We want to congratulate Dennis & Nancy Tayler for assuming the Presidency of the Florida Federation. They have done an outstanding job in the previous four years as they moved up the chairs from parliamentarian, treasurer, secretary and vice president of the Executive Board.

Possibly, because we are the registration chairman for the  $63^{rd}$  Florida State

Convention, we are asked why "we" moved the convention from May to March after all these years. They are not necessarily for or against the decision but wonder why. The answer is really quite simple. The Lakeland Center decided to renovate the area we use and asked/told us to choose another weekend. There were only a couple of dates available to choose. The March date was the best choice. Another question we get: Why are the dates wrong on the buttons and T-shirts? It was around the middle of March last year when The Lakeland Center decided to inform the Florida Federation of the situation. The buttons were already made by a volunteer and the shirts were already being sold at the fund raiser dance in February. A good convention chairman doesn't wait until the last minute to get things done. The registration forms were ready to be printed but, fortunately, were still being proofread. It never dawned on anyone that after all these years, The Lakeland Center would ask us to hold our Memorial Weekend Convention earlier in the year!!

Since this is a quarterly publication, a little update on the Masquerade Ball in October. Our first 5<sup>th</sup> Saturday Dance as Presidents was challenging and a little scary. The hall was without power after the hurricane. There even was a sailboat sitting out of the river across the street from the building. Two weeks later there still was no power. Linda Tester, and Parliamentarians – Ed Drexel and Terry Wetherby. If you have any suggestions or recommendations that could improve our activity contact any of the officers or attend one of the Federation meetings. Another new item that affects us is the change in the date of the 2017 Florida State Square and Round Dance Convention from the Memorial Day Weekend to March 24 and 25, 2017. Additionally The Space Coast Fiesta will be held in Titusville on February 2 & 3 instead of in January. 





## CALLERLAB Viewpoints

"I knew you were going to ask ... "

Ever spent an hour doing an exhibition or demonstration, then walked away feeling like you didn't really engage the audience? I mean, they thought it was a good show, but no one actually

considered that they could be part of the wonderful world of square dancing. If you had walked among the spectators you would have heard them saying things like, "It looks pretty, but I could never do that!" But you know they can! So don't let people leave without answering those unasked questions

You can work pro-actively by making short announcements during those few minutes when squares are reforming. Besides being informative, it lets people know there is more dancing to come and keeps them from wandering away. We also, whenever possible, avoid using the words "lesson" or "class" as some people have adverse reactions to those terms. Here are some sample scripts:

• I bet you worry about having two left feet! Well, if you can walk, you can square dance. It helps if you can walk to the beat of the music, but it's not required! Most of square dancing is knowing where to walk, and we can help with that. Just ask any of the folks you see up here...

• Most people think they need a partner to square dance, but that's not true! There are clubs just for single folks, also for teens and youth, and some just for couples. We also have handicapable clubs. Something for everyone! In fact, dancers how many of you met your significant other square dancing? Raise your hands! Look how many of these dancers met their life's partner on the dance floor – isn't that great!

• So, you think you can't take time for square dancing because you have youngsters at home? Well, we have something just for you! It's a family club, where moms, dads and kids can all learn to dance together. In fact, we are getting more and more grandmas and grandpas taking the grandkids square dancing every week! Would you like to spend more time with your kids, not less? And, unlike most sports, square dancing is not competitive – it's cooperative. Besides actual dancing, there is great interaction between kids and adults, helping one to mature and the others to stay young!

• Did your doctor tell you that you needed more exercise? Have you considered walking, but hesitated because it seems so boring? How about walking to music with a bunch of fun people? Many doctors recommend square dancing, citing the measured, even pace of walking to the music – and you would be amazed just how many miles you can dance one evening!

• Lots of people tell me square dancing looks pretty, but they don't feel they could do it. Let me tell you, all of us were just like you once! In fact, dancers, how many of you have been dancing one year or less? Raise your hands! How many have been dancing five years? Ten? Twenty? More than twenty? And look, all these people are dancing together and having a wonderful time!

These are just some suggestions to get you started; you will need to adapt these to your area (you may not have a handicapable club, etc.) It is best to find someone who's great at speaking "off the cuff" to present this material – in fact, if you choose someone other than the caller, he or she can grab some water and breathe for a minute during these "answers"! Get all the dancers, or even the spectators, involved in answering questions, interacting and smiling – especially smiling!

### Birth of [USDA]

Early efforts to create a National Dancer Organization focused on soliciting individual dancers to become members of the National Dancers Organization by paying annual dues of \$10.00 per dancer. The first of these efforts in the

early 1970's was led by Cacti Pete, a dancer from California who attended each of the first fifty National Square Dance Conventions®. The second attempt to unite dancers on a National basis was initiated by Ms. Chris Events of Cedar Falls, Iowa during 1975-1978 when she attempted to form the American Square Dance Association/International by charging family membership fees of \$10.00 or \$5.00 for a single membership. Seeing little success with this approach to combine individual dancers into a National Dancers Organization, in November of 1978 – Mr. Norm Holloway (General Chairman of the 13th National Square Dance Convention® in Long Beach, California – 1064) suggested to the California Square Dance council that their Presidents – Jim and Jan Maczko – seek the interest of the various other State and major Regional Square Dance

Associations, Councils, Federations, etc. into joining together to form a National Square Dancers Organization by amalgamating all of these State and major Regional Organizations into one National Dancers Association where each State would send representatives to an annual meeting.

The Showcase of Ideas held in Milwaukee in 1979 during the annual National Square Dance Convention® afforded Jim and Jan Maczko – Presidents of the California Square Dance Council – the opportunity to collect contact information on the various State and major Regional Square Dance Associations, Council, Federations, etc. from around the country. It was in late 1979 and early 1980 that the Maczkos initial mailing (USPS was the primary means of communications during that era) survey's seeking these other groups interest in collaborating in the effort to form what was initially envisioned as a National Square Dance Dancers Association.

Early responses were positive – enough so, that with the assistance of Bob and Janette Kemper, President of the Tennessee State Association of Square and Round Dance Clubs – arrangements were made to hold an informational meeting during the 1980 National Square Dance Convention® in Memphis. This meeting was actually held within the confines of the Memphis Convention Center, site of the 29th NSDC and was open to all. As the initiators of the fact finding efforts, Jim and Jan Maczko were selected to chair this meeting where viewpoints of those in favor as well as those opposed to the creation of such a National Square Dancers Association were expressed.

Those voicing support could see the benefits of the Dancers to have their own voice in the affairs of the Square Dance Movement and to provide support for such efforts to designate Square Dancing as the National Folk Dance of the United States. Those expressing opposition to such a National Square Dancer Association felt that existing organizations such as LEGACY International and the National Square Dance Conventions® Executive Committee already provided a venue for Dancers to be heard. Among the most significant shortcomings of these other existing organizations was that they did not exclusively represent Dancers, or did they include Dancers from every State.

In the spirit of cooperative involvement it was determined at the 1980 meeting in Memphis that there was a real need to create an Organizational Committee for the formation of the National Square Dances Association. This Organizing Committee consisted of not only those in favor of the creation of a National Square Dancers Organization but those who opposed as well.

Jim and Jan Maczko were designated as the Chairs of the fifteen member group. Ed and Mary Barbee – Past Presidents of the Texas Federation of Square Dancers – were chosen to serve as interim Secretaries of the Organizing body. Other members of this Organizing Committee consisting of Regional Directors that included Frank and Helen Cavanaugh (New Jersey); Win and JoAnn Edmondson (Wisconsin); Norm and Sharon Frank (California); Dewey Glasa (Alabama); Mike and Mary Gottulo (Nebraska); Freddie Kaitenthaier (Pennsylvania); Bob and Janette Kemper (Tennessee); Elmer and Jean Marose (Oklahoma); Bob and Ginger Prescott (Missouri); **Joe Vaccari (Florida);** Wayne and Marilyn Wells (Minnesota); Curtis and Jo Young (Texas); and, serving as advisors were Charles and Ebba Naddeo (California).

Correspondence among this group continued via USPS. Other tasks undertaken by the members of this group continued to determine the interest of additional State and major Regional Square Dance Associations, Council, Federations, etc. from around the country to participate in a National Dancer group. These efforts resulted in determining that sufficient interest did exist to create a National Square Dancer Association.

The next step was to generate the Governing Documents for this National Square Dancers Association. To accomplish this goal, a special meeting of the Organizing Committee was scheduled in early November 1980 in Oklahoma City during the Oklahoma State Square Dance Festival. This meeting was well attended with representatives from **Florida (Joe Vaccari, Joy Richardson)**, Texas (Ed and Mary Barbee, Curtis and Jo Young, Ed and Angie McCreary, Russ and Roberta Barton), Oklahoma (Elmer and Jean Marose, and Howard Thornton), and California (Mac and Mary McClure, and Jim and Jan Maczko).

Among the issues discussed during the Oklahoma City meeting was the name of this National Dancer organization. It was suggested that adopting the name of the National Square Dancers Association might be confused with annual National Square Dance Convention® which was a well-established and separate entity. In addition, the organizational structure was determined to allow each existing State and major Regional Square Dance Associations, Council, Federations, etc. to send four delegates to represent their interests at the annual meetings of this National Square Dancers organization. It was determined that the National Square Dancers organization would be divided into four regions - each region would be serviced by one of four Regional Vice Presidents. To ensure regional equality among the four Regions thirteen States were delegated to each of the four regions - Eastern Region extending from Maine through Virginia and would include the District of Columbia - Central Regional stretching from West Virginia and would encompass Mississippi up to Michigan - Plains Region covering Illinois through Texas - and the Western Region stretching from Colorado to Hawaii.

Proposed Governing Documents – Constitution, Bylaws and Standing Rules – were then distributed (again via the USPS) to all points of contact that had been collected to that point in time with the intent to present these Governing Documents during an organizational meeting to be held during the 30th National Square Dance Convention® in Seattle, 1981.

- 1. Peace of mind is more important than money.
- 2. If you really enjoy calling for a particular club, and it cannot offer a normal fee, don't worry about the money and take the date.

- 3. In dealing with any commercial property or business, always get everything in writing. Trust, but verify.
- 4. In dealing with hotels or motels, always assume that the person you are talking to will be gone in six months.
- 5. In dealing with hotels, try to void food commitments. They are a hassle and you can lose big.
- 6. When faced with a problem, say: "How can I see this differently?"
- 7. For any particular club, there are more good callers available than there are dates. To get a booking or to be re-booked, you must keep in contact with the club.
- 8. If a group is really happy, it doesn't make any difference what abilities it has. You will love calling for it.
- 9. The more organized you are, the less stress you have.
- 10. Occasionally one finds a club that combines high ability with great happiness. These clubs are a rare gift to the square dance world.
- 11. The more prepared you are, the less stress you have.
- 12. The earlier you arrive at a dance, the less stress you have.
- 13. Always ask what you can give back to the square dance activity.
- 14. If someone makes you laugh, keep that person around.
- 15. As you get better and better at calling, be content, but not satisfied.
- 16. Be sure you are right, then go ahead. But recognize, and be willing to accept, the consequences.
- 17. If you can find your purpose in life and live it, you will be happy. If you can identify someone else's purpose in life and help them live it, you will be even happier.
- 18. Trust in God, but lock your car.
