4 Nights in Orlando Top Prize Offered

The Ways and Means people for the 46th National Square Dance Convention have announced a top prize of four nights in Orlando, \$100 cash and two Disney passes in a new fund-raiser. The winner will be drawn March 9, 1996 and the prize must be used June 25-28, 1997.

In addition, second prize winners will receive four nights in Orlando, \$50 in cash and two passes to Universal Studios.

The announcement by Worley and Nan Carrier, general chairmen for the convention, also includes prizes up to \$100 in cash for the individual, couple or club selling the most tickets for the drawing. Second, third and fourth places in the sales competition will receive \$50, \$25 and \$25, respectively.

"You do not have to be a square dancer to sell tickets or to win. Tickets can be sold to anyone," Carrier told *Keepin' Posted*.

"Magic Board members will not be eligible to win, but will be eligible for the sales competition.

10 Things that Make a Good Square Dance Club President

The responsibilities of a club president are enumerated in a recent release from United Square Dancers of America.

1. The President presides over all meetings of the club and its board of directors—

Serves as Master of Ceremonies at club meetings, dances or functions.

Assures the preparation and distribution of an agenda in advance of all meetings.

2. The President conducts the business of the club—

In accordance with the current club constitution, by-laws and policies.

Signs all correspondence in the name of the club.

Promotes accepted square dance practices within the club.

Develops and promotes plans and policies to ensure the well-being of the membership.

Confirms by correspondence:

- Rental arrangements for the dance hall for regular dances and meetings.

- Rental arrangements for facilities for dance classes.

- Contracts with club caller or special dance callers.

- Notifies appropriate organizations or publications of change of officers.

Formulates and maintains a club calendar.

Implements telephone committee activity for emphasis of events, program changes and emergencies.

3. The president appoints or re-appoints committee chairmen and assigns such duties as necessary to further the aims and activities of the club.

4. The president insures members of the board of directors are completely briefed and involved in absolutely everything the club is doing.

5. The president promotes and supports special interest activities of the club to maintain membership in-

terest, involvement and retention:

- Visitations to other clubs.
- Theme dances (hobo, Valentine)

(tine)

- Badge activities
- Charity events
- Exhibitions
- Area/State Festivals
- Leadership classes
- Parties

6. The president should support area and state square dance organizations, festivals, activities and conventions.

7. The president should participate in all club functions:

- Insure that dance facilities are opened at least 30 minutes prior to start of function.

- Insure facilities are ready for the function (utilities, chairs, tables, banner, bulletin board, literature, handouts, etc.) at least 15 minutes prior to starting time.

- Assist in welcoming members and guests as they arrive.

- Plan for and make announcements as required to pass on club information and related square dance events, introduce guests, and visiting dancers, recognize area/state officers, recognize the performance and special achievements of the caller, staff, club members and other individuals as appropriate.

- Insure facilities are secured (cleaned up and locked) at the end of the function.

8. Set an example for other officers and club members to follow, including dress, badge, promptness, enthusiasm, knowledge of square dance community activities, etc.

9. Supervise activities of other club officers to insure they are performing their duties and responsibilities in the best interest of the club.

10. Insure that a club newsletter is prepared and distributed to all members periodically.

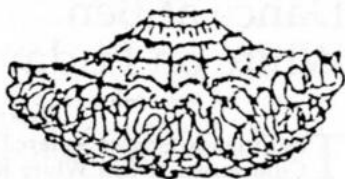

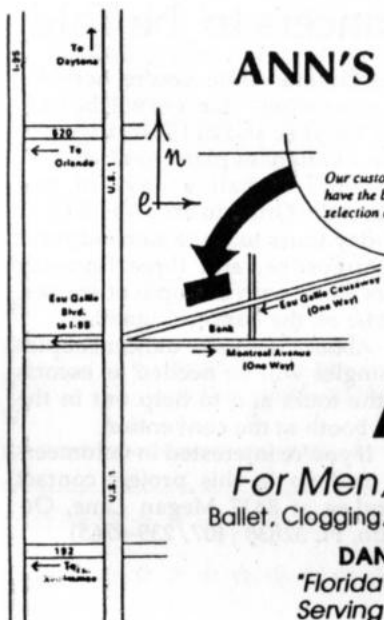

Central Florida Square and Round Dancers Association Board Meeting, October 15, 1994

Summary of the Minutes

Treasurer's Report was read and filed for audit.

Area Reports. All area directors report that the clubs are busy holding special theme dances and raiding and retrieving banners. The clubs on the coast are also reporting large beginner classes. The Dixie Squares and Wagon Wheel clubs celebrated anniversaries this fall. The Hollywood Squares will hold a benefit dance for CITA (mission for the homeless) and also the Canaveral Squares will hold a Toys for Tots dance in December. The Fellowship Squares will be entering a float again in the Christmas Parade. Many clubs will be holding New Year's Eve parties and Whirl & Twirl's Grand Opening will be Jan. 15, 1995.

Blood Bank. 152 units are available as 10 were donated from July through September.

Insurance. One club has been added since the July meeting. Insurance information will go out to all clubs explaining that when they dance at a Mall they must have the Mall insurance representative type on their letterhead the exact wording for the Certificate of Insurance. It must contain correct information, e.g., all i's dotted and t's crossed, proper titles, no abbreviations, no omission of "The" from the title. It will not be sent on if not 100 percent correct. The cost for coverage has increased by .10 to \$2.20 per person.
