CALL TO ORDER: Presidents Jack & Barbara Hoffman called the meeting to order at 3:05 PM. Judy Frye gave the Invocation, which was followed by the Pledge of Allegiance. Presidents Jack & Barbara Hoffman welcomed everyone. There were no guests.

ROLL CALL: Ailene Picheco called roll.

SECRETARY'S REPORT: George Knapp *made a motion to accept the minutes of the January 15, 2006 Board Meeting – Judy Frye seconded.* Motion passed.

It is a shame that our own territory is one that is lacking the most. Please pass it around. We

would like all dancers to start using this site to locate a club to dance with while traveling. There is a link to a map for each site. If there isn't a link for a map, please send me the correct address for the dance hall and I'll provide a link to the map.

Brevard/Indian River – Woody & Marylou Coyle reported. **The Allemanders** had two special dances. One was their annual Luau on February 18, 2006 and that is always a very special dance. Lovely decorations that make you feel like you are in Hawaii! Food is always the best. Ace and Ann Taylor and Dave and Kaye Benne headed up the decorating committee. Good job! They enjoyed their 50th Anniversary Dance April 1! No Foolin! Forty four past presidents were there plus Cocoa Beach, Commissioner, Ken Griffen; Satellite Beach Mayor, Mark Brimer and his wife, Satellite Police Chief, Lionel Cote and wife, Florida Today Redporter Tom Breen; CFA President Jack & Barbara Hoffman; retired Allemander caller Colin & Peggy Walton; Cuer Vince & Camille Furtado; John & Gail Swindle; and Brevards local centenarian Stan & Margaret Crowhurst at 103. And a LOT of dancers! The place was hop-pin! Maxine Robb and Laverne Miller made this a very memorable occasion! Approximately 120 attended. **The Barefoot Bay Twirlers** will close the end of April for the summer. They'll start back in October. Just not enough dancers to keep the club going during the summer. **The Canaveral Squares** just had a special dance, Cinderella's Ball for their 46th Anniversary. The caller was Tim Tyl and the cuer was Phyllis Williams. Past presidents attending were Lila Slack, Cecil and Jean Faulk, Doug and Margery Douget and Bill Price. Approximately 10 squares attended. As you entered the hall, you were given a ticket, white for women and blue for men. The **Run-A Rounds** dance club are continuing with lessons on Sunday afternoon in Satellite Beach. They advertised their class under Choreographed Ballroom Dance rather than Square Dances, and started with 14 new couples. Ten couples are still with the class and one is learning square dance. This may be a way to get square dancers through the back door. The **Space Trackers** have special dances throughout the year. One in particular was special! We had a Mexican night with some of the best burritos, made and furnished by Judy Frye! Good eats! Judy needs a big pat on the back for some of the best Special Dances! Way to go Judy!

South Lake & West Orange – Vacancy. No Report.

North Lake & Sumter – Bob & Jennie Courter. Sent a report. Things are going well up here in the northern section of Central. **Sunshine Promenaders** have changed their dancing night to Wednesday. They are still in the same location. **Orange Blossom Squares** has had a fantastic winter season, averaging about 25 ½ squares for the first three months of 2006. We also had three National callers during this period. **Fountain Squares** was having a problem concerning dancers from outside their complex. They seem to have solved this and will continue to dance to Don & Loretta Hanhurst. **Recreation Plantation** will end a fine winter season of dancing on April 14th. Bob Stern has started a new advanced dance at **Dancing Shadows** with about 6 squares dancing. We attended the **Clermont Squares** last dance of the season. They had about 18 squares with Don & Loretta Hanhurst

calling & cueing. **Hampton Promenaders** returned a banner to them and Whirl & Twirl retrieved their banner from them. We hope they will be able to resolve their problems with the hall for the next season.

Marion – Vacancy. No report.

East Orange & Seminole – Ian & Sandy Ogilvie reported. **The Casselberry Hoedowners** Sunday program has been very effective at maintaining a consistent level of membership, with its structure of instruction and workshop from 1:30 to 2:30 p.m., followed by the dance until 4:30. They have been averaging 4 – 5 squares on a regular basis, and recent graduates from the teaching program are currently being taught two new plus calls per week. Visitors are made very welcome, and the club members are quick to point out that anyone who wishes to brush up on mainstream and plus calls can avail themselves of the workshop. **The Orlando Singles** continue to have light but dedicated turn-outs on Friday evenings. They “went dark” on two recent nights. The first time to show respect and give tribute to Danny Robinson and his widow Ann, when almost the entire club danced at Whirl & Twirl. And on March 10th they were closed to attend Shamrock Swing, where their own caller, Whit Brown, was featured along with Tony Oxendine.

The club reports several recent incoming raids, and have also been raiding other clubs. They feel that they have a solid core of members, and encourage any and all to visit them. Couples, singles with or without partners are invited. It is apparent, however, that numbers are down somewhat and the club itself is susceptible to periodic event cancellations when other square dance events occur in the area. **Whirl & Twirl** has had its ups and downs this past quarter. While preparations have been enthusiastically underway for the celebration of their final payment on the mortgage on their dance hall, the club members have also had to deal with the shock of the death of club caller Danny Robinson. Nevertheless, they continue to be able to depend on a strong organization and excellent participation by members. Square dance classes have continued, with the basic class on Tuesday nights being run by Whit Brown. The plus program has had to be shifted to Friday evenings immediately prior to the regular

dance, and is being looked after by guest callers on each of these dance nights, until the club finds a regular club caller. They hope to be able to finalize this process by the time the new board takes over in June. In the meantime, they expect to continue with program events such as the annual picnic at Fort Christmas at the end of April. The Whirl-a-Rounds round dance program is also working well. Lessons by Jan and Pete Shankle on Thursday evenings, with a party night/dance replacing the class on the third Thursday of the month.

BLOOD BANK: Jim & Jan McConnaha reported. One of the major benefits of belonging to the CFA is access to the Central Florida Blood Bank. This facility collects blood from donors and then as members have a need for blood, it is made available at no charge. One thing to keep in mind, you don't have to be a member of CFA to donate to account 54. Non-dancing family members and friends can give to this account if they don't have an account they give to ordinarily. However you must be a member or member's family to withdraw from the account.

CFA members have a large amount of blood on deposit as of the end of March 2006. At that time we had available 824 units. Any member who donates a pint of blood to our account, Number 54, receives free admission to one CFA dance. We have some prolific donors to our square dancer account. The clubs are pulling their weight and getting info in, but there is still room for improvement. Jack and Barbara found clubs they didn't know about that should have a voice in Keepin' Posted. HISTORIAN: Judy Frye reported. Not too much to report this meeting. Our *Shamrock Swing Books* were at the Shamrock Swing. And again, the dancers enjoyed looking at them; seeing

The American Callers' Association in its attempt to be of service to all callers, dancers, and associations provided current, timely, and effective information on new dancer recruitment, winning ways to retain club dancers, and pitfalls to drive square danc-

ers away for most of 2001- 2005. WE really appreciate the positive comments, encouragement to continue, and contributions from callers and dancers all over the country and from abroad to continue these initiatives. American Callers will continue to provide information that will help the square dance community recruit, retain and retrieve square dancers as well as encourage dancers to speak out on the cumbersome dance programs.

This month's Viewpoint discusses the thoughts of caller Ben Goldberg on the decline of square dancing. Ben believes that the decline in the number of square dancers is due to the existence of segregating programs and too many calls for the new dancers to learn, which results in new dancers leaving the activity. Another result is that "potential" new dancers decline invitations to attend a student open house, or they attend one open house and have a good time, then learn of the requirements and never return. This bombshell hits the students square in the teeth. Lessons last almost a full year! The one year commitment is too much for a potential new dancer to continue, and they drop out of the square dance lessons.

Ben further states that the formal dance programs have caused square dancing to create splinter groups, which segregate the dancers and shrink the size of dances. Ben states that he believes that the American Callers International One-Floor program may wake up the square dancing community and unite the vast majority of dancers into dancing together. He sums it up in a very interesting way by looking at how square dancing existed 30 years ago: "FEW CALLS/LOTS OF DANCERS; MANY CALLS/FEWER DANCERS AND FINALLY MANY PROGRAMS/TOO FEW DANCERS IN ANY ONE PROGRAM. TODAY THE VAST MAJORITY OF DANCERS WILL ENJOY THE INTERNATIONAL"ONE-FLOOR PROGRAM."

Ben argues that the shorter the lesson and dance program and the shorter the learning curve the sooner the new dancers are assimilated willingly into square dancing "THE MORE DANCERS, THE LARGER THE ACTIVITY. THE LARGER THE ACTIVITY, THE MORE FUN WHICH LEADS TO MORE DANCERS ALL OVER AGAIN." Ben also argues that callers

themselves and national, state, and local callers' associations must simplify and shorten the number of calls and the number of lessons

Marketing research on demographic age groups clearly show that members of the younger Baby Boomers, Generation X and Generation Y will not commit to square dance lessons much past three to four months of one night a week. In higher education, colleges and universities are learning that adult students will commit to a college degree if they are presented shorter terms than the typical 16 week classes. They prefer courses that are 7-8 weeks and are one night a week. Colleges and universities who offer accelerated courses are prospering in revenues and the number of students.

When the programs are cut and paired down to as few as three to four months of lessons, callers will have to also adapt by taking off their blinders and become more skilled and creative in their calling because the more calls the less creative are the callers' dances. This is the same in marketing theory when one looks at the differences between Market Skimming and Market Penetration. Ben continues and states that still today it is argued that the current programs are fine. Ben argues that they are about as useful and contributory to the success of square dancing as the Great Pyramids of Egypt are useful for low rent housing for the poor in Egypt.

The American Callers' Association is currently working on reducing its program to allow for more dancers to successfully complete the lessons and stay in square dancing after graduation. The American Caller's Association is willing to work with all national, state and local caller associations to develop a simplified one-floor dance program. Work Committee

Paul Marcum & Tom Davis have not completed their work committee on the "One Floor Program". Their suggested changes will be in the next newsletter. I spoke with Tom Davis a few days ago he and Paul are working to come up with changes that everyone can agree on. I think we must realize that if we expect to get people to become a part of square dancing today. We will have to offer something besides what we are trying to sell now. They don't have time for long programs.

Certified Caller/Instructor

This program was developed by Henry Israel of American Callers so that a caller that wanted to be certified could be. American Callers Association does not require its members to be certified however, certification is provided for those who meet the criteria. Many school systems require certification to teach in their system and it certainly is an important entry in your resume when trying to book caller/teacher seminars. This certification will remain in effect as long as caller/instructor is a member in good standing of American Callers. There is a one time fee of \$25.00 for certification.

We have a number of callers that have become certified and are carrying membership cards showing that they are certified. When your membership cards were mailed back to you with this years renewal we included a copy of the application for the (cci) program. Should you have questions about this program, please call the office.

Letter to the Editor

Conrad Lloyd of Utah suggested that we have this in every newsletter so that members could write and ask for answers to questions and get help with problems that they are not sure how to resolve. I know that we have members that can offer help and have experienced the same problem.

The problem we will deal with this time is one that we have all experienced at one time or the other. We have a new class member that is slow and has trouble remembering the calls from one week to the next and has a problem of being able to keep up.

We should remind the dancers that are helping with the class that someone had to help us when we started. Now, it's our time to return that help. That's why we are called ANGELS. So many times dancers will avoid slow dancers to the point that they will drop out of a class or out of square dancing. Had we the caller and the dancer been a little more concerned and tried to help we may have kept them.

Finally, we must realize that square dancing is NOT FOR EVERYONE. There are some people that just cannot learn to square dance. When we have done everything we can to help then we must say to them, "before someone else hurts your feeling please let me be the one to tell you that we do not think you will be able to complete this class." This is not a easy thing to do but, it must be done for the good of all. If you try to keep the ones that cannot learn you will loose all of the class.

NEW ON THE WEB PAGE

We are going to post each month on the web page choreography written by members of American Callers on the ONE FLOOR PROGRAM. This choreography will be FREE to anyone that wants to download it. That means any caller members or non-members FREE. Since there are no longer caller note services available that I know of this will give a caller a place to go for choreography. Caller members that do not have internet service we will mail to only if they request the notes.

The thinking behind this is that those callers that have been bad mouthing the ONE FLOOR PROGRAM and have not tried it will have a chance to see that this is what they have been calling all along and didn't know what the program was. If you would like to write a couple pages to post on the web page, it must be done with calls from the ONE FLOOR PROGRAM and emailed or hard mailed to the American Callers office. We are only going to post two pages a month. Your name will be listed on the web page with your choreography.

CAR THIEVES

WHAT WILL THEY THINK OF NEXT?

Seems that car thieves have found yet another way to steal your car or truck without any effort at all. The car thieves peer through the windshield of your car or truck, write down the VIN # from the label on the dash, find a local irresponsible car dealership and request a duplicate key based on the VIN #. (Most are too busy to ask for proof of ownership too!) My friend didn't believe this e-mail, so she called Chrysler-Dodge and pretended she had lost her keys. They told her to just bring in the VIN #, and they would cut her one on the spot, and she could order the keyless device if she wanted. The Car Dealer's Parts Department will make a duplicate key from the VIN # and collect payment from the thief who will return to your car. He doesn't have to break in, do any damage to the vehicle, or draw attention to himself. All he has to do is walk up to your car, insert the key and off he goes to a local Chop Shop with your vehicle.

You don't believe it? It IS that easy.

To prevent this from happening to you, simply cover the VIN located on the dash board. By law, you cannot remove the VIN, but you can cover it so it can't be viewed through the windshield by a car thief. Simply slip a 3 x 5 card over the VIN NUMBER.

Editors note: I checked with the local Police Department—they were not aware of any crimes so reported; nor were they aware of any dealerships handing out the keys so loosely. I also checked with a couple of dealerships and asked to have a key cut since I'd locked my keys in the car, but had the VIN. They said they could for a recent model year. This story was received over the Internet in an e-mail: Charles Plumb was a US Navy Jet pilot in Vietnam. After 75 combat missions, his plane was destroyed by a surface-to-air missile. Plumb ejected and parachuted into enemy hands. He was captured and spent 6 years in a communist Vietnamese prison. He survived the ordeal and now lectures on lessons learned from that experience!

One day, when Plumb and his wife were sitting in a restaurant, a man at another table came up and said, "You're Plumb! You flew jet fighters in Vietnam from the aircraft carrier Kitty Hawk. You were shot down! "How in the world did you know that?" asked Plumb. "I packed your parachute," the man replied. "I guess it worked!" Plumb assured him, "It sure did. If your chute hadn't worked, I wouldn't be here today"

Plumb couldn't sleep that night, thinking about that man, Plumb says, "I kept wondering what he had looked like in a Navy uniform: a white hat; a bib in the back; and bell-bottom trousers. I wonder how many times I might have seen him and not even said 'Good morning, how are you?' or anything because, you see, I was a fighter pilot and he was *just* a sailor." Plumb thought of the many hours the sailor had spent at a long wooden table in the bowels of the ship, carefully weaving the shrouds and folding the silks of each chute, holding in his hands the fate of someone he didn't know.

Now, Plumb asks his audience, "*Who's packing your parachute?*" Everyone has someone who provides what he or she needs to make it through the day. He also points out that he needed many kinds of parachutes when his plane was shot down over enemy territory - he needed his physical parachute, his mental parachute, his emotional parachute, and his spiritual parachute. He called on all these supports before reaching safety.

Sometimes in the daily challenges that life gives us, we miss what is really important. We may fail to say hello, please, or thank you, congratulate someone on something wonderful that has happened to them, give a compliment, or just do something nice for no reason. As you go through this week, this month, this year, recognize people who *pack your parachutes*.
