off hard boiled eggs neatly? Try this method, it works beautifully for me: As soon as the eggs are hard-boiled, pour off the hot water and shake them in the pan hard enough to crack all the shells, then add cold water and the shells will peel off cleanly without injuring the whites. Also when taking devilled eggs to a pot luck and not wanting to take your egg dish, try cutting off a small slice off the bottom part of the egg and you will have a flat surface that will set on any flat dish. Or: halve them in the center and after filling them, put them back into the foam egg carton that they came in. This eliminates the bother of remembering to take home the extra dish.

When peeling oranges of grapefruit, try this: Four boiling water over them. Let stand for 5 min., and the white lining will automatically come off the skin.

When serving grapefruit, I use a scissors to cut around the seed portion then snip off the bottom core and the center comes out nice & clean.

To prevent unpleasant odors after frying seafoods, etc., sprinkle cinnamon into a small saucepan of water and boil for about three minutes.

Try this when baking ham: For a moist, delicious ham wrap in foil, pour on a bottle or can of cola into the pan. A half hour before ham is done, remove foil and let drippings mix with the cola and baste ham with the mixture for final touch. You will have a delicious brown gravy plus a nice moist ham.

To prevent your meat loaf from sticking to the bottom of pan, put two slices of becom in bottom of pan and set meet loaf on top of becom. The becom will add flavor and the meet won't stick.

To ice a cake neatly, cover the edges of the place with triangles of wax paper place cake on dish and apply icing. Then gently draw the papers away and you have a nice clean plete with no dripping or smudges.

After using your oven if you place a pan of cold water into the oven it will absorb the heat and keep your kitchen cooler.

Want to keep your cakes from drying out? Fasten the heels of a loaf of bread to the cut sides of the cake with toothpicks. The bread goes stale but the cake slices stay moist and fresh.

Whipping cream: You can whip cream a few hours ahead of time if you use corn syrup instead of suzer for sweetening. The cream will stand in peaks for hours.

Or:
By adding a scoop of ice cream before whipping it will keep the cream chilled as you whip and also add extra flavor.

If oream should turn sour while whipping just add I teaspoon of milk of magnesia to one pint of cream. The whipped oream will taste sweet and there will be no taste of the milk of magnesia.

EXPERIMENTAL WORKSHOP

Spin Chain The Gears: This idea could have been best called spin chain the star but unforturally we had a call by that name about two years ago. SPIN CHAIN THE GEARS is another one of the "long" figures like relay the deucy etc. but again Dances Real Well and was extremely well received by the dancers.

Teaching Spin Chain The Gears: Set up box 1-4 Ocean Wave

Turn by the right $\frac{1}{2}$ - Boys turn left $\frac{3}{4}$ - (form the wave) Center boys trade - girls make a right about face, and form two left hand stars. (this is teaching position one) Turn each star $\frac{3}{4}$, this will bring the girls into the ocean wave thu the middle and the boys on the "wings" (this is teaching position two) Center girl trade and then turn the end girl $\frac{3}{4}$ (ala spin chain thru) Boys make a left about face ending back in two parallel waves. In teaching the figure establish the hesitation points shown as teaching position $\frac{1}{4}$, 2 etc. Have the dancers walk the figure thru hesitating at the positions about three times then go all the way tru, it really dances smooth....

The figure transposes the square into an equivalent box 1-4-set up but in doing so you must be careful not to use it under call conditions as a zero equivalent. Without getting technical from normal Box set ups you can use it as a zero but from X box it will have to be called twice thru to be ab exact zero.

USE AS A ZERO EQUIVALENT FROM THE FOLLOWING BOX SET UPS

Heads square thru four

2. Heads 1/2 square thru

3. Promonade - heads wheel around - star thru

4. Promonade - heads wheel around - barge thru
From the above set ups you can use Spin Chain the Gears freely and use normal get outs.

You may recall relay the top worked exactly the same way, if you have some relay the top material just insert Spin Chain The Gears and you are all set.

Dancing Spin Chain The Gears

Box 1-4 Spin Chain The Gears Swing thru-boys run-wheel & deal-left alle.

Box 1-4 Do sa doe to a wave Eight circulate-Spin Chain The Gears Swing thru-boys trade -boys run Bend the line-square thru-right to partner Pull by-left alle. Promonade - heads wheel around - star thru Do Sa doe to a wave - Spin Chain The Gears Square thru 3/4 - left alle.

If you have a workshop group give this one a try, you will see after working with it for a few minutes that thepart where the two left hand stars turn 3/4 and the girls move into the ocean wave followed by the center girls trading really works smooth. I did not give any examples of the figure with boys and girls in opposite positions but if you want to experiment, the end results are the same as relay the too movement.
