HASH CALL RUMMY

At long last we have a card game developed for Square Dancers. The game, "*Hash Call Rummy*", was released in mid-May and was formally announced in the Program Book of this year's National Convention in Detroit.

Officials of DEE GEE GAMES, the distributor of the game, say, "Although designed particularly for Square Dancers, Hash Call Rummy can be played by non-dancers as well. That means dancers can share the enjoyment of square dancing with their non-dancing friends." It seems to us that the game provides an excellent means of introducing folks to the art, skill and fun of square dancing.

"In addition to being loads of fun, *Hash Call Rummy* is also educational", the company's spokesman said. Games can be obtained by sending \$4.75, which includes postage and handling, to DEE GEE GAMES, P.O. Box 523, Palos Park, IL 60464. This is not simply a new game played with standard cards. Each card in the deck shows the detail of a different square dance call. You can almost hear the music as you wait for that familiar "*Allemande Left*", so we are told.

Let's Take a Look

LEADERSHIP

A good leader must:

- be able to take criticism
- learn to stand adversity
- be able to delegate authority
- make decisions
- be free from prejudices
- share the credit
- be able to concentrate under difficult circumstances
- assume responsibility for mistakes
- grow and learn
- stimulate volunteers to serve with vigor, competence & pride
- understand the difference between leadership & management

Leadership is an art. Leaders possess the art of getting people to do things for them. They are sensitive to the one-to-one relationship. Management is a science.

A good manager must:

- establish controls
- execute the plan
- define the problems
- appraise the results
- communicate objectives

If you can learn both the skills of leadership and management and if you are able to detect when to lead and when to manage, then you will be a person who makes things happen effectively. Any organization — a federation, an association, or a club — must be well led and well managed to be successful. The most successful groups understand the difference between leadership and management and build a team for both.

NATIONAL SQUARE DANCE DIRECTORY

To assure that your club is included in the 1983 Edition of The National Square Dance Directory, current club information must be submitted by November 1st, 1982. Listing of clubs is a free service provided by the directory. Through a listing in the directory, you enable dancers traveling through your area to enjoy an evening of dancing and fellowship with your club.

The directory lists the type of club, (square, round, contra, clogging, singles, teens, etc.), the level of dancing, when and where to dance, and a person to contact concerning the club (mailing address and phone number). The 1983 Edition will also include a festivals listing and a caller/leader listing. There is a nominal charge for these festival, caller and leader listings. The directory also includes a Products/Services Directory section which provides dancers with extensive information on suppliers of square dance related products and services.

The 1983 Edition will be published in March, 1983. The directory is available at over 400 local square dance and western shops. Club listings and requests for additional information should be directed to:

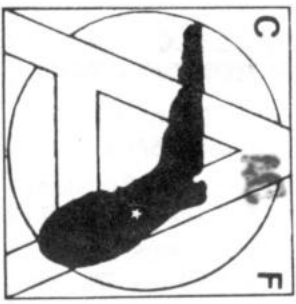

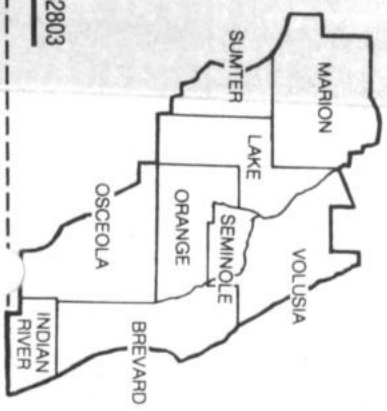
