

ROUNDOLEERS Jacksonville- Upon returning from asquare dance where rounds were weredone between tips, the thought occurred to me that round dancers think we are really put on trial, so to speak, each time we get on the floor to do a round. Who does the judging? Why, the square dancers who don't do the rounds, of course. Unfair you say! How can they know the time, exasperation and sometime frustration that we put in that "cute!" dance?? Well, fair or not, if we intend to Round dance outside of our club we are the subject to any praise or criticism hopped on us by our square dancer contemporaries, Lets go one step further, how do we react, knowing that we are watched. Well round dancers being people, and hopefully normal ones at that, will react in a couple of predictable ways. Those couples that really know the dance will leap to the chance getting on with the evolution.

Moving down the scale just a little, we may find the couple where one partner knows, ilikes and wants to dance, but the pther partner for some reason the other partner is not to enthrilled with the idea of letting non-dancers see the problem at hand. Now believe it or not, this is the time the Jury really enjoys. First this is a prospect of a Discussion along the sidelines, and if they decide to dance there is always the prospect of a push-pull contest on the floor and some great facial expressions as the dance goes on.

Still further down our scale are those round dancers who know the particular but think the whole crowd is watching just them with cue sheet in hand, ready to boo and hiss on their first miscue. End results, they set out all the rounds.

Well, what am I driving up to? First, challange rounds have no place at a square dance Certainly non-dancers enjoy watching a well executed dance, but not all evening by a select gropp Rounds geared to the majority of dancers should be programmed. Conversely, dances known by the dancers should be danced. If the right dances are selected all round dancers should be on the floor.

Reconize the fact that we all make mistakes, instructors included, and enjoy, enjoy. Our enthusiasm will rub off on the Jury who in turn will want to part of the activity.

The answer is Ken Anderson - the question - who will call the Roundoleers Anniversary Dance? Happy dancing, y'all. Len Kaufman





He tours frequently throughout Pacific Northwest and he has served as featured caller at many Festivals, Council dances, etc. including the Oregon State Festival, the Alaska State Festival, The Seattle Sea Fair Jublilee, the Spokane Salmon Festival, the Nelson, B.C. Square Dance Jamboree, the Fresno Square-Rama and the Cup-O-Gold Festival in Sonora, California,

Bill became a staff recording artist for Longhorn Records in 1963. For his first release, Two-Timin' Blues, he not only wrote the dance, but the tune as well. This may have been the first time an original melody was specifically composed for use as a square dance singing call. Since then he has recorded numerous other singing calls including his current release: Fireball Mail.

In addition, Bill is a well known square dance leader and teacher and he is considbd by many to be a recognized expert in the field of caller training. He has served frequently as an instructor/teacher at caller's institutes, seminars and workshops. He has recently completed writing one of the most comprehensive and complete caller training text books in the field entitled "The Other Side of the Mike".



One serious compliant from passerbys on the walks and from vehicles on the streets of Ft. Harrison, about bottles being thrown from the roof or top floors of the hotel. This did result in the police force being activated.

More seriously, the compliant seemed to be lodged against the teen-age group - mainly because they were having their own teen-age stemp on the 10th floor on the Hotel. but callers were there were constantly on the alert about keeping the younger square dancer on the floor.

We don't think our teen ager would be so destructive and so blase about the serious implications of bodily harm to the unsuspecting public, but it was this action on the part of some unthinking person that could result in losing much needed dancing place for the teen-ager, their Own hall. We think the teen-age stomp was good for their morale and would like to show our faith in the youngester and continue reserving a hall for their S/D pleasure.

An interest note on:

The Arormy was the scene of the Florida Fall Ball in 1956. This ball was the kick off for the 1st of the Florida Knothead Konventions and at that time an Air Conditioned hall was an unheard of luxury, and we danced as we did now - with enthusiasm and perspiration. Not many present Florida callers were in the picture at that time.
