Update # 8

With only a few months to go, your Convention Wizards have been hard at work getting ready for a magical Convention. Clarence the Misguided Magician has been quietly tending the trees in the Enchanted Forest and generally staying out of trouble. There has been some talk among the wizards of reinstating Clarence's wizard status if he does a good job and behaves himself.

The 2018 Convention has a lot of new features, and I am delighted to tell you about yet another. **Challenge-level dance is coming to Daytona!** The program will include ten hours of C dance. Bobby Keefe, Jack Lewis, Chris Phillips, and Keith Stevens have agreed to call C-1 and C-2 dances. Please let your friends and callers know about this opportunity.

Wizard Bill of Chesnut, our Chief Caller Wizard, would like to make sure

you understand what we mean by **Introduction** and **Workshop**. An **Introduction** is lessons on one dance level for people who dance at the next lower level. So, an introduction to A-1 would be attended by people who dance at least at the Plus level, and any A-1 material introduced will be taught as though you have no A-1 experience. A **Workshop** is intended for dancers who dance at the advertised level and wish to improve their skills at that level. Dancers attending an A-1 workshop will be expected to know the complete A-1 program, and will get practice with some of the trickier calls, for example, or explore calls from unusual positions or less common choreography.

We promised you more than just a Trail End dance, and we are delivering. Wizard Susan will be doing a Round Dance teach in the afternoon, followed by a pizza dinner, and then a 3-hour dance to get you all revved up for the Convention. Prices are \$8 for dance (either or both sessions) and \$7 for dinner. Please plan on telling us in advance if you plan on coming for dinner, because we will need to know how much food to order. We will tell you how next month.

We are almost there! And what a year it has been! Your Convention Wizards have worked hard to bring you the best convention experience possible.

The main purpose of this newsletter is to remind you about a few things that will help make your Convention experience magical! You might want to print it out and bring it with you. I am also attaching dance schedules to help you make your plans. These will also be printed in the Bow & Swing, and in the program book you will receive at the convention.

At the **TRAIL END DANCE**, dinner will be served at 4:30. If you want pizza, please be sure to fill out the online reservation form if you haven't already: <u>https://goo.gl/forms/ df3NpEdI4no97VtY2</u> Please do this before 2/10/18 so we know how much food to order. Remember, the Trail End dance is at:

Nova Community Center, 440 N. Nova Rd., Ormond Beach, FL 32174

PARKING: When you arrive at the Ocean Center for the first time, ask the parking attendant for an **Exhibitor Pass**. This will get you unlimited in/out parking for only \$5 per day. Pay for both days when you arrive, and you won't have to worry about Ocean Center parking.

DRESS CODE: Clothing required. Dress as you wish to be remembered, and nobody will shame you if you want to keep it casual. This is a NO BARRIERS event! (Naturally, State laws and common decency do apply. Enough said.)

You may bring two bottles of **WATER** from home, but no other food or drinks. There are drinking fountains near the bathrooms where you can refill, and you may always buy bottled water (and other food and drinks) at the concession.

RESTAURANTS are in no short supply along Atlantic Ave.. Literally dozens of restaurants are within a few blocks of the Ocean Center, including local favorites like the Cruisin' Cafe, pizza, fast food, and chain restaurants like Bubba Gump and Ruby Tuesday. There are even a steakhouse and a seafood restaurant in the Hilton across the street. The **CONCESSION STAND** at the Ocean Center will be open during the hours of the dance, serving typical stadium food, and some healthy choices such as salads and sandwiches. It is located right across from Ballroom A. There is a list of local eateries at the Registration desk.

If you haven't got a **HOTEL** reservation yet, there are still rooms at the Fairfield Inn, (386) 254-4700. Be sure to book before 1/22/18 to get the discounted Square Dance rate of \$109.

You will not want to miss our **SPECIAL EVENTS**: **AWARD PRESENTATIONS** and **GRAND MARCH** Friday at 6:00 PM. **KICKOFF** for the 65th FSRDC Saturday at 6:00 PM. Start Your Engines! All events will start ON TIME so be ready to have fun!

Lastly, a **REMINDER**: There is still time to register your friends for the **BLAST CLASS**. It is \$35 for class members.







FLORIDA FEDERATION OF SQUARE DANCERS BANNER STEALING GUIDELINES

<u>PURPOSE</u>: The object of banner stealing is to promote friendly visits between clubs. Do not over patronize a select few but spread your club around. If you are going to be a banner bandit, be a good one, abiding by the guidelines and make a practice of retrieving your banner before stealing someone elses. In applying these guidelines use good judgement at all times.

- A banner may be stolen or retrieved by a minimum of one full square, displaying club badges of the club they are representing and by paying guest admission.
- A club cannot steal a banner or retrieve it's banner when their club caller is a guest caller of the club they are visiting, nor can a caller or his partner participate as part of the banner stealing/retrieving party.
- 3. Recommend that not more than 3 traveling banners be available. Banners cannot be reserved. However, as a courtesy to the host club, it is highly recommended that a stealing club contact the intended host club prior to going to steal a banner. This will preclude disappointment of no banner being available. IOU's or "substitute" articles are not recommended as being permissible in lieu of the banner.
- Banners should be available to any open dance on the host club's regular dance night and location unless advertised as a special dance.
- Recommend that travel be limited to a maximum of 100 miles round trip unless mutual agreement is made with intended host club.
- A banner raiding party, regardless of size, should not retrieve and steal banners at the same dance.
- 7. The first FULL banner stealing party to sign the host club's guest register should be awarded the traveling banner. It is recommended that not more than one banner be "stolen" per dance.
- Banners should not be stolen from clubs whose dances are scheduled for the same night as the club dance of the stealing club.
- A club should not steal a banner from another club more often than once every 90 days. It is discourteous for a banner to remain in limbo more than 90 days.
- The banner stealing party should dance for at least three full square dance tips to be eligible to steal the banner.


