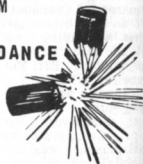

The Square Dance Rounds are also taught.

Don also conducts one Club Level Square Dance Workshop and teaches one or two beginners classes each year.

Thanks to the encouragement of Pat & Bill Bliss they became members of the Round Dance Council of Florida, and Don was privileged to cue the Square Dance Rounds at two State Conventions.

They have attended several National Conventions and most of the State conventions since learning to dance.

Don has been employed by Sears Roebuck & Co. in Ft. Lauderdale for the past 12 years.

Their first love is to teach and work with beginners in both Square and Round Dancing & hope to continue for many years to come.

We hope there will always be a place in square dancing for everyone who has the desire, Beginners, Fun Level, Intermediate and High Level. It seems that no one has more fun than the new dancers in class, and of course after graduation move on to more Fun, Int., or High Level, and here again the Fun and Int. are the big group, but we still must have the High Level for those who want more challenge.

It used to be the mere mention of High Level at a square dance always installed in us an uneasy feeling of awe, we remember staring at those talented personalities with reverence leaving a vague sensation of inadequacy, making us prone to error, trying to be perfect. Long ago, our impression of High Level square dancers was a friendly, smiling person seemingly versed in nearly every phase of square dancing and being human apt to blunder, the enjoying every minute, they always appear alert discreetly assisting the confused, grinning at mistake (their & his), ever mindful what they, too, had to learn to crawl before they could walk, they were most always present at the class graduations, as angels, whose presence the caller appreciated. After many years of learning the finer points of Western Square Dancing, we have become disenchanted with our first impression: the self-styled High Level dancers now seem to be in direct contrast to our naive impression because some of them:

However, in retrospect, when a couple dances about once a week, and never attends workshops, most always breaking the square down with out even realizing the problem, appears in the set, we can't but help to feel and show our dismay: Good grief: are we becoming High Level Dancers??? Oh, Lord deliver us!

Bill and his wife Elva had their first contact with square dancing when they were invited to a One-Night StancDance at the Firehouse in Levittown, Penna. This seemed like the answer for something they had been searching for a mutual hobby activity. One of the couples there invited them to join a class already in progress. At that time, classes only ran ten lessons and the most challenging figure was the square thru four hands. We attended the final three lessons and with the help of our sponsoring couple and the other wonderful people who put up with us, we were quickly brought up to the rest of the class and graduated with them. All during the summer we danced at as many clubs as possible, often not as a couple but split up until we gained confidence. Our first big thrill came when we were invited to join the Hicks & Chicks after being approved by the square dance membership board.

Because of his musical background, square dance friends encouraged Bill to begin calling. A local caller, Charles Kides, worked with Bill. Let him call guest tips at the club dances and then critiqued his calling. Charlie was regilously fair and never complemented his calling unless it was deserved. Bill called as many "party dances" as possible to gain additional practice. For two more years, he monitored square dance classes in order to become familiar with the teaching techniques of the area callers. He started his first club, Starlight Promenaders, in 1962 and shortly thereafter moved to North Palm Beach, Fla. FRUITEES

1/4 lb. Butter	1/2 tsp. Baking Powder	1 tbsp. Milk
2/3 Cup Sugar	Pinch of Salt	1 tsp. Vanilla
4 Egg Yolks	1 tbsp. Lemon Juice	4 Egg Whites
1/2 cup Flour	Grated rind of 1/2 Lemon	1/4 cup chopped Walnuts
2-1/2 cups of chopped dates, raisins and unsweetened chocolate chips.		

Butter a 4-1/2" x 8-1/2" loaf pan. Sprinkle thoroly with sugar on sides and bottom. Then shake out excess.

Use 2 tbsp. of the measured flour and mix with the fruit and chocolate chip & nut mixture, shake well. Set aside. Sift remaining flour with baking powder and salt.

Cream butter, add sugar & egg yolks and stir until light & fluffy. Add the grated lemon rind, lemon juice, milk & vanilla. Stir in your fruit and nut mixture, add flour mixture and blend well.

Beat egg whites until stiff, but not dry. Mix in 1/3 of the egg whites with the batter and stir, fold in the balance and mix.

Four into prepared loaf pan and bake in a pre-heated oven at 325° for 35 to 40 minutes or until tester comes out clean. Cool on cake rack. Remove cake and cut into small squares. These are truly delicious and a rare treat.

THE CALLER'S CORNER

EXPERIMENTAL WORKSHOP

CENTERS LEFT OR RIGHT AND CAST AWAY - Author Unknown

Kind of a nice idea that extends the centers in or out movement. The trailing dancers in the completed doublepass thru react to Centers Left by moving to the left and up beside the dancer directly in front of them. Centers Right you move to the right of the lead person. You end up in a line facing out. The Cast Away portion of the figure is a cast off type flow 1/2 way ending in lines facing in. The casting flow is started by the trailing dancer with his forward move but the lead dancer act as the hinge as the trailing dancer moves forward around the lead dancer in a wheel around type move. If the call is Centers Left Cast Away the casting motion is to the right 1/2 way. Centers Right Cast Away the cast or wheel around flow is to the left. Always The Trailing Dancer Moves Around The Lead Dancer and as you hook on the flow is forward.

We also experimented with Centers Left and cast away 3/4 bringing you in a two face line very smoothly. The entire idea was well received but it may take a bit of work to get the dancers to accept a casting motion that is Not from the centers moving ahead, but is more like a wheeling motion.....
