The "Hall of Fame" plaque was presented to Jack and Zonie Taylor of Cocoa at the Florida State Convention in Lakeland over Memorial

Day Weekend. This plaque will hang on the "Hall of Fame Wall" at Strawberry Squares Dance Hall in Plant City.

Having danced since the late '60's and involved in Florida since 1982, they have been members and officers of several Brevard County Clubs and a member of CFA holding various offices from time to time. No job is too big or too small for this couple. The Taylor's have been President, Directors and now Area Director of the CFA, went through the chairs to become President of the Florida Federation, USDA Chairman of American Folk Dance, and took on the big job of Historian for the Federation, keeping the history with pictures and clippings. Just a few things this couple is involved with.

The Taylor's have attended 20 National Square and Round Dance Conventions and have conducted seminars for USDA at several. In addition to squares, they are active in round dancing, Contra and also do some Scottish Dancing – so who knows what activity they next will add to their repertoire.

Board of Directors Meeting – February 28, 2001
SUMMARY OF MINUTES



The meeting of the Central Florida Square & Round Dancers Association was called to order at 2:05 p.m. at the IHOP restaurant in Orlando by President, Jim & Jan McConnaha

AREA REPORTS - Full reports are on file. Highlights follow:

Area Vice President - Ron & Lois Renwick reported that they printed and distributed 1000 5th Saturday dance flyers to all Area Directors. There are 10 Areas with 40 Clubs and only 20 CFA Club Information sheets.

North Brevard - Asa Clark & Rosalie Turner reported three Clubs have classes. Alamanders has a Banner raid scheduled every night that they dance now through Summer.

South Brevard - Jack & Zonie Taylor were absent due to illness, however, they called to report they had visited all clubs in their area except two.

East Lake - Vernon Cannaday reported someone had fallen at one of the Clubs but no report had been filed. Carol Poole reminded him that even if the injured party is not making a claim against our insurance, an accident claim needs to be filed by the Club within 24 hours.

West Lake and Sumter - Dan & Anna Foust reported on five local clubs. A new Club, Royal Highlands, dances Mainstream once a month. Dan & Anna had a membership drive at the Orange Blossom Squares in January.

East Orange/Seminole - Dick & Nany King reported that they had visited six local clubs. Whirl & Twirl will graduate between 7 and 8 couples. They have approximately 100 couples in their Club.

West Orange - Arnold & Marie Rabenberg reported that Garden Patch has a lot of special events planned. The Pirates dance twice a month on Saturdays and have an A-2 dance on Tuesdays. Sunni's Rounders are moving to Sunday.

Osceola - Steve & Diana Kehr reported on two established Clubs and also on a new Caller in the area, Mike Gormley from Ohio. He is calling at Secret Lake Resorts on W192 in Kissimmee. They dance the fourth Monday each month.

East Volusia - Kenly & Alice Spilman sent their report on five Clubs. Flagler Ocean Waves have their biggest class ever. Swinging 8's have a new caller, Gene McCullough. Yellow Rock Squares had a benefit dance March 17.

West Volusia - Gale & Laura Boak gave a report that the Honeybees are very active in their Banner Raid/Retrieval activities. Both clubs in their area have classes in progress.

MEMBERSHIP REPORT: Don & Sharon Smith reported as of February 18, there are 332 CFA members - 77 new and 255 renewals. We have 49 members who have not renewed. We had 297 members last year. Service Bars for 5, 10, 15, 20 years are available for \$1.00 per bar.

BLOOD BANK REPORT: Will & Carol Barnhart reported the 2001 year started with 442 units, have added 6 units and used 2 units leaving a balance of 446 units.

INSURANCE: Randy & Carol Poole reported they have 27 Clubs insured with a total of 1503 members enrolled. Carol explained how they were handling the refunds for Insured Members whose premiums were paid by two or more Clubs. Also, explained the importance of filling out and filing an accident form, whether there is a claim or not..

KEEPIN' POSTED: Tom & Eivor Brown reported that there were 400 copies of the 44 page booklet. They've had inquiries about running advertisements.

50th FLORIDA STATE CONVENTION REPORT: Bruce & Colleen Morgan reported there are a lot of Chair positions open for the 2004 State Convention. A Committee report showing all of the Chairman needed and those who have already volunteer was distributed. There are three fund-raises planned. Two of them will be held at the Shamrock Swing, a sale of hot dogs, sodas and potato chips and a silent auction. A camping weekend fund-raise is being planned for October 12 & 13. The Convention outfit will be shown for the first time that weekend.

HISTORIAN: Judy Frye asked for pictures of meetings and gatherings as we plan for the upcoming State Convention as well as pictures taken during the planning stages or pictures taken at the Mardi Gras Time in '99 for the scrapbooks. On the back of each picture be sure to write who, what, when, why, and where.

FLORIDA FEDERATION: George & Shirley Knapp reported there has not been a Federation meeting since our last meeting. The next meeting will be the Florida Federation working weekend, in Lakeland on February 24 and 25.

OLD BUSINESS:

2001 Shamrock Swing Progress Report: The Shamrock Swing Executive Committee met at noon today. The program books are being completed. It seems there will be a profit from the program book. There will be a concession stand in the hail for anyone wanting lunch. At the Saturday morning seminar there will be coffee and donuts available. We have added day ticket prices.

Shamrock Swing for 2002: The Chairman for next years Shamrock Swing will be George & Shirley Knapp. Held at St. John Vianney Catholic Church on Orange Blossom Trail South of Oakridge. It has two big halls, concession stand and lots of hotels in the area. Tony Oxendine and Whit Brown will be the callers with Jimmy & Carol Griffin cueing.

5th Saturday Dance: The next 5th Saturday dance will be held on March 31st in Clermont. The host club will be the Groveland/Clermont Squares. They will have the hail opened up, cooled down and their Club could bring finger foods. The dance is being held in the Hearth Building in a gated community. Whit Brown will be the Caller and Cuer, Jeannette Chauvin.

Free Dance Coupons: Clubs need to send graduate's names to Tom & Eivor Brown, Editors of the Keepin' Posted. Ron Renwick will have the coupons available to give the Area Representatives. Jim explained the procedure for distributing them.

By-Laws Committee: Duke & Doris McCleskey and Jack & Zonie Taylor worked on the By-Laws when they were together at Branson. MO.

Club Information Sheets: These forms need to be filled out for each club and returned to Ron Renwick, who will make copies and then forward them on to Don Smith, Membership, and to Jim McConnaha, President. Please make sure these forms are filled out completely including zip codes. Please remember this form needs to be updated when the Officers change in a Club. Don Smith feels it is very important to get a Club Representative to CFA.

Camping Weekend: Carol Poole reported that they visited the River Forest Campground in DeLand. Discussed was how many rigs would fit in the camping area. Plans are still being finalized for the meals and the setup.

NEW BUSINESS

General Meeting Next Year: The By-Laws Committee is addressing adding a second General Membership Meeting during the 2nd quarter of the year.

Couple of the Year: Couple of the Year must be submitted to Jim & Jan as soon as possible so that it can be presented to the Couple during the biggest CFA dance of the year, the Shamrock Swing.

South Brevard - Jack Taylor thanked everyone for their support during his illness. He is planning on visiting the last two Clubs in his area before State Convention.

East Lake - No report.

West Lake and Sumter - Dan Foust reported on 6 Clubs. Salt & Pepper Shakers have no dances scheduled, Dancing Shadows last dance was April 24 - will start again in October, Royal Highlands are not dancing July or August, Sunshine Promenaders are not dancing as of May 4 - will start again 9/14. New callers for Sunshine Promenaders are Ron Libby and Paul Place - they will alternate Friday nights starting in September.

East Orange/Seminole - Dick & Nany King's report on 6 Clubs in their area was read by Ron Renwick. Whirl & Twirl will celebrate their 39th anniversary on June 1.

West Orange - Marie Rabenberg reported on the 4 Clubs in their area.

Osceola - Steve Kehr reported on 2 Clubs in his area.

East Volusia - No report.

West Volusia - Gale and Laura Boak did not report. Carol Poole reported the Starlight Promenaders and the Honeybees have small classes that graduate in May. MEMBERSHIP REPORT

50th FLORIDA STATE CONVENTION REPORT

Bruce & Colleen Morgan reported there were 2 fund-raises held during the Shamrock Swing; a concession stand at the dance and a silent auction. There is an on-going fund-raise of Golf Shirts with the 50th State Convention logo on sale for \$25.00 available in Men & Women's styles. This shirt can only be worn in the Central Association area.

A camping weekend fund-raise is being planned for October 12 & 13. The Convention outfit will be shown for the first time this weekend. The Caller Chairman, Skip & Jennifer Cleland, will be our caller for Saturday evening dance.

OTHER

George & Shirley Knapp reported that the Federation held its annual working weekend meeting February 24 and 25 in Lakeland. The Florida Federation has added a new delegate-at-large position, Tom and Ethel Smith, Presidents of the Florida Campers Association, have agreed to be managers of the Square Dance Hall of Fame located in Strawberry Squares Mobile Home Park, Plant City.

The meeting was called to order at 9:00 AM.

New delegates were recognized: John & Mary Burzo, Jack & Phyllis Herpy, (NE Assoc); Jerry & Sandra Williamson (NW Assoc.), Bill & Juanita Stroppe, Marice Reynolds and Rose Porter, Fred & Jan Smith (WC Assoc); Don & Sharon Smith (Cen Assoc.), and Bob & Carol Hutcheson (SE Assoc). A special guest was introduced; one who has not been with us in a long time, Bob & Ann Poyner, President of the Florida Caller's Association. We were delighted to have Bob & Ann with us.

SECRETARY'S REPORT: Minutes of the previous meeting were accepted as written. Motion to accept by Don Slocum, seconded by Fred Chatos.

TREASURER'S REPORT: George Knapp gave the Treasurer's Report for October 1, 2000 through January 31, 2001, showing receipts of \$629.56 and disbursements of \$1,017.87. The balance in all accounts as of January 31, 2001 is: First Union Checking \$3,335.75; Contingency \$4,000.00; First Union Certificate of Deposit \$3,48.62; and Insurance Account \$1,488.36, for a total of \$11,872.63. Report was filed for audit.

CORRESPONDENCE: The president stated he had received word of the passing of Ron VanValkenburg. He was a past president of the Federation and

instrumental in the formation of the West Coast Association. Ron's wife, MaryLee said she'd prefer a donation to the West Coast Association in Ron's name. We did. Word has been received that Frank Trott of the SE Association has been operated on several times for a malignant brain tumor. Also, Murl Herbert is having bypass surgery Monday morning. A prayer was offered for each of them.

Our USDA representative is not going to Anaheim. We need a replacement. The president asked anyone going to the California convention who can attend this meeting to please let him know as soon as possible.

a. During the Northwest Association's report, Shirley Cornett urged all state publications to contact Shirley and Tom Constable who are in charge of the NW traveling group. The Constables want to get on the distribution list for all publications. They need to know when and where special dances will be held in your areas so they can attend and promote the 2002 State Convention.

b. After Fred Chatos gave the Southeast 2001 State Convention Report, Bob Poyner, President of the Florida Caller's Association, stated that there is a major problem with callers not paying their dues. Those callers who have not paid their dues by March 1 will be removed from the Convention program. All areas have some callers who have not paid. (Except for the Northwest.) Bob asked us all to go back to our caller's associations and say to them that there are callers in danger of being dropped from the State Convention program if they have not paid their dues by March 1.

c. When Bruce Morgan completed Central's 2004 State Convention Report, Bob Poyner urged everyone to attend the State Conventions. When folks say to you that we need to get national callers on our State Convention programs, you reply that we have some of the best callers in the country here. Please ask your clubs to close down for the weekend to help support this wonderful activity we have.

OLD BUSINESS:

Official Documents Committee Reports. Everyone should have a copy of these documents. Murl Herbert is the primary author of all the changes and he is not present, nor is Cliff Allen. Starting with the By-laws they are basically the same as before. However, all changes did not get in. The president requested we accept these as written and any changes be made at the next meeting. *Jim McConnaha made a motion to accept the by-laws as written. Randy Poole seconded the motion. Motion passed.*

Regarding the Constitution: *Stan Hockman made the motion to accept the Constitution as written. Maurice Ritter seconded. Motion passed.*

Articles of Incorporation: Jack Hoffman made the motion to accept the Articles of Incorporation. Ray Huddleston seconded. Motion passed.

Standing Rules: Nan Habersberger made the motion to accept the Standing Rules. Stan Hockman seconded. Motion passed.

Committee assignments were made at this time. Meeting adjourned at 11:40.

If you haven't been to a Relay For Life, you don't know what you are missing. On Friday, April 6th, more than 80 teams set up camp at the Cocoa Beach High School track and got ready to Relay! The event began with a Survivor's Celebration which included many square dancers from clubs in the county: Connie Andrus, George Darby, Harry Meeker, Laverne Miller, Art Were, Ace and Ann Taylor, Dave and Kay Benne; Bob and Terry Danza to name just a few. Each survivor received a T-shirt, a medallion, and a

care giver pin. They also were treated to a dinner donated by several area restaurants.

At 9:00 P.M. there was a Luminaria Ceremony. The Patrick AFB Chapel Choir sang "Amazing Grace," "You'll Never Walk Alone," and "How Great Thou Art." as the luminarias were lighted around the track. There was not a dry eye on the field. The luminaria are votive candle in a small paper bag. The word "HOPE" was spelled across the bleachers and as the evening darkened, the bags grew more visible. Donations were made in either "Memory" or "Honor" of a cancer victim. Their names were on the bags surrounding the quarter mile track.

The infield held team enterprises selling their own merchandise or services to "sweeten the coffers" of the American Cancer Society. The "Relay" was about to begin - the survivors led the first lap around the track. The relay teams continued through the night. Each team had a member walking all-night. As the evening passed to night; Skip Cleland came out and called for us Square Dancers from 11:00 P.M. to Midnight as part of the entertainment. Square Angels team members joined us and other square dancers around the County for several tips: Judy Frye, Asa Clark, Rosalie Turner, Richard Douget, Fay & Richard Binschus, Fiona Wright, Ed & Laverne Miller, Don & Elaine Paul; Tom & Eivor Brown; and, Ailene Picheco. Our team members walked through the night. At 10:00 the next morning; the festivities ground to a halt - remaining survivor and team members walked one final "Victory Lap".

The Central/South Brevard County Relay For Life recognized 223 Survivors, sold 960 luminarias and raised over \$175,000.00 for Research, Advocacy, Patient Services, Prevention, Detection and

Treatment. This amount was more than some of the larger cities in Florida. As an added note; our square dance team raised \$ 2,000.00.

Plans are being made for next year. Plan to join the Fun in 2002! In fact, rumor has it there will be three locations next year; one in the North - Titusville; one in the center - Cocoa/Cocoa Beach; and one in the South - Palm Bay. Wouldn't it be great to have a square dance team in each location. Look for more information later.

Let me take this opportunity to give a personal thanks to each and every person who helped or contributed to the Benefit Dance in February and with the Relay in April.

Apricot Cheese Spread

8 oz package of cream cheese	12 apricots, chopped
2 T apricot preserves	1 t vanilla
1 T sugar	

Mix all together and refrigerate. Serve with crackers of your choice.

"You asked for a recipe or two. Well, I just came across a couple - and these were found in the Twirl & Twinkle magazine, the Thompson Valley Square Dance News, published in Kamloops, British Columbia, Canada. Yes, I spelled that right - I double proofed it. Rita McLoud is the editor and she wrote me asking for an article I used several years ago (how in the world she found me and the article I don't know) but I found it for her and then she sent me her magazine - so I could see it in print in Canada. So, here are the recipes. Enjoy."

Oatmeal Maple Drop Cookies

1/4 C Margarine/Butter	1/2 tsp salt
1 C Maple Syrup	2 tsp baking powder
1 egg	1/2 C milk
1 tsp vanilla	1 1/2 C rolled oats
1 1/2 C flour	1 C raisins

Cream together in a large bowl, 1/4 cup margarine 1 cup maple syrup Add 1 beaten egg

Blend ingredients in the order listed. 1 tsp vanilla 1 1/2 cups flour 1/2 tsp salt 2 tsp baking powder 1/2 cup milk 1 1/2 cups rolled oats 1 cup raisins

Mix well: the batter will be stiff. Drop by tablespoonful onto greased cookie sheets. Bake in a preheated 375 degree oven for 12 to 15 minutes. T

This recipe is from Louis & Isabelle Swododa of the Kamloops Square Dancers.

RICE AND FRUIT SALAD

Betty Lee

3/4 C. Instant rice	1/4 tsp ground ginger
1/4 C orange juice	1 C maple syrup
1/2 tsp garlic	1 tsp lemon juice
1/2 C slivered toasted almonds	1/2 C raisins
1/4 C chopped dried fruit	1/4 C thinly slice celery

Pour 3/4 cup boiling water over 3/4 cup instant rice. Cover tightly and let stand until water is absorbed.

Combine 1/4 cup orange juice, 1/2 tsp garlic, 1/4 tsp ground ginger, 1 cup maple syrup, and 1 tsp lemon juice. Heat.

Combine rice, 1/2 cup slivered and toasted almonds, 1/2 cup raisins, 1/4 cup thinly sliced celery, 1/4 cup chopped dried fruit (can be coconut, papaya, apricots, dates) in a large bowl.

Pour the dressing over the rice mixture and toss to coat. Refrigerate and serve cold.

AT THE 51ST NATIONAL SQUARE DANCE CONVENTION

We have over 30 hotels and motels under contract for the 51st National Square Dance Convention representing about 2600 rooms. All six of the downtown Saint Paul hotels are under contract in order to provide you with more affordable prices. Four of the hotels are within walking distance to RiverCentre, and there will be a trolley circulating around downtown Saint Paul that will serve the other two hotels.

The Saint Paul Hotel is the designated Caller, Cuer and Dance Leader Hotel. This hotel is two blocks from RiverCentre. If you're a Caller, Cuer or Dance Leader and would like to stay at this hotel, please indicate that on your registration form.

Just east of Saint Paul, we have another group of hotels and motels. Most of these will have bus pass service available and are just a short 15-20 minute trip to RiverCentre.
