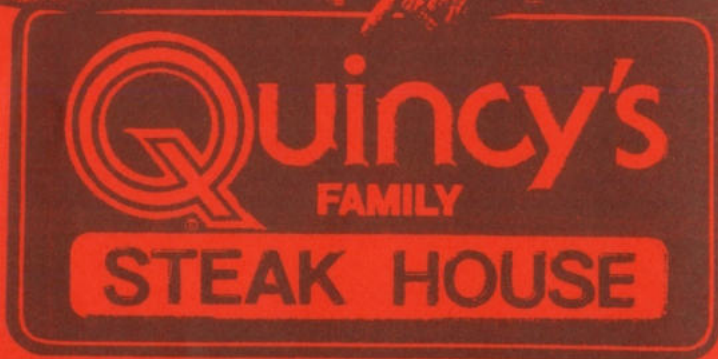
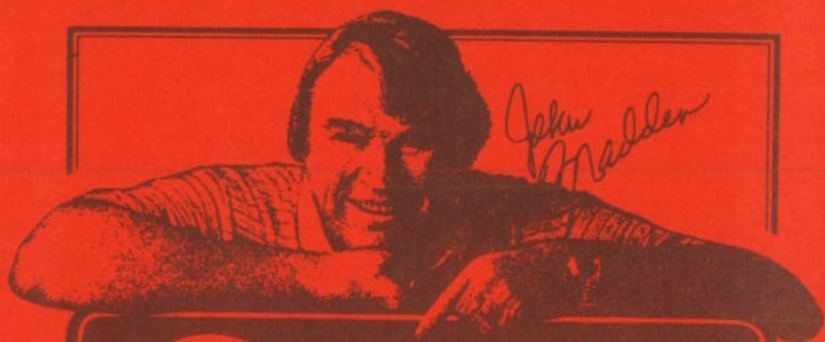

CIRCLE OF SERVICE

LEGACY introduced an award for dancers only, the National Convention in Birmingham during the panel on Awards and Recognition. It is called the "Circle of Service" and is a symbol of service to square and round dancing. The award developed from an idea by Mori Sogolow of Plant City, Fl.

It is designed to be worn with pride by dancers who, for three or more years are determined to have made a significant contribution to the square and round

dance movement.

The stellar hub of the circle, formed by a pattern of arcs, symbolizes the importance of each such individual to the total picture. The same circular shapes flow outward to help define interlocking squares and stylized musical symbols. This linear interplay suggests the strong bond between the two "sister" dance activities, square and round dancing.

Your Central Florida Association, Presidents, Howard and Vivian Wilson, and other members of the Board of Directors have been recently "pinned". Look for many more Circle of Service awards in the coming months.

SPACE TRACKERS: PATHWAY TO THE STARS

Space Trackers of Rockledge, are in orbit at the beginning of our 3rd year with a new class of 60 new dancers. This is our 3rd class and the biggest yet!!

We have been asked many times how we do it. There is no one reason, but we feel the main ingredients to our success are the friendliness and support of our club members, a good instructor/caller, and lots of fun activities. In addition to our classes, we have non-dancing socials such as a River Boat Cruise coming up in November and a Christmas Carolling Hayride in December.

Non-dancing socials was one of the suggestions given at the National Convention in Birmingham last June on "Recruiting and Retaining New Dancers" and we have found this to be very effective. Last year we had a picnic, hayride and Casino Night. The class and club members have an opportunity to socialize and get better acquainted and the class members feel more a part of the club.

Space Trackers is also actively involved in the Brevard County Council of Square and Round Dancers. The Council's objective is to promote cooperation among all the Brevard County clubs and to work with the Central Florida Square & Round Dancers Assoc. The Council made a flyer listing all the classes in Brevard County and this listing is made available to all Space Trackers dancers. We encourage our class members to attend more than one class and to get together with other class members and practice to get all the floor time they can. We provide class level dances for them last year and probably will again this year.

We did all the traditional things for National Square Dance Month this past September such as newspaper ads, radio and TV spots, bank marquees, Mall demos, and flyers, but a questionnaire we ask all new students to complete showed that the overwhelming majority came because a friend asked them and told them how much fun square dancing is. We have an awful lot of hard working, dedicated club members who really work at building our club. This can be seen at the Monday night classes where we usually have at least 40 square angel club members there to help with the new class.

While we do an awful lot of work, our theme is "FUN" for both class and club members. With 110 club members and 60 new class members, Space Trackers are still climbing on our PATHWAY TO THE STARS!!

Dr. Lloyd "Pappy" Shaw, the name and the man, is most likely unknown to most new square dancers today. Shaw is generally recognized as the father of modern square dancing. In Colorado in the early 1900's it was Shaw who revived a sagging interest in square dancing that was on the verge of extinction. His "Cowboy Dances", a 1939 collection of almost 100 calls of that time, emphasized "dancing in the proper spirit."

What is the proper spirit? It is dancing with the corners of our mouths turned down? No! The spirit means smiling - showing the pleasure received from dancing with good friends. Does it mean being critical about our fellow dancers' imperfections when the square falls apart? No! The spirit means laughing together - accepting the fact that we are human; and being human we will err.

Does it mean ignoring those who, we've decided, do not dance as well as we? No! The spirit means understanding - to be tolerant and less judgmental of others. After all, all of us came into square dancing for the same reasons - fun, fellowship, and harmony. These three ingredients have made square dancing grow into a community of an estimated 7 million dancers. The absence of these ingredients could also destroy the community.

THE DIXIE SQUARES:

On September 7th, while other DIXIE'S were qualifying for the "ORDER OF THE BLUE BOTTOM" at Ichatucknee Springs, Jackie Stafford the Dixie's "Mrs. President", was transported from the campground to Lake City Hospital where she underwent an emergency hernia operation. Jackie has recovered nicely and is "squaring up" again.

The annual DIXIE LUAU was attended by 150 on September 19th. Former presidents, Maury and Jean Westcott were elected King and Queen. Food and decorations were outstanding this year.

A couple of squares danced for the Holy Child Episcopal Church Barbeque on September 21st and for the South Daytona Fireman's Carnival on October 5th to promote Dixie's new square dance class which began on October 10th with an Open House.

About twenty Dixie dancers attended the Fall Festival at Fontana during the first week of October. The dancing was only surpassed by the beautiful fall colors. Witches and goblins were out in number at the Halloween costume dance on October 31st.

Thanksgiving will be celebrated on November 21st with Pie Night. This is in conjunction with a Silent Auction. All diets aside, come and enjoy is the theme.

JIMMY CLOSSIN

One of America's most colorful pioneer callers, a member of the Square Dance Hall of Fame, recipient of Callerlab's highest awards, the Milestone, a member of Florida's Square Dance Hall of Fame, and a positive force for square dancing since the early fifties in Florida is a man that I have had the privilege and honor of knowing for several years.

He was born February 2, 1899 on a ranch near Optima, Oklahoma. Don't look for it on a map, as he says it isn't there anymore! He punched cattle, spent time in the Army during WW1, rode with the Boarder Patrol in Texas and somewhere along the way he learned to square dance and call. He traveled all over the area calling and teaching and finally in 1935 he went "full time".

Eventually in the early 1950's he and his most staunch supporter, his wife Elizabeth, came to Orlando to settle down. He taught school children in Orlando through the city recreation program, started and called for several clubs between Sanford and Kissimmee. He held the first "big" festival in Orlando with 1500 dancers in attendance. From there he was the force behind the first State Square Dance Convention in Tampa.

Yes, he has had quite a colorful career and life. If all the material could be gathered and put into book form, it would be one of those that could not be put down until you finished it!

But now Jimmy is a very depressed gentleman. He has been bed-ridden for the past several months, and was in the V. A. Hospital and then in Orlando Regional. It is hoped that he can be admitted to the Central Park Village Nursing Home and possibly may be by the time this is in print. We are hoping that Elizabeth will be joining him there very soon, as she is not well also.

Somewhere along the way Jimmy's hearing aid disappeared. Through an appeal to the Florida Callers Association they are going to provide Jimmy with a new one. If you would like to help a fellow square dancer and caller, promote a Jimmy Clossin Appreciation dance in your area and help defray the cost. The proceeds should be sent to Jim Duncan, F.C.A. Treasurer. He will establish a special fund for this purpose. If a special dance cannot be promoted in your area and you wish to contribute, send your donation to Jim Duncan.

If you are in the Orlando area, drop in and see Jimmy. That is what he enjoys the most, to talk about his second love, square dancing. His first love?? Why, Elizabeth, of course??

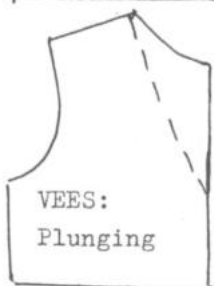
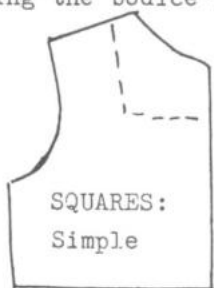
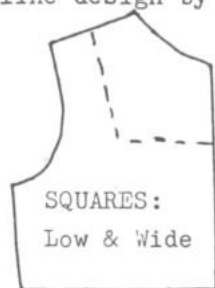

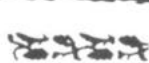


SEWING CORNER: Neckline Variations

Trace the bodice onto brown paper or newspaper then draw in the desired neckline adjusting it to the desired design. Once you are satisfied with the pattern transfer it to a piece of pellon and you will have a pattern that won't wear out. Be sure to cut your facing to match the neckline design by using the bodice pattern as a guide.

Donor Requirements:

1. Be at least 17 years of age. No upper age limit so long as you fill all the requirements for a regular donor.
2. Weigh at least 103 pounds.
3. Should not have donated blood in the past 8 weeks or have given plasma at a plasma center in past 6 months.
4. No major surgery in past 6 months.
5. Never had jaundice or hepatitis or been in direct contact with either in past.
6. Receiving blood or plasma will defer a donor for 6 months.
7. If a donor knowingly has high blood pressure and is taking medication for this, a written permission from his physician is required to donate. No blood pressure medication should be taken 24 hours preceding donation.
8. If taking any prescription medications or had any medications or injections in the past 30 days, please contact the Blood Bank to determine your eligibility.
9. Should not have any cold, sore throat or flu symptoms the day you are to donate.
10. Pregnancy within past 6 weeks will be reason for deferral.
11. Not participate in hazardous occupations or dangerous activities (fly aircraft, ski or skindive, drive a bus, climb utility poles, etc.) for the remainder of the day after giving blood.
12. Should not have had a recent history of night sweats, unexplained fever, unexpected weight loss, and/or swollen lymph glands.
