





THE CO-ORDINATING COMMITTEE (Birthday October 22, 1972) Editor's Note: As a result of discussions at the last Florida Federation Meeting from time to time articles will be appearing in this and other publications giving information about the various Federations, Associations, Councils etc. In an effort to give the widest coverage you may see the same article in more than one publication.

Think about this for a minute, after twenty years of the Florida Callers programming the State Convention this year a Big change and no hassle. This didn't just happen, a group of Callers, Round Dance Leaders and Square Dancers (The Co-ordinating Committee) did a lot of work on their free time and at their own expenses to bring this about. The results of this was a package approved 5 tp 1 by the callers and wholeheartedly by the dancers. The first part was the area dancers during the Caller's Clinic and the second will be the National and State Caller at the State Convention.

The name of the game was communication and above all a free-wheeling give and take with the members recognizing the needs and desires of each group. No problem that a bit of compromising could not overcome.

The committee is set up to be a continuing body with one member from the callers and dancers of each area and the round dancers as they desire. It is autonomous with no by-laws or officers and as such is free to operate as it needs with two scheduled meetings a year. One caller and one dancer will be replaced each year.

Thuse working so hard the first year were Colin Walton, Cliff Hendricks, Vern Johnson, and John Robbins as callers. The dancers Len Levitt, Jack Tucker, Jim Whiteman and Tom Caviness. Round dancers Bill Fleshman, Chuck Heiss, Marty Martins and Carl Bornmann were involved at varioustimes.

Using old 78 rpm records of Les Gocher and others he started learning to call at about the age of nine. His first 45 rpm was Beverly Hillbillies. One record led to another and many hours of practice in his room with the door closed.

Wayne took dancing lessons from Scotty Thomas at age eleven and talked to him about calling. He cut tapes for Scotty to listen to and criticize. His first patter record was Whiffletree, a gift from Bob Rust. His first singing call was Things and both records wore out from constant use.

R.J. Hogan gave Wayne his first chance to call live before a

club. Later he called for Scotty on a once-a-night basis at a local club dance. At (Tex) Brownlee and Manny Amor offered encouragement and advice.

Money saved from mowing lawns and odd jobs was used to purchased a second hand set

of equipment. The practicing increased and the timing improved.

Wayne had the only Spare set of equipment readily available at the hptel after party in Orlando during the 1970 state convention. He Filled In with a call or two and impressed Frank Bedell, Johnny Walter and Henry Purcell enough that he was sponsored to the Callers Association for Junior Membership. For over a year he was the states youngest association affiliated caller. He has attended caller clinics at Miami and Cocoa.

Calling at conventions, after parties and one nighters earned him calling dates for club dances. He has taken his theme song, Up A Lazy River and a new Hilton sound system to calling dates in many cities all over Florida. In Gainesville he had a teenage club for a time but the press of schobl work and activities wiped it out.

For Wayne, calling and dancing have been a wholesome and enjoyable way of working off some of that excess energy, for going places and meeting so many nice people. He hopes to have time for calling and dancing while in college.



SUSAN ELAINE ADAMS has been calling and teaching for almost four years. She had graduated nine classes plus teaching the fundamentals of square dancing to over 300 5th thru 8th graders. At one time she had two clubs, the Phanthoms, a teen group and the Walt Disney World Square Dance Club. The teens danced at many of the clubs throughout the state, appeared in several parades and received a trophy for the best preforming group in one of the parades. 


