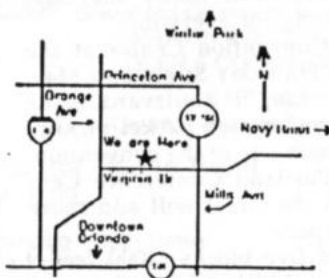

Eighteen Dance Halls Set for 43rd National in June



PORTLAND OREGON is fortunate to have all convention facilities within easy walking distance of each other. When the 43rd National Square Dance Convention opens in the Oregon Convention Center on June 22 there will be 18 dance halls and many meeting rooms handy for everyone.

The Convention Center at the corner of Holladay Street and Martin Luther King Jr. Boulevard, is the spot for registration packet pickup, and the main site of the convention.

The Portland Conference Center across the street will add more dancing space.

About five blocks (2000 feet—we measured it) to the northwest is the Portland Coliseum with theatre seating for the fashion show and similar events, and lots of dancing space.

This is the home of the Portland Trailblazers basketball team.

Five blocks east



of the Convention Center is the Red Lion Hotel/Lloyd Center, official headquarters of the 43rd National Convention.

It's an eight-minute walk from the Oregon Convention Center, or you can hop aboard the MAX light rail which runs along Holladay Street. There will be free shuttle bus service looping back and forth between these locations.

This route is a separate service from the hotel-motel shuttles.

The Lloyd Center Mall Ice Pavilion (without the ice, of course) is across the street north of the Red Lion.

There will be a full dance program there Thursday through Saturday from 10 a.m. until 10 p.m. Lloyd Center Mall has more than 150 specialty shops, several large department stores, and a "Food Court" with various cuisines offered.

Portland has it all for visiting dancers and all within a few blocks! Come and dance with us at these fine facilities: Portland dancers look forward to rolling out the red carpet for you!

Rules for Banner Raid Certificates

The Central Florida Association is continuing the Banner Raid Certificates this year, so the following is being reprinted to refresh your memory on the rules governing Banner Raid Certificates:

1. A Banner Raid Certificate may be awarded to a full square or more displaying club badges of the club they are representing and by paying guest admission.
2. A club should (not mandatory) give only the first full square to sign in a banner AND certificate. All other clubs with a full square or more will receive a certificate only.
3. Banner Raid Certificates should not be given to clubs whose club dances on the same night as the raid.
4. A club cannot receive more than one certificate from the same club within 45 days.
5. Clubs located within 15 miles of each other cannot receive more than one certificate within 90 days.
6. The Certificate/Banner Raid party should dance for at least three full tips to be eligible for a certificate.
7. As courtesy, a club should notify the raiding club in advance of its intentions to raid.

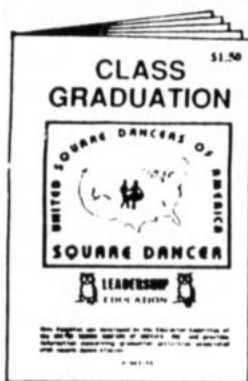

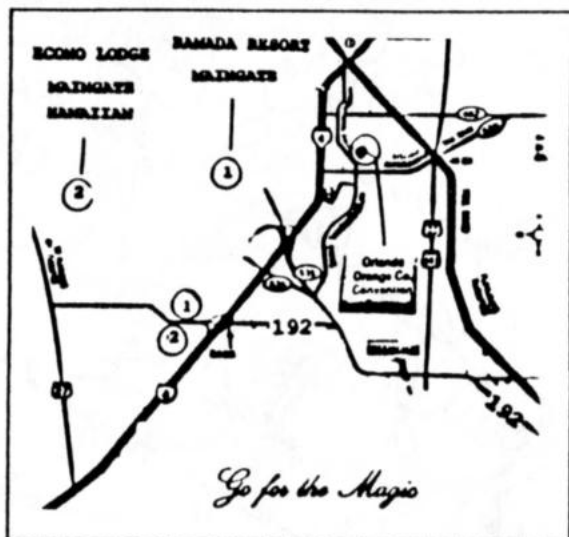

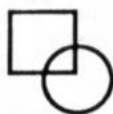
