





MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIRMAN OF THE FLORIDA FEDERATION OF DANCERS



We have received a letter from Bob Osgood, Executive Secretary of Callerlab, addressed to the presidents of all callers' and square dancers' associations to help answer many questions relative to Callerlab, its functions and purpose. Osgood requested that the information be distributed so that the dancers will become more aware of the aims of Callerlab. Enclosed with the letter is a new information booklet "What is Callerlab"? which gives the short but inspiring history of Callerlab. In 1971, the 25 members of the Square Dance Hall of Fame gathered to discuss the direction of square dancing in the future. From their meeting emerged a new organization whose desire is to share with the new callers some of the philosophies, techniques and abilities of the vetern callers. Most noteworthy of its accomplishments have been the

BUNNY & JIM WHITEMAN establishment of a Quarterly Movements Clearinghouse, Mainstream Basics and Accrediation. One of the requirements for membership in Callerlab, the International Association of Square Dance Callers, is the personal endorsement of the following Code of Ethics: Code: The proffessional caller must wholeheartedly subscribe to the established standards of relationships to accomplish the declared purpose and objective for callers in the square dance profession. I acknowledge: 1. That I have an obligation to the dance ers; therefore I shall provide information, instruction and leadership to enable and encourage the dancers to develope to his full potential so that he may derive the maximum satisfaction and pleasure from the activity. 2. That I have an obligation to club organizations: therefore I shall participate in the developement and maintenance of a sound and respected club organization and shall endeavor to discharge this obligation to the best of my ability and to advise them wisely and honestly. 3. That I have an obligation to the profession: therefore I shall respect the dignity of the leaders, teachers and callers as persons, and shall maintain a good reputation for personal integrity. 4. That I have an obligation to the activity as a whole; therefore, in my personal, business and social contacts, I shall be conscious of its heritage and its future and conduct myself accordingly. 5. That I have an obligation to continue to work for professional growth, to adhere to uniform nomenclature, to learn, to lead, and to contribute to the total square dance movement to the maximum of my ability. 6. That I have an obligation to all associations dealing with the activity; therfore I shall promote a spirit of cooperation between the various elements of the association. I accept these obligations as a personal responsibility and solemn pledge in spirit and in fact, in a manner consistent with the highest standard of perfessional services as a member of Callerlab - The International Assoc. of Squ are Dance Callers. I shall discharge these obligations and dedicate myself to that end. Jim Whiteman





That being your group or dance could use all the figures from Standard Positions or All Positions. The dance could be labeled Mainstream Plus, Standard or A.P.C (all position dance).

The sixteen additional calls that make up the Mainstream Plus Plateau -

- 1. Cloverflow
- 2. Dixie Grand
- 3. Grand Parade 4. Ice Cold
- 5. Outsides In or Out
- 6. Pair Off
- 7. Red Hot
- 8: Roll (as an extension)

- 9. Single Circle to a Wave
- 10. Spin Chain the Gears
- 11. Substitute
- 12. Triple Scoot
- 13. Triple Trade
- 14. Turn & left thru
- 15. T Cup Chain

Note: Outsides In & Out is two figures

The Callerlab Mainstream Experimental are also part of this list If you are interested in having a club or dance that uses all these figures above mainstream may I suggest a Workshop titled Mainstream Plus Standard Position. You may have enough dancers in the area interested in this concept. Talk it over in the callers association and see where or when, perhaps it could be a group project to provide the dancers with another plateau or level of dancing. You could cover the 16 figures easily in 7–10 weeks of work shop and then if desired work on the A.P.D. concept which will keep you quite busy.

Each month for awhile I shall select one or two Mainstream Plus figures and give you some figures for starters. This month I have selected Dixie Grand.

DIXIE GRAND FIGURES

Four ladies chain-heads rollaway half sashay Four ladies chain-heads rollaway Circle left-cicle right single file Men U turn back-Dixie grand (rt. pull by, left Girls U turn back-Dixie Grand-left alle, pull by, right, left alle)

Four ladies chain - heads lead right - Circle to a line Pass thru-bend the line-(20-10 line)

Slide thru - Dixie Grand - left alle.

Circle right - circle left single file

Box 1-4 Right & left thru-dive thru Substitute (zoom) Dixie Grand-left alle.

In case you have forgotten how the Dixie Grand works, it is really a figure much the same as a wrong way grand three hands ending in a left allemande. The possible set ups include figures as the first two where only some dancers do the first right hand walk by then all get in on the next two hands. The third example looks like an eight chain three figure while the last one is back to the concept of some starting and others getting in second handed. Nice get outs from easy to set up positions.


