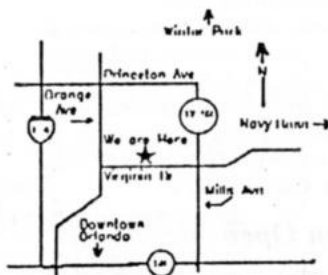

During the convention, an emergency number will be answered at the Communications Center. That number is (503) 590-5008.

"We suggest you write this number down before you leave for Portland," says Ed Warmoth.

Live Music at Portland

The Ghost Riders Square Dance Band from Concord CA will be providing live music for dancing in the Main Arena of the Portland Memorial Coliseum during the 43rd National convention in June.

The band, which has performed for dances, special events and movies for 20 years, will be playing every evening of the convention.

The Ghost Riders appeared at the Houston convention in 1988 and at Salt Lake City in 1991.

Old Town Open Air Market

Every Saturday, from March until Christmas, an open-air market is held in Old Town Portland. The original booths were located under the Burnside bridge but now there are more than 250 booths spilling onto adjoining streets.

Most of the merchandise is handmade or hand-decorated. Clothing, household goods, and food vendors are included and strolling musicians add to the fun.

Birmingham Prevue June 25

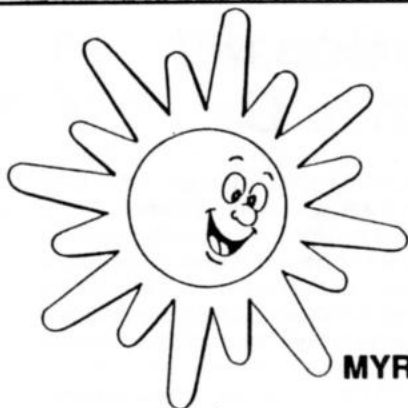

Club Erosion Pamphlet Offered by U.S.D.A.

Insight into the definition, causes, effects and cures of club erosion is included in a pamphlet offered by United Square Dancers of America.

The 16-pager is identified as P070-92 and titled, "Club Erosion." is available free by writing Joe and DeAnn Hutchinson, U.S.D.A. Rt 2 Box 469, Salina OK 74365.

Why is the club in its present condition? Looking for a scape goat? The pamphlet names the culprits and their failures. It then analyzes the status of a typical club that has become a typical "ho-hum" organization.

First, it asks questions about what is being done to alleviate the things that are causing club erosion. Then it explains some of the problems and gives suggestions that may help in preventing further erosion and rebuilding the club on a better foundation.

Methods of nursing a club back to health are contained in the pamphlet which makes good reading and food for thought by leaders, callers, cuers and dancers.



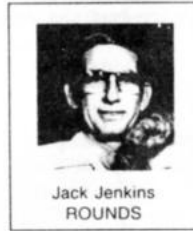
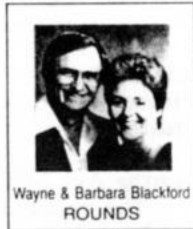
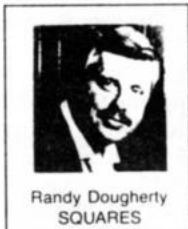

CFA Board of Directors Meeting, Sunday 17 April 1994.

(Edited for Keepin' Posted)

The meeting was called to order by President George Knapp at 2:05 p.m. and opened with a moment of silent prayer.

Minutes of the last meeting were accepted as written. The Treasurer's report was filed for audit.

Correspondence: KOA Orlando has offered their facilities for camping weekends or future association picnics. This information was passed to the Pooles for consideration on next year's schedule. In reply to the Treasurer's request, the Florida Department of Revenue has denied exemption.

Area Directors Report: (Jim McConaha) The Vice President of Directors has attended both the recent Florida Federation and the 46th National Convention Committee meetings. Following the recommendations by the McConahas, Sumter County will be included in the area covered by Vernon Cannaday. The designation will henceforth be Lake/Sumter. We will continue to look for a Director to represent Marion county.

Reports were given by the Hoffmans, Byers Thompson, Vernon Cannaday, the Shockleys, and the Herolds. The report for West Volusia was read by Carol Poole. Accelerated Classes Seek Dancers in 3 Days

A club in Alaska has done interesting things with a program of accelerated square dance instruction that claims to put dancers on the floor in three Saturdays.

Conventional lessons were for 30 weeks, one night per week—and attracting only four or five students. “We decided to try something else,” says Isabelle Mudd.

Our caller was willing to try so we ran our first accelerated class in May of 1992. It worked well enough that we ran another class in July. These classes consisted of 10 to 12 lessons taught five week-nights for two weeks.

In 1993, the club did a class in Mary (12 students including refreshers); June (4 students); and August (14 students).

With clubs that were down to two squares you can see we did increase the potential.

These classes attracted some high school students and since this age group would not be able to attend 5 nights a week we tried three consecutive Saturdays (10-11, 1:30-4:30). The first class brought us 10 students who have kept dancing and are now angeling the second class of 14 students which is just finishing up.

Our caller will have introduced all the Mainstream moves in 15 hours of concentrated work, but these folks will be dancing from then on as full members of the club.
