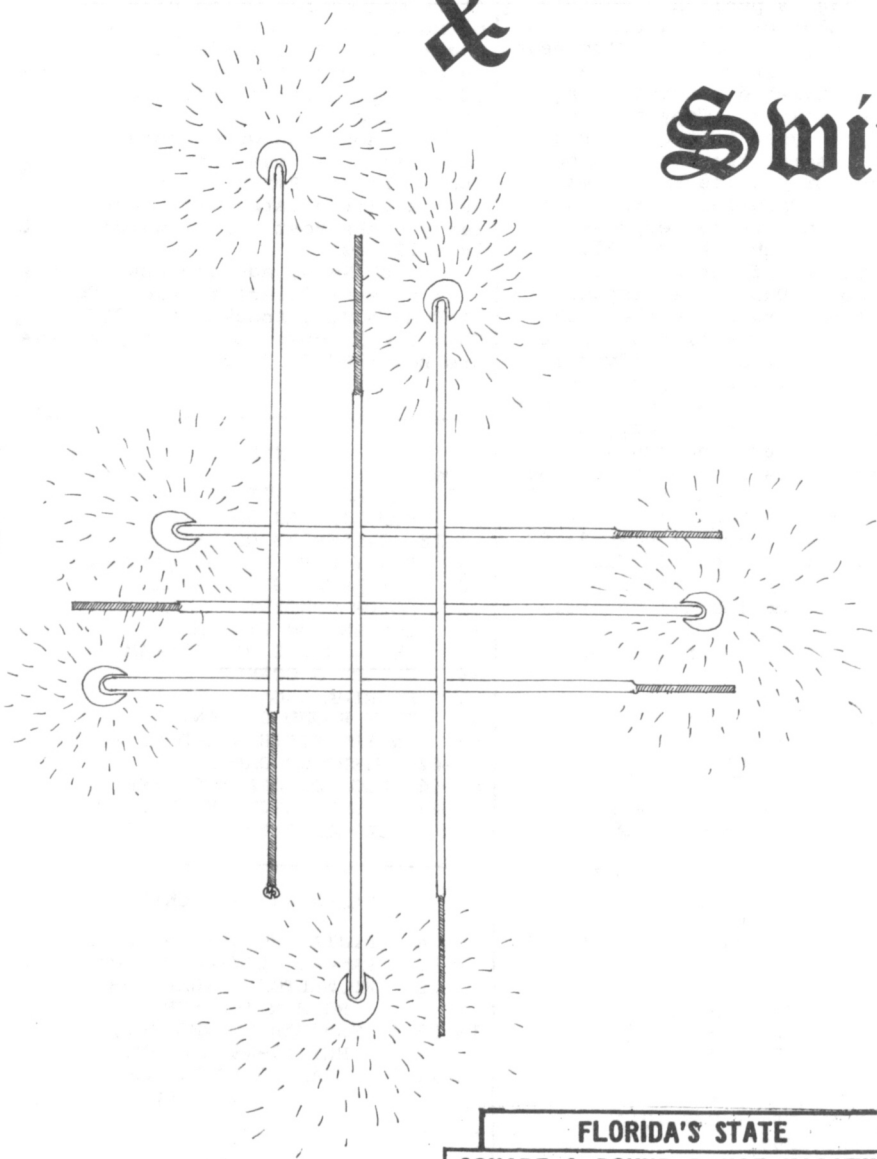

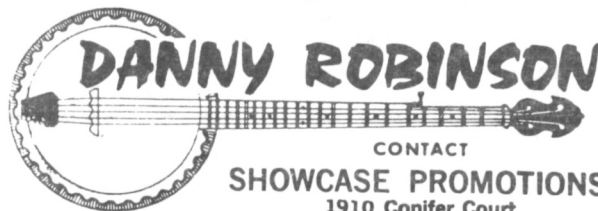

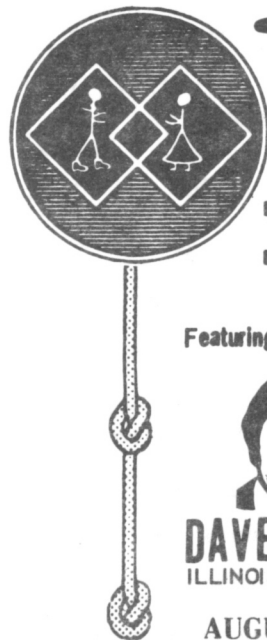
That's it, folks! Dancing is for friendship! Joy to the world! Let's keep happy dancing!

## HONORING AN OLD TIMER

On Sunday, May 18 the Central Florida Callers' Association hosted a "Jimmy Clossin" Testimonial Dinner. It was an evening devoted to honoring one of America's most colorful pioneer callers, a member of the Square Dance Hall of Fame, and a positive force for square dancing in Central Florida since the early fifties. A salute to Jimmy and his wife, Elizabeth written by Danny Robinson in his "Square Dance Bulletin" is reprinted here by Danny's permission. Thank you, Danny.

"A TIME FOR BOUQUETS" He was a cowboy - born on a cow ranch near Optima, Oklahoma, which he says is no longer on any map. He was lean and tall in the saddle - - and he rode the range during the early 1900's along the New Mexico-Texas border and up into the panhandle country "punchin' cattle". He was colorful and he was a square dance caller. He's our "Man of the Hour" this Spring in Central Florida - Jimmy Clossin.

Jimmy was never taught to square dance or call - just kinda took to it natural like. Like a lot of the old-time callers, Jimmy recalls dancing and calling at the same time. Microphones and amplifiers had not been invented then, says Jimmy, so a caller would dance in a set and use his lungs.

As a young man, Jimmy had wunderlust in his boots and a real thirst for knowing more about square dancing. Between 1910 and 1914 he made a number of trips into Mexico and was surprised to find quadrilles flourishing. By collecting bits and pieces of information, Jimmy speculated that a number of our square dances came from Spain by way of Mexico.

World War I came along and Jimmy enlisted and served in France. After the war, Jimmy spent some time on the West Coast and did a bit of square dancing and calling. He returned to Texas and El Paso where he went to work for the U.S. Border Patrol.

It was in Texas that he began to devote more and more time to square dancing. Then in 1935, he became a full-time caller traveling far and wide around the country teaching and developing the "Western Style" of square dancing for all who were interested and encouraging new callers.

In 1948, Jimmy co-authored West Texas Cowboy Square Dances. It was a "collection of quadrilles, hoedowns, and chatter" gathered during his travels. Jimmy's "travelin' boots started wearing a little thin around 1950, so he and his wife, Elizabeth, packed up their belongings and moved to Orlando. They must have liked the town, for they have lived here the last 29 years. And, speaking of Elizabeth, Jimmy says no story about Jimmy Clossin is complete unless it mentions the active support and valued assistance his 'aw' has given him and square dancing over the years.

Jimmy brought square dancing to Orlando. In the early fifties, he literally had thousands of school children through the city recreation department's program; he formed and called for a number of clubs from Sanford south to Kissimmee; he held the first "big" festival in Orlando with 1500 square dancers in attendance (some coming from as far away as Canada); and he was a guiding force in organizing the First State Square Dance Convention which was held in Tampa.

Jimmy Clossin - a true square dance friend and a member of the Square Dance Hall of Fame. This year, in the Spring of 1980, all of us who square dance in Central Florida are "remembering" him and his outstanding contribution to square dancing.

May 31, 1938-With the return of the Square Dance we again hear the sound of stomping feet, the scrape of the fiddler's bow and the caller, "How'll you swap and how'll you trade, your purty gal for my old maid," as the caller stands at the microphone of one of our present-day public address systems, calling the dances; not in the barn, kitchen or parlor, as our grandfathers did, but in large community halls and hotel ball rooms, with several hundred people going in as if their life depended upon it and thoroughly enjoying every minute of the dance.

To those who have never seen a square dance, by all means go; you will see a show well worth your while. Watch the caller as he pats his foot in time to the music and emits a vocabulary that sounds like Greek to anyone not familiar with it. It will amaze you to see them in action; the steps, turns, changes, this way one time, some other way the next, around one, between others, swing this one and that one, so fast that it is almost impossible for the eye to follow them, and they never run together, all in response to the caller who is having just as much fun trying to keep ahead of the dancers as they are in trying to keep up with him. When you leave the dance you are thinking you could never learn it, but don't feel discouraged, the dances are really easy to learn when broken down into single figures and you learn to do them one by one, then put them together, and away you go, just as you saw others doing them.

Many times at my classes, I have been asked where and when the square dance originated, and the only answer I can honestly give is-"I really don't know," but believe them to be a combination of the Quadrille and the Cotillion, very much elaborated upon, as we use figures from both and many more moves that I have been unable to find in any of the above mentioned dances.

The Quadrille comes from France where it was first used as a military drill, both mounted and dismounted, prior to the reign of Louis Fourteenth, at which time it was brought into the ballroom and participated in as a dance by both the ladies and gentlemen of the High Court circles from where it spread to other social groups and was finally participated in by everyone.

The origin of the Cotillion is in dispute. Some say it originated in Germany and was brought to France some time around 1844, while others say that the dance originated in the Courts of France.

Immigrants coming to the New England States, brought with them the Quadrille which, until this day and time, are popular in that section of the country, while up through the South we find the Minuet and Cotillion dances still in existence. In Kentucky and Tennessee along the southern Appalachian Mountains we find what is known as the Kentucky Running Sets. These are a survival of the English Country Dance and even today many of them are danced exactly as they were in 1600, but as we get out of this region they begin to intermingle, on the south with some moves of the Cotillion and on the north with figures of the Quadrille. Several influences, streamed together, have produced the Southwestern Square Dance; the Kentucky Running Sets and Tennessee squares on one hand, the New England Quadrille and the Cotillion on the other. The Quadrille was highly formal but as the settlers moved westward, it finally broke down into the Cowboy's thudding stomp. Improvisation caused the breakdown. The callers, dancers, and musicians congregating from all sections of the east, would not know the same dances, so they would improvise as they went along. Hence, the handclapping and double shuffle that has become a characteristic part of our square dance today.

Again we find in West Texas, in the El Paso vicinity and Southern New Mexico, along the Mexican border what is believed to be the center of the square dance in the United States. They are danced by all ages and you even find them taught in the Public Schools. These dances vary greatly from the Cowboy dance of the middle west. In the dances in this area you will find a definite Mexican and Spanish influence, and more intricate steps and patterns. The cowboy dance of the North and West moves in a different sort of pattern. It is more fool-proof-easier to learn-than the Mexican and Border dances but has not its sense of symmetry; those in the middle west swing with a waist swing, making it a bit rougher, Border dancers swing with a one or two hand swing-with finesse.



## An Ode to Jimmy Clossen or When Pancho Villa Bit the Dust

From time to time, we watch as our club callers travel on the annual trek to the CALLERLAB Convention in some distant city. Do you ever wonder what goes on at a CALLERLAB Convention? Do you ever wonder what sacrifices your caller is making to provide more enjoyment for you as dancers when returning from the Convention?

There are a host of topics which are scheduled each year at the Annual CALLERLAB Convention ranging from topics on Choreography to routine Committee meetings. There is no such thing as free time during the three days of the Convention, however. Most callers pay their own way to the Convention and we try to schedule as much into the available time as possible.

The Convention starts on Monday morning at 10:30 AM and has an opening session followed by five or six concurrent sessions with committees and an orientation session for first timers and those who wish to get updated on recent CALLERLAB actions. This year, the orientations session was conducted by Bob Osgood, Bill Peters and Johnny LeClair with Jon Jones, as Chairman of the Board presiding. At the same time, the committees on Definitions, Quarterly Selections, Mainstream Basics, Think Tank and Record Tune Clearinghouse all met to outline their activities for the rest of the Convention.

Then on Monday afternoon, we scheduled two 1½ hour sessions on many topics. Six topics at 1:30 and six more at 3:30 with a coffee/tea/coke and Tab break in between. These include some additional committee meetings as well as topics of prime interest to each member of CALLERLAB dealing with the technical aspects of calling and creating choreography. Callers interested in Caller-Coaching had their opportunities to ask questions. As the afternoon continued we saw most sessions with good sized groups. Yet through this entire Convention we also saw a great many callers take advantage of visiting our Exhibitors who had brought their merchandise and services for their fellow members to see first hand. These included PA Sets, Speakers, many different Record Producers, Note Services, Publications, Jewelry and Clothing. Eighteen Exhibitors and CALLERLAB Sales displayed this year.

Then some special interest group meetings at 5:00 PM and other opportunities for state callers to get together to discuss mutual concerns. Dinner is a slightly more formal affair with presentations for those callers who complete their 25th year of calling as well as awards to those callers attending from a foreign country. This year also saw us with a guest speaker talking about the important subject of LEADERSHIP. Others write to inquire about subscribing to CALLERLAB publications even though they cannot become members. Thus, the name SUBSCRIBER seemed to be a double-edged natural. A SUBSCRIBER must meet all of the qualifications for full membership except attendance at a Convention. He/she will receive all CALLERLAB publications which full members receive but will not be eligible to participate in CALLERLAB business by vote or committee assignment and will not be covered by the CALLERLAB group insurance. Dues for the SUBSCRIBER will be the same as those for a full member, currently \$40.00. When a SUBSCRIBER attends a CALLERLAB Convention, he/she automatically becomes a full member, having met all other requirements. When a member is unable to retain full membership by attending one Convention every three years, the member may revert to SUBSCRIBER status rather than being dropped. Those interested in becoming a SUBSCRIBER should obtain a recommendation from a CALLERLAB member and send it with their request and dues to CALLERLAB, Box 679, Pocono Pines, Pennsylvania 18350.

# THE Challenging Mainstream

by Gil T. Grosby

As this magazine enters into a new phase of its existence with a new editor and a revised format, it is perhaps a good time to reflect on the service this column should provide.

When this column was begun in 1975 the CALLERLAB Mainstream List was fresh off the press and there were no other CALLERLAB plateaus. The objective was to provide creative choreography featuring mainstream basics (and Quarterly Selections) to stimulate the imagination of callers. The hope was that callers would then be motivated to spend time exploring variety within the Mainstream Program rather than workshopping something new at every dance. From comments I've received from callers (and dancers) I believe we have been at least partially successful.

In the past five years, however, there have been a number of changes in the square dance world. One important change has been the establishment of the Plus I and Plus II plateaus of dance. These have become quite popular as evidenced by the large crowd in the Plus II hall at our recent State Convention. Accordingly I am going to revise the guidelines I use in developing this column each month.

Beginning with the August issue, one month each quarter will be devoted to Plus I and/ or Plus II choreography, one month will feature the current Quarterly Selection(s), and one month will be devoted to Mainstream choreography (usually featuring the basic CALLERLAB has recommended for review during that quarter).

This, of course, will make the current title of this column inappropriate. Accordingly, beginning with the August issue this column will be retitled CREATIVE CHOREOGRAPHY.

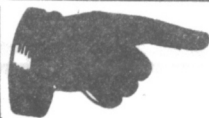
