FEATURE EXPERIMENTAL FIGURE - PEEL THE TOP - Mel Roberts

For the basic teach set up a box 1-4 (heads square thru 4). Swing thru and the girls fold. From this set up often called a "Z" the call Peel The Top follows the action takes place - The leader is the boy so boys do a basic peel off and move up 1/4 in his own box. The trailers are the girls, and they step forward and meet with left forearms for a left 3/4 turn. Ends in two waves end to end. You can see the top and peel combination with the leaders peeling and moving up 1/4 - the centers or trailers turning 3/4 Easy to que as you teach - Boys Peel - Girls Turn 3/4 etc. Of course you can set up the "Z" with the girls peeling and the boys cast 3/4. We felt the dancer acceptance to this idea was good and added to the family of moves used easily from the box "Z". More on this later

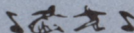
