CFA BANNER STEALING ACTIVITY

The CENTRAL FLORIDA ASSOCIATION initiated a "Banner Stealing" activity at its General Membership meeting of April 29th, 1988. The rules for a club to obtain a CFA banner were listed in the September issue of KEEPIN' POSTED and since that time many clubs have qualified by having at least one square attend the CFA dances to "steal" a banner. Records will be kept for selecting the club that, during the year, has had the most "banner stealing" dancers involved in this activity. A plaque will be awarded to the winning club. The CFA Area Directors, along with the Area Vice-Presidents, are coordinating the retrieval of CFA banners.

On July 30th, at the CFA sponsored dance in Leesburg, six clubs had at least one square and claimed banners. They are the PIRATES, HAPPY HOEDOWNERS, STARLIGHT PROMENADERS, DIXIE SQUARES, SUNDANCERS and FELLOWSHIP SQUARES (descending order - most squares to fewest squares attending).

Eight clubs claimed banners at the October 29th dance in Longwood -- the STARLIGHT PROMENADERS, SUNDANCERS, DIXIE SQUARES, PIRATES, ORLANDO SINGLES, HONEYBEES, FELLOWSHIP SQUARES, and SPACE TRACKERS.

The next CFA dance is January 14, 1989, at the Central Florida Fairgrounds. Bring some "squares" and take a banner back to your club! It promises to be a great dance!!!!



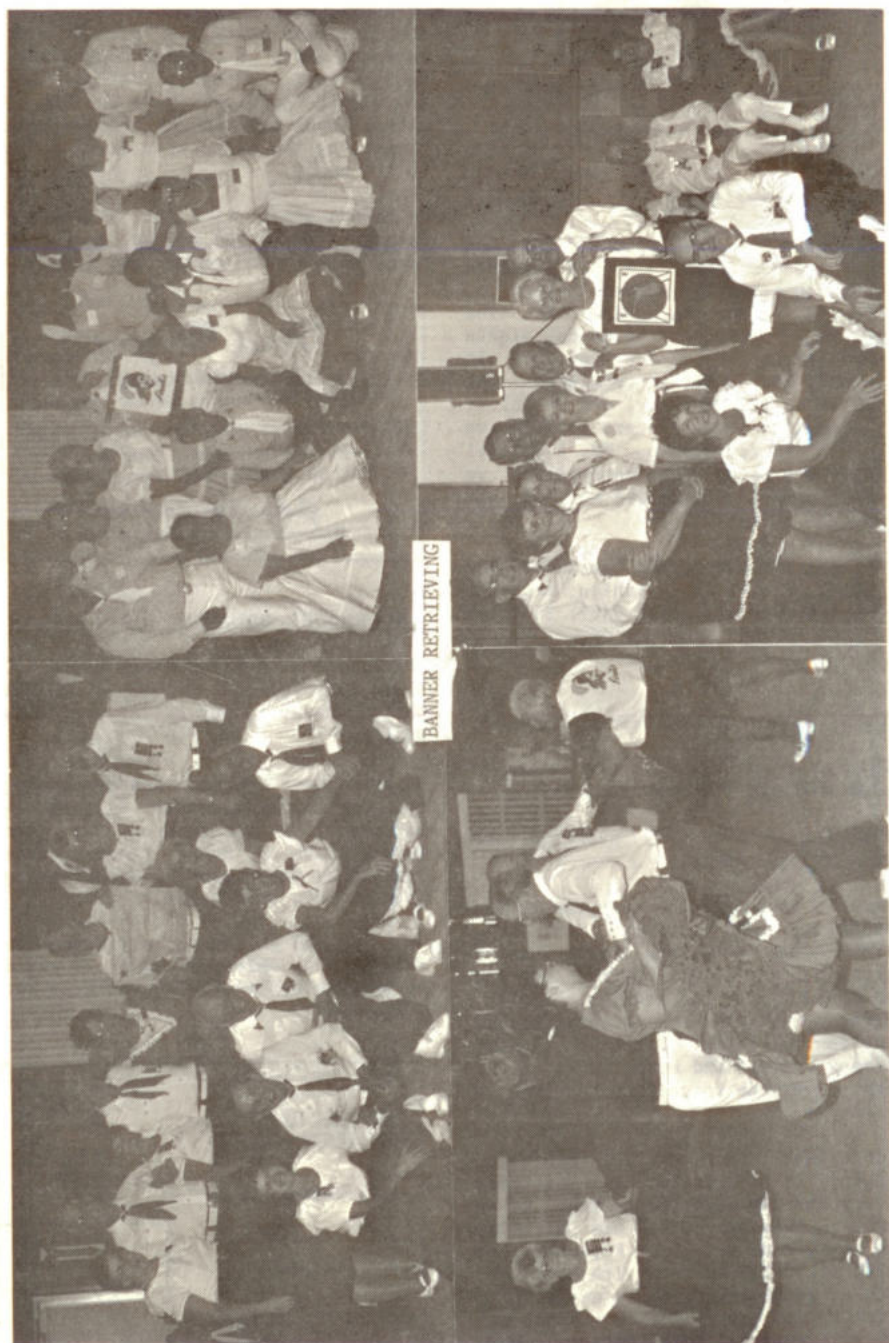

Thank you dancers and an especially big thank you and yellow rock to the Lions who donated the hall and to Roger Snidow who donated the handsome wood items and the merchants who donated other items for auction. How about patronizing these business when you are shopping in the Deland area.

BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH



BILL and BETTY BEATTIE

Did you recognize the "bum" that dropped his pants on stage at Bob Carr Auditorium during the State Convention in May? If you missed that skit, you missed the laugh of a lifetime as Bill Beattie and his "Lady of the Night" friend negotiated for the right price. Bill, who is always ready to clown around and tell a good joke, also has a serious side, and he has Betty, his partner for life who is always by his side, either supporting him from the wings or joining him center front. It is our privilege to do the first biographical sketch for Keepin' Posted on Bill and Betty Beattie, Round Dance Cuers from Deland.

Bill grew up near Camden, New Jersey and was probably the envy of most of his classmates and friends. Through his love of horses, he

attained the dream of most every youth, performing in the circus, traveling in rodeos and in road shows, bull-dogging and riding broncos, trick riding, jumping his horse through hoops of fire and even performing in shows with Roy Rogers and Tom Mix. Some of the entertainment he participated in during the road shows were "Indian Raids" and a "Quadrille" (square dancing on horseback as the horses maneuver the "calls"). After the acts were completed, all of the participants joined in a square dance. This was Bill's first exposure to square dancing. If you have the opportunity, ask Betty to show you some photos of Bill during that era. She will display them proudly.

Although Bill and Betty had attended the same school, they did not actually meet until later on. Bill was a locomotive fireman on the railroad and Betty worked in a book bindery. They met at a bowling alley, and having been smitten by her charm, he called her for an ice cream date the next day and thus their life together began.

They married during World War II just before Bill was shipped overseas. He served in the Army Coast Artillery Battalion as an anti-aircraft operator, Sergeant Master Gunner. He saw action in Africa, Malta, Sicily and Italy. He received the Purple Heart when he was wounded during the Battle of Anzio. Upon healing (at home) he returned to the battlefields of France and Germany and served until the end of the war.

After the war he returned home and to the world of horses again. In 1950, he started as an exercise "boy" at a racetrack. He and Betty travelled the racetrack circuit for years with Pennsylvania as home base. Bill worked his way up to trainer and Betty managed their growing family, now expanded to 4 children, 3 girls and 1 boy. If you are aware of what travelling the race circuit means, then you know that Bill and Betty had to move their family many times during a school season. It could be very difficult on growing youngsters to have to make new friends over and over again. However, this was not the case. In the racing business your friends moved with you. Everyone travelling the same circuit packed up their trailers and families and moved on to the next town together. So although Bill and Betty's children attended several schools a year, they always had a nucleus of good friends. What a marvelous and colorful experience for them all.

The Miami area was on the racing circuit also, so yearly they enjoyed the warmth and sunshine of Florida. In 1962, Bill and Betty decided that the warmer climate was healthier for their handicapped son so they chose to remain

and made Florida their home. At that time, their neighbor got them involved in taking Square Dance lessons. Jay Fennimore was the caller and he also taught them round dancing. They were serious "students", writing down the cues and instructions and practicing. They progressed so rapidly that the instructor used them as a "demo" couple and then their friends also started asking them for instructions.

Bill never attended a formal cuer or caller school, he became well qualified through reading, listening and performing. In 1963, Bill and Betty became associated with a new caller in the area and they formed a partnership. They purchased a warehouse and turned it into a square dance hall. However, that partnership did not last very long and Bill and Betty continued on their own.

They rented their hall, The Round-up, almost every hour of every day in order to meet expenses. They rented it to rock bands, exercise classes, church groups, weddings and other social functions, and of course square and round dancing. They even developed a catering business which evolved from the hall rentals. In the meantime, Bill's reputation as a caller and cuer grew and soon they had several clubs in south Florida and were on the staffs of Fontana Village and Rainbow Lake Lodge in North Carolina. In addition they provided entertainment and Western Shows at area night clubs, and formed a record company, Studio B, for their recordings. Perhaps you have danced to Bill's recordings, the Third Man Theme and Room Full of Roses.

In 1968, Bill joined the Agricultural Department of the State of Florida. As Inspector of Race Horses he travelled all over the state and became familiar with the central Florida area. When in Deland he would dance with Chuck Durant who was then calling for the Honeybees. Chuck always enjoyed introducing him because he used Bill's recordings for his "rounds" segments. Bill took a great liking to the Deland-Four Townes area and convinced Betty that this is where home should be. Betty, reluctantly at first, agreed with the idea, however it meant disposing of their home and square dance hall in south Florida.

In 1977 Bill moved to the area first, and during the time he was waiting for Betty to move, Bill and Helen Stripp convinced him to teach Round Dancing at the Starlight Promenaders in DeBary. But he needed a partner in order to teach the rounds, so his good friend Phil Van Ness offered his wife, Terry. Bill taught her enough ahead of time so that she could demonstrate the steps with him as he taught the class. This continued until Betty moved also.

Bill continued his position with the State. However, since his days off were in the middle of the week, he continued to call for some of his clubs in south Florida. For two years he and Betty travelled to Fort Lauderdale to call on Tuesday nights, then on to Jensen Beach to call on Wednesday afternoon and back to DeBary to cue for the Starlight Promenaders. A busy, busy schedule.

Since that time Bill's reputation as an outstanding entertainer and cuer has continued to grow. He and Betty have three round dancing clubs; The Starsteppers on Friday at City Island (originally located in Bunnell), the Key Club and class in DeBary on Monday, and a Saturday night club and class at the Granada Civic Center in Ormond Beach. In addition Bill cues the rounds for the Granada Squares and the Starlight Promenaders and until recently the Dixie Squares. They frequently even hold workshop sessions at their home to help some dancers smooth out a few "bumps". To the delight of many, they have served on the staff at Copecrest for 12 years -- almost always playing to a "full house".

Bill has been a member of the Florida Callers Association for 20 years and a member of the Round Dance Council for 15. He served as Round Dance Chairman for the 1974 State Convention and Round Dance Coordinator for the 1972 and 1976 Conventions and was on the discussion panel at the 1987 Convention. Of course, we all remember his recent service as Master of Ceremonies and "actor"

at Bob Carr Auditorium for the 1988 Convention. In addition Bill and Betty have sponsored and hosted Legacy meetings in their home.

You have to be dedicated and special people in order to be involved in that many activities and manage a full time job, home and family. Well -- Bill and Betty are special people. Now that Bill has recently retired from his State job, their life may not be quite so hectic but we expect it will certainly be as fulfilling.

As Bill has promoted friendship and interest in dancing wherever he is, he will easily attain that which he would like to be remembered for: "I created more entertainment than problems".

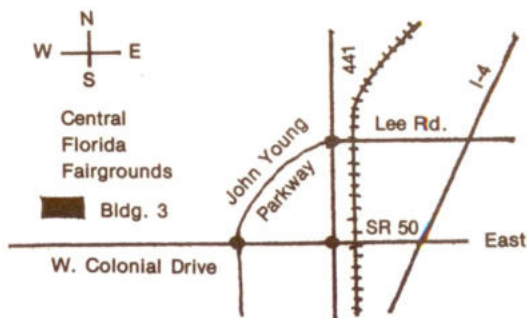

CENTRAL FLORIDA ASSOCIATION GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETING
October 29, 1988

SUMMARY OF THE MINUTES

TREASURY - The balance in the treasury has been steadily decreasing as CFA activities have not been self-supporting. Balance on hand is 2036.40.

AREA REPORTS - Area Directors reported that all CFA banners have been retrieved with the exception of that held by the ORLANDO SINGLES and, that Roger and Elsie Chapin will help Betty and Jack Davis with Orange County visitations of clubs.

USDA INSURANCE - The 1989 USDA insurance program will increase by five cents per individual and a \$30 minimum per club will be required. CFA has the highest enrollment than any of the other Florida Associations.

KEEPIN' POSTED - The editors made a plea for more input from the Clubs in order to make KEEPIN' POSTED more interesting. Club news and information is slow in coming.

CAMPING WEEKEND - The Camping Weekend was a tremendous success with 73 people attending and participating in games, dancing, food, fun, and friendship.

CFA MEMBERSHIP DANCES - It was voted that CFA Membership dances, in conjunction with Club dances, be reinstated.

TAX EXEMPT STATUS - A committee was formed to work on gaining Tax Exempt Status for the Central Florida Association.

HONORARY MEMBERS - Three couples, due to their outstanding contributions to Square Dancing and the CFA in particular, were voted to Honorary Membership status. Those honored are: Roland and Marcy Hamel, Leo and Mary Richardson and Howard and Vivian Wilson.

BADGE COST - The cost of CFA badges to new members was increased from \$3.00 to \$3.50 each since that is the cost to the club. (effective 12/1/88)

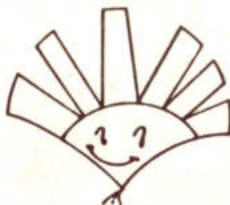
FLORIDA STATE CONVENTION - The income from the '88 State Convention was approximately \$18,300. The CFA, the Round Dance Council of Florida, the Florida Callers Association and the Florida Federation of Square Dancers are each entitled to one fourth share. It was voted to deposit the CFA share (plus an additional amount from the treasury to bring the sum to \$5000) into a special account earmarked for a Land Purchase and Building fund.

NEXT DANCE - The next CFA Dance will be Jan 14, 1989, at the Central Florida Fairgrounds, Building #3.

NEXT MEETING - The next General Membership meeting will be held on April 29, 1989, at 4:30 pm, at the DeBary firehouse. There will also be the election of officers, followed by a potluck dinner.

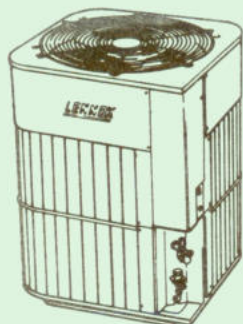

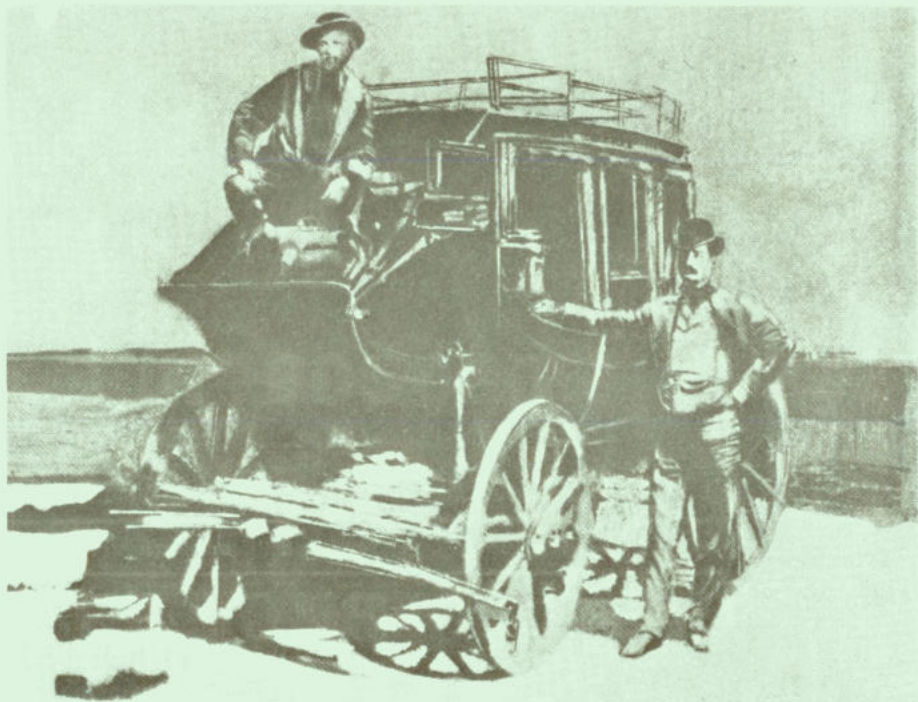
