JANUARY 9, 2000
SUMMARY OF MINUTES

The meeting was called to order by President, Will Barnhart. The invocation was given by Mary Stewart. The meeting was held at a Golden Coral Restaurant and was very noisy. Board members could barely hear the speakers, therefore, by motions from the floor reading of the minutes, treasurer's report and the area directors' reports was suspended.

MEMBERSHIP: Barbara Hoffman reported that the membership is down. She asked all the area directors to work on their clubs to build up the membership. We have approximately 300 members. Several clubs have closed.

Due to her accident, Esther Layne has resigned. Will Barnhart would like members to submit names to fill the position.

Will Barnhart reported that he has appointed a committee to study different ways we might improve membership and what benefits we offer our new members. The committee consists of PeeWee & Mary Stewart, Chairman; Will & Carol Barnhart, Dewey & Donna Hendricks, Don & Anna Foust, Harvey & Ella Shriver, and Duke & Doris McCleskey.

BLOOD BANK: Jim McConnaha reported that at the last meeting he talked about having a dangle made for blood donors. He is just passing a suggestion about the dangle. He passed out the logo that he thought was a good idea. Also he would like to have different dangles for the amounts of blood given by the member. He may pass it by SusanElaine to see if she can come up with the logo.

INSURANCE: The following clubs have not responded to insurance applications mailed in early October: Canaveral Squares, J & M Klassy Kats, St. Cloud Motivators, Salt & Pepper Shakers, Slip Pivot, Swingin' Eights. We have not received any accident claim forms.

KEEPIN' POSTED: George Knapp reported that Keepin' Posted for the first quarter of 2000 has been printed and 500 copies of a 36 page magazine have been distributed at this time. The advertising revenue for this issue was \$180. Special thanks to the Wagon Wheels, Starlight Promenaders, and Space Trackers for placing ads in this issue.

Again we remind the board that our last issue as editors of Keepin' Posted will be the July 2000 printing. By that time we hope someone will have come forward to replace us. We would hate for Central Florida Association to lose its connection to its members through our magazine. **EDITOR'S NOTE: Since this meeting a couple has come forward and agreed to be Keepin' Posted editors beginning with the July issue. See article elsewhere in this publication.**

HISTORIAN: Judy Frye reported that since the last meeting she has not received anything to be put into the scrapbook. She has written an article, which will be submitted to both Bow and Swing and Keepin' Posted magazines requesting photos or articles that should be in our historical scrapbook.

FLORIDA FEDERATION: George Knapp reported that last Federation Meeting was in October at Defuniak Springs. New officers were elected. It is time for the Central Association to appoint a State Convention Chairman for 2004. Action needs to be taken so that a name can be presented at the next Federation Meeting in February. George then gave details as to place and time of the Federation Working Weekend meeting.

OLD BUSINESS:

Volusia County Fair: Randy Poole reported that for the 11 days at the fair there were 125 people interested in learning square dancing. We do not know how many people have actually signed up for a class. Next year Randy is going to try to get the Education Building and he may be able to do better next year.

Randy also reported that he is now taking hotel reservations for the state convention. We will be at the Howard Johnson. He has only 60 rooms opposed to the 120 he had last year. Rooms are \$47.00 for the first night and \$45.00 for all other nights. The two dollar difference is the cost of supplies in the hospitality room. In order to get these prices you must make reservations with Randy.

Mary Stewart reported that her study committee has not met yet, but that Duke McCleskey has made a thorough survey of the other associations. Mary believes we should give serious thought to having an annual two-day dance with hotel and motel accommodations nearby. Action is being taken on this item. (See new business.)

Mary further suggested giving each club in the association a CFA banner to thank them for their part in our last convention. This would also give the club free membership for the year 2000. This would show that CFA recognizes the club and give them more incentive to work harder to get their members to join CFA. No action was taken on this suggestion.

NEW BUSINESS

Will Barnhart announced that the appointment of a General Chairman for the 2004 State Convention has been made. Bruce and Colleen Morgan have graciously accepted the position.

Motion was made by Jim McConnaha and seconded by George Knapp that the CFA have an annual special square dance. Discussion followed concerning finding a facility and contacting callers and cuers. A date in March, 2001 is being considered. Vote was taken and motion passed. A committee was appointed to do the leg work. Members are Barnharts, Hoffmans, McConnahas, Knapps, and Morgans. They will report back to the board at the next meeting in April.

George Knapp made a suggestion we meet somewhere more desirable. Randy Poole offered his home with a potluck dinner. There will be maps made to direct the members to the Poole's house.

The April 9, 2000, CFA Board Meeting is 2:00 p.m. at Randy & Carol Poole's house with a pot luck dinner following.

The April Fifth Saturday Dance is at Travis Recreation Center in Cocoa. John Swindle is the caller and Audrey Philips is the cuer.

Meeting adjourned at 4:00 p.m.

Square Dancing Foundation Initiates New Marketing Plan

CALLERLAB, under the auspices of its **FOUNDATION** (*For the Preservation and Promotion of Square Dancing*), recently kicked off the first phase of its exciting, new marketing and promotion effort, **PLAN 2000**. The Foundation, working in concert with all the diverse organizations and components within the square dancing family, is developing a dynamic, long range, and comprehensive marketing concept that identifies specific problem areas, and utilizes professional public relations and advertising assistance to create viable answers.

These are solutions that have practical application for all levels and elements within the square dance world. The marketing plan will offer programs that address the concerns and needs, not only of the existing "family" of square dancers, clubs, associations, and callers, but also offers a new image of the activity aimed at the large majority of our population that has never "squared up" on the dance floor.

Different phases of the marketing plan will be implemented on a national and international basis over the next decade

as they are developed and funding becomes available. In the introductory period, emphasis is on market research, image change, and recruitment ideas.

An important step in the marketing effort occurred last fall, when the Foundation appointed Creative Marketing Services and James Hensley as marketing advisors to the Foundation.

Phase One of the marketing plan will include plans for work in two important areas. First, to raise the level of awareness within the square dance community that its historic, established dance activity now has to repackage itself in order to compete successfully in the leisure and recreation market place, along with all the other "products" or "services", that are seeking the "consumer's" loyalty and attention. The second area, good market research will be conducted to gather valid information about the needs, perceptions, and interests of that consumer (the new dancer). This data will help build a better dance program, because it will define the customer's expectations for their new dance experience.

A big THANK YOU to all who have contributed time, effort and money to this critical effort.

DICK HURLBURT
Square Dance Caller/Instructor
March 9, 1938 - December 12, 1999

Dick had been involved with square dancing nearly all of his life. Among his first memories are those of traveling to a square dance at the local Grange Hall with his father and mother. Still too young to dance, he would watch and play with the other children at the dance. Many times he would be so tired that he would fall asleep in the coats piled on one of the tables in the kitchen.

Years later, he was again involved in square dancing while posted in England with the US Air Force. It was there that he began "calling". He also met his future wife, Rita, at a square dance in England. Dick & Rita have called and danced from the island of Guam to the green fields of England and have friends they met while dancing scattered all over the globe. Dick served in the US Air Force for 22 honorable years and was retired in 1979.

Dick had been an instructor for many square dance classes in Central Florida, from New Smyrna

Beach to Haines City, since moving here in the late 1970s. He had served with distinction on the board of directors of the Central Florida Caller's Association, including serving as its president. Locally, Dick was a well-known leader in the square dance field. Not that Dick had limited his work to the local area. He was also well-known statewide. Among his other accomplishments, Dick instituted a new caller training program for the Florida Callers Association. He served as the secretary, vice president and then as president of that respected body.

Dick had called and taught for many square dance clubs in Florida and had hosted travel groups to square dance tours of England. Dick was a member in good standing of CALLERLAB, the International Association of Square Dance Callers. His enthusiasm and love of the dance made him an ideal instructor and leader of the activity.

National Folk Dance Legislation

A bill, HJR #60, has been introduced into the 106th Congress of the United States by Representative Jim Saxton from New Jersey to designate square dancing and its related activities as the National Folk Dance of the United States, in perpetuity. HJR #60 has now been referred to Committee of Government Reform in the U.S. House of Representatives for study and action. Indiana Representative Dan Burton is chairman of this committee. Right now this bill needs the support and backing from everyone involved in the square dance recreation.

LEGACY is asking for our assistance in getting this bill

accepted by the legislators. Please contact your congressmen and congresswomen and request their support for HJR #60 when it reaches the floor for a vote. If you have questions, or want a copy of the resolution, contact the Co-Chairman of the effort, Frank & Helen Cavanaugh, at 20 Wootton Drive, Southampton, NJ 08088.

If possible, the committee would like to have the bill signed by the President at the National Square Dance Convention in Baltimore. LEGACY feels passage of this bill will give square dancing and its related activities more visibility and have a positive effect in recruiting new dancers.

LEGACY to Conduct Seminars at 49th NSDC

Been wondering if you could learn to clog? Try the introductory clinic. Want to improve? The intermediate clinic is for you.

The intricacies of advanced and challenge dancing will seem less intimidating once you attend an introductory clinic.

Wish you and your partner were smoother round dancers? Maybe a clinic or two will get you a more polished style.

The dance clinics are listed in the education portion of the daily convention schedule. Most are just one hour long and all are conducted by experts. Give them a try when you come to Baltimore.

There's Still Room At the Inn

Not only are there hotel rooms from which to choose, but space is still available also at the campground

and at Towson State University, site of campus housing. We have space at very nice hotels located downtown, as well as at those away from the center of the city.

Parking at hotels away from the Center City is usually free, and **there will be shuttle service to the convention from all hotels on the convention registration form.** A bus pass is required to use it. Check the appropriate box on the registration form and include the \$25 per person fee along with your registration fee.

Guidelines for New Dancers

- **Dance at Other Clubs.** You are missing one of the great things about square dancing if you only dance at your home club.
- **Belong to a Club.** Clubs need an active membership where everyone helps. Volunteer, don't wait to be asked.
- **Dance to Other Callers.** Every caller has a different style—that is part of the fun.
- **Dance in the Front of the Hall.** Don't hide in the back. The caller watches the entire floor. Don't be afraid to dance in the front of the hall.
- **Dance with Experienced Dancers.** Sometimes an outreached hand is all your square needs to keep going.
- **Touch Hands After Every Move.** It will establish your position in the square. If you're lost, at least you will have company.
- **Keep Dancing.** It is important to practice, practice, practice.
- **Be Aware of Your Level.** Look for dances advertised at the level you know.
- **Stay at Your Level for Awhile.** The level you dance has nothing to do with how good a dancer you are. It has to do with how much time you are willing to devote to your hobby.
- **Square Dance for Fun.** If your square breaks down, don't worry about whose fault it was. It doesn't matter. Regroup and **keep smiling**.

FINALLY: Jump right up when the music starts. Get in the first open square. **Do not pass one up!** Introduce yourself and have fun!
