

We have mentioned the Blast Class before, and we would like to remind you of the opportunity that is available for new dancers and dancers who will be taking classes in February. Wizards Bob and Keith are preparing a great weekend of fun and learning for folks who are new to square dancing. The class is intended for people who are completely new to square dance, and

for people who are already taking lessons. The goal will be to teach about half of the mainstream program, but the focus will be on a fun weekend and a chance for learners to get some good floor time.

In the past, there was really nothing for people to do at a Convention until they had completed Mainstream classes. This class will give your friends a chance to experience the fun of dance as well as the fellowship and excitement of a whole convention of dancers. Please let your non-dancer friends know about this opportunity, and please ask your caller to announce it when your fall or winter square dance classes begin. Also, at the Convention, please stop by the class from time to time to be angels. Ribbons for Blast Class students will be \$35 no matter when they register.

Lastly, I have a few words about the dress code. Some folks have actually asked me what "clothing required" means. Many of us love getting all gussied up in our Square-Dance Finest. Nothing beats the sight of folks in their fancy outfits, skirts whipping and bolos flying. And some folks are a little put off by it. Wizard Linda and I frequently go out in square dance outfits, and never, not once, ever, has anybody told us "I just have to learn to square dance so I can dress up like that too!" So, what kind of clothing is required, you might ask. Go ahead, I'm listening.

Funny you should ask, because I actually have several answers for that: Dress as you wish to be remembered. You will be dancing with 6 or 7 hundred of your best friends, and they will remember. If you would wear it to the shopping mall, you can wear it here. If you would wear it to the gym, maybe not. Most important, don't let clothing choices be a problem. Be comfortable. Be stylish. Be outrageous. Be traditional. Be unique. Be whatever makes this the best Convention that it can be for you! Any questions?

64th FL Square and Round Dance Convention Update # 6

Autumn is on the way, the grandkids are going back to school, and soon the snowbirds will be flocking back to Florida. It's been a busy summer for the wizards. Lewis & Linda have been visiting all the clubs in the Northwest, and we are happy to report that the McDonalds and Cheryl Miller have done a great job spreading the word and distributing merchandise to support the Convention. Panhandle dancers often attend major events in Alabama, Mississippi, and Georgia, and we are delighted that many of them are going to travel a little farther to join us in Daytona Beach this February. (We central Floridians often forget that Pensacola is so far west, it's in a different time zone!) We know that all of the Ways and Means wizards have been doing a great job because over 420 people are registered for the Convention already. So, when you see that person at your dance with a stack of shirts, mugs, and buttons, be sure to give them a yellow rock and thank them for doing such a great job. And buy something. Please don't forget that part.

We want to let you know about emergency services. In the past, the Lakeland Center has required us to employ a paramedic. They are expensive, and very rarely needed. Since the Ocean Center does not have this requirement, we do not plan on having a paramedic on site. We will have common first-aid items at the registration desk, and we will refer any true emergencies to the local 911 service. An AED is available at the Ocean Center. Since we are a private group, everyone attending in any capacity must be registered. Free admission: Don't get your hopes up; if you come to dance, you gotta pay. But, we know that there are some dancers who can't dance any more, but would like to be included. We welcome those folks to help out with areas such as registration and hospitality, and we will give you a volunteer ribbon for free. Also, spectators are welcome. They must register, but will not be charged for admission. Lastly, we need three special, rugged, helpful, downright wonderful individuals to help with set-up and tear-down of the flooring. No experience is necessary -- they will show you what to do. We need you from 6 AM until 9 AM on Friday, and 9PM until midnight on Saturday. Those folks will receive a refund of their admission after the Convention. Please contact Wizard Lewis if you are interested in being a floor helper. lewiswasserman@gmail.com

I am afraid I got a little behind on the newsletter last month. I would love to blame it on the hurricane ... in fact, I will. It was the hurricane. Really. Anyway, sorry about that, and the rest will definitely get out on time ... unless there's a hurricane.

Some folks like to give you Frequently Asked Question (FAQ) lists. But we figure you already have questions, and you don't need more. So we present our FQA (Frequently Questioned Answers) list.

Hopefully this will answer some of the questions you already have.

64FSRDC FQA List:

YES, there will be hardwood floors in ALL dance rooms at the Convention.

YES, there will be enough hotel rooms. In fact, Wizard Randy worked some real magic, and they are building a new hotel JUST FOR US! The Fairfield will open in October, and it will be just a spell-throw away from our host hotel, the Homewood Suites. We will send a special email when it opens, in case you still need a room. There are also still rooms available at the Hilton, right across from the Ocean Center.

I also heard from a fellow dancer that rooms are still available at: Best Western Daytona Inn Seabreeze Oceanfront 730 N Atlantic Avenue, Daytona Beach (386) 255-5491

YES, if you stay at the Hilton, there is a pedestrian bridge direct to the Ocean Center, so you won't risk getting squished crossing the street.

YES, if you return your ribbon, you will get a full refund, BUT you must return it before the Convention starts. Anyone who returns an unused ribbon after the Convention will receive our most sincere thanks for the generous donation.

YES, now would be an excellent time to talk to your friends about the Blast Class. Be sure to let them know that the class is open to anyone, regardless of experience, and we would be delighted to have a few Mainstream dancers there to serve as angels. We expect to teach the new dancers about half of the mainstream program, with an emphasis on fun, fitness, and fellowship; mostly FUN! You do not have to have a dance partner to attend the Blast Class.

YES, the blast class is \$35 for the weekend, no matter when you register.

YES, simple First Aid supplies will be available at the registration desk, BUT we will not have an EMT on site. Any emergency will be referred to local 911 services.

YES, the Convention is considered a "private event." This means that everyone attending, even volunteers, must be fully registered. We welcome folks who no longer dance to volunteer. They will receive a complimentary Staff ribbon. YES, there will be a Trail-End dance on Thurs. Feb. 22 at Nova Community Center. The schedule will be announced in a future newsletter. Be sure to watch for it, because we are planning more than just a dance!

YES, Wizards Lewis and Linda are bringing their passports to all the dances they attend, and YOU SHOULD, TOO! Don't worry, though, because Wizards Lewis and Linda are not going to enter the drawing, because they already know THEY WOULD WIN! They are trying to get to all the clubs in Florida to dance. But if they don't make it to your club, please understand that Florida is BIG!

YES, Wizard Lewis sends out two copies of this newsletter each month. One for publication in regional newsletters and Bow & Swing, and another copy for all dancers registered for the Convention. That's why some of you get two copies of the same newsletter every month.

The 67th NSDC Raffle Quilt Story

When Wanda Kruse, prize-winning quilt artist, started quilting, she quickly learned that quilt blocks have names. Many blocks are named from everyday things quilters experienced. For her, these block names evoke stories of strong women and their families.

Cindy Boone, General Chairman, and Wanda share a fascination for the history behind quilt block names. We transformed our interest into this quilt project which features our Kansas and Missouri ancestors who have shaped our lives. The vintage blocks highlight dancing, friendship, and blocks about Missouri and Kansas. Many come from the *Kansas City Star* archives.

Wanda chose blocks that could be adapted for paper piecing. There are lots of discussions about this technique, and she love the sharp points and block consistency. All appliqué blocks were finished using needle turn. The quilt was hand quilted in the pattern Wanda knows as "Baptist Fan." The top, batting, and back are all 100% cotton. The quilt size is 101" x 101" so it can be used as a queen comforter or a king quilt.

Quilting is often a solitary project, but dancers throughout Missouri shared their talents. Wanda felt that this quilt was made with the love that you would find in the long ago quilting bees. Everyone who participated in the quilt project is listed on the quilt back.

The quilt was appraised for insurance purposes. It was appraised by a Certified American Quilters Society Appraiser who is highly regarded in the quilting world. The lucky winner will receive a quilt worth \$7,500! Wow, that is a <u>real prize</u>!

CALLERLAB VIEWPOINTS From Mike Seastrom

Gold Card Life Membership to Jerry Reed

The following presentation was given by Bill Heyman at this year's CALLERLAB Convention in Mesa, Arizona.

The Gold Card Life Membership is reserved for those who have worked

to make CALLERLAB a more valuable and successful leadership organization.

There have only been 22 recipients of this prestigious award in the history of CALLERLAB; 10 are still living. Seven of those recipients are in attendance tonight. Each of them, in their own special way, has made significant contributions to CALLERLAB and to the square dancing activity in general. The three Gold Card recipients NOT in attendance tonight are Frank Lane, Jerry Helt and Herb Egender. May I ask the seven Gold Card recipients who are in attendance tonight to stand, and remain standing as I read you name: Jim Mayo, Daryl Clendenin; Jon Jones; Betsy Gotta; Melton Luttrell; Marshall Flippo; and Bill Heyman.

Tonight's recipient started calling in 1978 when the club caller at their on -base club in the Philippines was transferred. He sent Jim Mayo a letter asking how he could go about learning to call. Jim's response congratulated him on being willing to take on the job, and offered some suggestions of reading material. He also recommended that he go to a calling school if he could. A few years later he had returned to the East Coast and came to a caller's school run by Bill Peters and Jim Mayo.

He was a good student and continued calling as he made the transition to civilian employment after a long career in the military. He joined CALLERLAB in 1983 and has attended our Conventions regularly ever since. He was elected to the Board of Governors in 1995. All of this makes him a fine caller, but not necessarily a candidate for Gold Card Life Membership.

In 1996 he resigned from the Board of Governors in order to accept the position of Assistant Executive Director of CALLERLAB. He was chosen by a committee made up of Tony Oxendine, Jim Mayo and Bill Heyman (who also nominated him for the Gold Card.).

It was his expectation and that of the committee that he would spend a number of years as the assistant to George White. Unfortunately, that was shortened to just three years when George died suddenly in 1999.

Our recipient tonight then became our Executive Director and was thrown into a complicated and demanding transition, living in Florida with an office in Minnesota. His success in making that transition and his subsequent performance as Executive Director (ED) for CALLERLAB for the next decade are the basis for our recommendation that he be awarded the Gold Card.

The position of Executive Director of CALLERLAB is, by its very definition, one that is an outstanding contribution to square dancing. It is underpaid, requires an extraordinary collection of abilities, the "patience of Job" and beyond that, considerable experience as a caller. The job is not only divorced from personal gain, but requires that one consider the needs of the members way before thoughts of oneself. He has never tried to put his own gain ahead of our organization.

Tonight's Gold Card recipient has all of these abilities and has made them available to CALLERLAB over more than a decade of employment as both Assistant and full Executive Director. When considering still living and active participants in our activity, we believe that the successful passing of the responsibility to a successor is adequate. In his case, he not only passed on a successful organization, he continued as an Assistant ED for another few years, assuring that the transition to his replacement wa as smooth as it could be.

We, CALLERLAB, expect that our ED will at all times represent the organization even beyond his or her personal experience. We ask that our ED be, at all times, the most complete demonstration of leadership and professionalism that one can describe. Our recipient has lived up to this standard throughout his time as our employee. Furthermore, even after leaving our employment he continued his leadership contribution to the activity as Chairman of the ARTS (The Alliance of Round, Traditional, and Square Dance), another position that expects the extraordinary with virtually no compensation offered in return.

The nature of CALLERLAB assures that our ED will exercise "broad influence." The ED is our spokesperson not by their choice, but rather by ours. We ask that he/she choose their words so that we are well represented. We do not allow their actions to reflect anything other than effectively on our behalf. The views of the ED are always subordinate to those of the organization, even when they are personally not in concurrence. He has, on many occasions, had a broad influence on the official views of CALLERLAB, which assures us that his views have broadly influenced the activity as well.

Erin Byars gives these helpful hints for using Facebook:

One of the most popular forms of Social Media is Facebook. According to Statistic Brain (statisticbrain.com) they have over 1.3 billion users as of January 2014. Mobile users number around 680 million. Translated in over 70 languages, 48% of the 640 million

minutes each month is accessed by 18-34 year olds.

First you will need a plan. In my case I have 1,133 friends, pretty much all of whom are square dancers or family. Square dancers are already in our activity and family has heard my pitch about the activity on a consistent basis. So in order for me to use Facebook to reach out to nondancers I have to concentrate on getting the attention of people I don't know.

What is a Hash tag? Hash tags are free, and they make it easy for those who are searching for specific information to find that information. When you place them in the text of your message it works like a hyperlink on a webpage – that is, anyone who sees the hash tag and clicks on it will immediately receive any and all messages on Facebook with that particular hash tag.

Another way to search for specific Hash tags is to place them in the search field at the top of the page and look for the dropdown selection that contains the Hash tag and again all will appear. Pretty cool!

To place a hash tag in your post, you have to use a pound sign (#) followed immediately by the search words that users may want to find.

- No spaces or any other symbols should appear.
- Place no more that three hash tags in each post
- Do not separate words YES: #doghouse NO: #dog house

What Hash tag should I place?

The next step is to come up with the right hash tag that will draw the most potential new square dancers. You can use #squaredance or #newsquaredanceclass, however, most people who are looking for what we have to offer have no idea that what they are looking for is Square Dancing! Here are some suggestions:

#newdanceclass #danceclass #health #healthy #exercise #friendship #friend #fun #music #friendliness #fellowship #danceexercise #memoryimprovement #improvememory #brainworkout #mentalexercise #teamsport #danceteam #physicalexercise #newfriends #social #socialize #meetnewfriends #meetfriends #socialexercise #travel #dancetravel #dancefestival #couples #singles #families #familyoriented Here are some rules of thumb when working with hash tags/posts:

- Use responsive questions within each post to insure a response
- Don't repeat posts find a different subject
- Use humor to get a response
- Attach pictures or videos to get prospective dancers attention

What Is a Responsive Question? A responsive question is a question that draws people to give a written comment, not just a "like". A responsive question makes people think and urges them to give their opinion and thoughts. A responsive question needs an answer. Some examples:

- Do you wish that you were having this much fun?
- Do you need to get out of the house?
- We are focusing on our health -- how about you?
- Do you wish your family did things together?
- Are you meeting new friends like we are?
- When was the last time you laughed out loud?
- Where else would you go to have this much fun?
- Got social contact?
- Come on out.
- What are you waiting for?
- Fill in the blanks: I dance because I...

Why Add Pictures and Videos? In 2011, YouTube had more than one trillion views or almost 140 views for every person on Earth.

Adding at least a picture or (preferred) a video gets everyone's attention and draws you to the post. As I scan over my Facebook home page, my eye is naturally drawn to pictures and videos, especially if the post tells me that the video is short -3 minutes or less.

You don't need to spend hundreds of dollars to buy video equipment. Everyone that sports a smartphone has access to video. Just take some shots at your club dance, a beginners class or an unusual dance location – just 3 minutes or less – and post it to your Facebook account.

Selfies are pictures that are taken, usually with your phone, of yourself. They are shot most of the time with your arm around someone, cheek to cheek. Comments will appear like: "Scot & Erin at Nationals".

For some odd reason, people love selfies and usually additional comments will appear from all over the country (sometimes the world!) If you're going to send a comment, why not get in the habit of hash tagging it.

NATIONAL CONVENTION UPDATE

As of February 28th there were 19,058 registrations from all 50 states, the District of Columbia and eight foreign countries for the 32nd National Square Dance Convention to be held in Louisville, Kentucky, June 23, 24, 25, 1983. Some 40,000 dancers are expected. If you have never attended a National Convention, give it some thought this year. Plans sound fantastic - it's going to be something very special. The Parade of States on Saturday evening should be spectacular.

There will be 14 halls for all levels of square dancing, 3 halls for round dancing, 1 hall for contra dancing and, for the first time at any National Convention, a special hall for Cloggers. The Clogging Hall will be open continuously for 3 days and will include workshops and clinics. Dancing will begin in each hall at 9 A.M. and won't stop until 11 P.M.

To date over 240 vendors will exhibit their wares for your shopping pleasure. Their colorful displays add unblievable glamor - a beautiful sight to behold.

The Pashion Show will have as its theme "Thoroughbred Pashions". Freedom Hall, the main arena where this show will be held, will have an exact replica of Churchill Downs, home of the world-famous Kentucky Derby. Models from 37 states and Saudi Arabia will display the latest in square dance attire. Detailed plans, all of which are impossible to relate here, call for the hall to have the historic twin towers of Churchill Downs, a carpeted "infield", the "track", the "winner's circle" made of flowers, spectacular lighting and even some live horses at the finale. A live band will provide background music, and the Stephen Foster Story Singers will provide entertainment.

The Showcase of Ideas, the area where square dance groups from all over the world share their organizational and promotional ideas, will have a complete garden setting, landscaped with waterfalls, shrubs, flowers and lawn furniture. (The Florida Federation always has one of the finest displays. If you plan to go to Louisville and you are asked to give an hour or so to help host Florida's Showcase, please do so. It's a fun experience you'll always remember.)

There will be a special Youth Hall for the hundreds, perhaps thousands, of young square dancers where they will have their very own miniature Convention. While they are welcome to dance anywhere, they will have everything available at their own home base.

Louisville promises the best Singles program ever. The Ramada Inn-Hurstbourne will be their headquarters and a special trail-end dance is scheduled there for solo dancers Wednesday night, June 22nd. It is important that solo dancers register as singles and wear their "singles" ribbons. For further information, Singles may call (502) 239-1698.

Exhibition dancing will not just be held before each evening's dancing program begins but will be almost continuous this year with performances by the World Pamous Cowboy Hall of Pame dancers from Oklahoma, The Squarenaders, a precision dance team from California; a youth unicycle square dance team from Ohio; The Maycroft Square Tappers, a youth exhibition group from Michigan, to name just a few.

There will be an Emergency Telephone manned from 9 A.M. until 1 A.M. each day. This line will be connected directly to the Control Center. Dancers can leave this number with family members at home in the event they need to contact you. The number is (505) 366-9592.
