At this time I would like to thank Len Levitt for handling all the necessary arrangements. Thanks, Len!

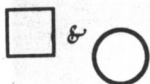

MESSAGE FROM CHET

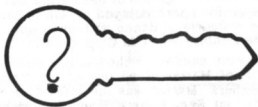

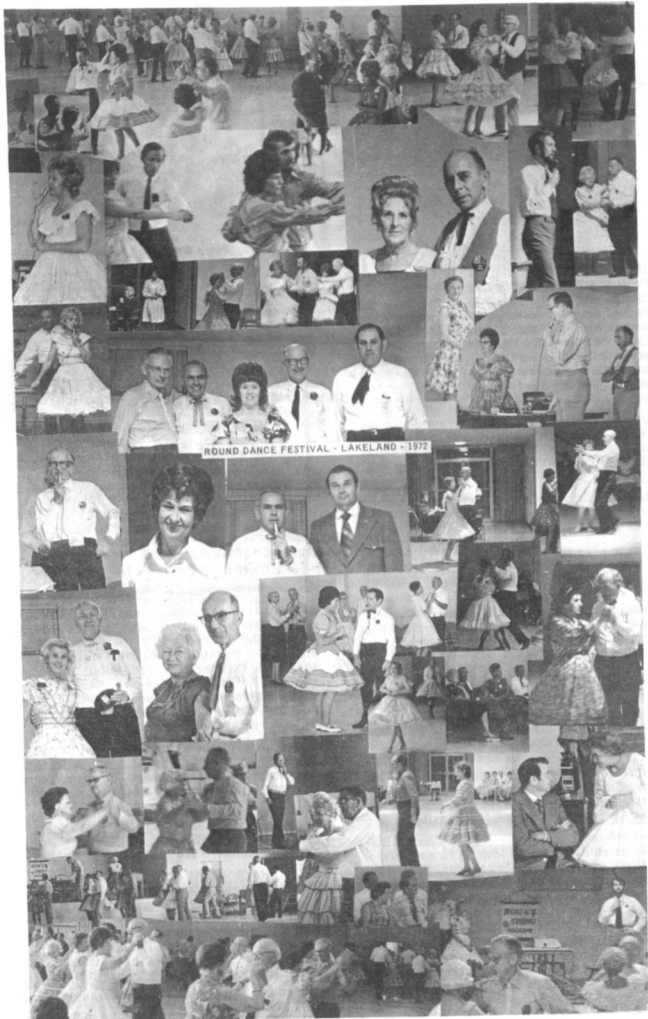
Two Open House parties were held on Mar. 13 & 20 to acquaint new people with the wonderful world of square dancing, and to register them for new classes.

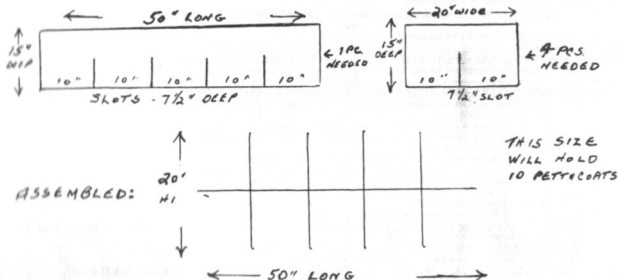

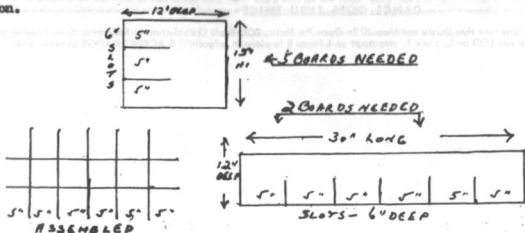

PETTICOAT STORAGE

Petticoats become quite a problem in your closet and especially when you have quite a number of them. This is the way we solved the problem at our house and it does save room and aggravation. It is on the basis of the corrugated fillers used in packing bottles in cartons. This was done with 1/4" plywood about 15" deep, this may extend about a few inches past your shelf which are usually 12" wide but is better for your needs. The pieces should be slotted or saw cut so that they interlock when assembled.



In the diagrams I did not take the end pieces into consideration. One end can be fitted against a wall and you can add another board to finish off the end. The same applies to the bottom, as this can be set upon the shelf and only a top board added for extra storage above if space permits. The diagrams below show the same application we used to make for shoe storage. This keeps them off the floor and the shoes are visible and can be chosen at a moment's notice. The box size for women's are 4" x 5" and for men they will need to be 6" x 6". Either of the diagrams shown can be made to the size you need which will depend upon the number of slips you need to store and the number of shoes spaces that you may need. They can be painted to match your closet decor after they are assembled. I've tried hard to be as explicit as possible and hope that I have explained it clearly enough. But it truly is the best closet organizer for a square dancer that I have run across. Our closet space was so very limited that we had to do something about the petticoats and this was our solution.

THE CALLER'S CORNER

REVERSE THE FLUTTER Don Williamson - This figure has been called for a while by some challenge callers but it really fits into all levels of dancing. From normal facing couples the boys start a left turn thru, pick up the opposite girl and bring her back across the set ending facing in and "having chained two ladies". THE DANCERS have changed the method of dancing flutter wheels as I'm sure you have noticed, by picking up the opposite and bringing them back around rather than the original star concept. Results are the same but with less stepping on heels etc.....**REVERSE THE FLUTTER** works very well and really is smoother than flutter as the men move first and pick up the girls. Try to start the Reverse the Flutter with the men having the left hand free, after a Calif. twirl or bend the line. After right & left thru it is rough as the mans left hand is being used.

A Flutter Wheel followed by A Reverse Flutter works well and equals a right & left thru. A nice zero is: Right & left thru-Flutter wheel-Reverse the flutter.....

EXAMPLES

1. 1P-2P Reverse the Flutter - slide thru-
Swing thru - turn thru - left alle.

2. 1P-2P Reverse the Flutter-
Ladies lead - dixie style to a wave
Slip the clutch - left alle.

You may find it helpful to add **BOYS LEAD** reverse the flutter. Try the girls lead also!!!!
