MAY 3, 1998  
SUMMARY OF MINUTES

TREASURERS' REPORT: As of May 3, 1998, the current cash and bank accounts was \$3460.39. Total liabilities and equity was \$8459.35.

CORRESPONDENCE: There was no correspondence this period.

AREA DIRECTOR REPORTS: Full reports are on file. Highlights follow:

*N. Brevard:* The floor is being refinished at McLarty Recreation Center for Spacetrackers and Canaveral Squares. Spacetrackers will graduate a new class on June 20. New classes start on September 14.

*S. Brevard & Indian River:* The Grand Squares and Allemanders have graduating classes. Contra dancing continues to be popular on the 2nd Saturdays with a live band. The All Brevard Picnic was successful with 280 dancers attending. The billboards have been getting a lot of notice. Fourteen more will be put up.

*Marion:* Dancing Shadows Squares and Saddle Oaks are closed for the summer. Oak Run and Salt and Pepper Shakers graduated new classes. Rainbow Squares moved to a different hall and graduated 8 dancers.

*Lake/Sumter:* Happy Hoedowners have disbanded after 40 years. The Holiday Squares and Groveland/Clermont Squares will be closed for the summer.

*E. Orange & Seminole:* No report.

*W. Orange:* The Mirror Images and Garden Patch will graduate new classes of dancers. Special dances held by the West Orange clubs included an Easter Hat Dance, IRS Dance, and Pie Night. Future dances include Mom's Dance, Red, White and Blue Dance, Pizza Night, Ice Cream Social and Luau.

*Osceola:* No report.

*East Volusia:* All clubs have been active and will be graduating new dancers - 86 in total! Upcoming special dances include a Luau, Hot Dog Roast, Watermelon Roast, picnics and covered dish dinners.

*West Volusia:* Both the Honeybees and Promenaders have been active with graduating classes and many special dances. The Promenaders will have a Beginner's Ball on June 3 for all new graduates. The Honeybees delivered Easter baskets for needy children.

BLOOD BANK: There are 337 units in account #54. Many dancers have given multiple gallons. There have been no withdrawals in the past year. This worthy service needs to be publicized.

KEEPIN' POSTED: 600 copies of the June issue will be printed to distribute to new graduates. Area Reps need to let George know of clubs with graduates. The cost of publication has increased. More ads are needed.

MEMBERSHIP: There are 55 new members and 350 renewals for a total of 415 members.

INSURANCE: There are 1900 members insured in Central Florida. Three clubs have not renewed: Merry-Go-Rounders, Mirror Images, and Sunni's Rounders. Checking account balance is \$635.09.

HISTORIAN: Morgans have received the scrapbooks and the books will be updated soon.

1999 STATE CONVENTION: The Kick-Off is progressing well. All are asked not to wear their '99 Convention dress until Sunday night at the Convention. They are still looking for a Handicapable Chairman. All committees are active. Bruce Morgan has started a web page for the Convention. The URL is [www.geocities.com/nashville/9348/convention.html](http://www.geocities.com/nashville/9348/convention.html). The entire 45th State Square Dance Committee will meet on May 23 at the '98 Convention in Sikes Hall, Room I at 10:00 a.m.

FLORIDA FEDERATION REPRESENTATIVE: Submit State Dress designs to the Federation at the next meeting during the State Convention.

OLD BUSINESS:

BYLAWS AMENDMENT: After much discussion, a motion was made by Jack Hoffman and seconded by Bruce Morgan to accept the Bylaw change as follows:

Amendment to Bylaws

Article V, paragraph E. The first organizational (first) meeting of the Board of Directors for the incoming fiscal year shall be held in October, at a date set by the newly elected President. During this meeting, committees shall be appointed and the report of the Audit Committee shall be heard. Also during this meeting the President should establish and/or announce the "goals" for the new year.

Article V, paragraph F. The fiscal (annual) year for the Association is established as October first of each year through September thirtieth of the following year.

Article XI, paragraph F. Effective October 1, 1999, the initial fees for membership in the Association are established at eight (\$8.00) dollars per member. The fees will include a name badge, current year bar, and issues of *Keepin' Posted*.

Another motion was made by George Knapp and seconded by Bruce Morgan to increase the price of initial membership fees to \$8.00 and renewal to \$4.00 effective 10/1/99. The motion passed with one dissenting vote.

Dance Fees: Fees for CFA dances will remain the same as it was felt that the treasury is adequate with funds received from the National Convention. It was also suggested to have Area Reps see if any of their clubs would like to sponsor a CFA dance. Another suggestion was given about having one special CFA dance per year with a well known caller.

Pamphlets: 5000 pamphlets promoting square dancing have been received from CALLERLAB and are ready for distribution to Area Reps.

Iron-On Emblems: The Hoffmans reported that CFA iron on emblems are now available for \$4.00 (cost to CFA: \$2.25).

Couple of the Year: This year the Couple of the year will be presented at the May 30 dance. The next president will select a committee and criteria for the future awards.

#### NEW BUSINESS:

Showcase of Ideas: A sign-up sheet is available for workers in Charlotte. Dewey and Donna Hendrix are in charge of the display.

Audit: Bruce Morgan and Duke McCleskey will do the audit on May 30.

Upcoming Dances: The President's Ball will be May 30 at Sunshine Hall in Wildwood. The next dance will be at Whirl and Twirl on August 29.

The next board meeting will be August 9 (2:00) at Shoney's in Sanford.

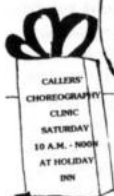

## Whatever Happened to Grace and Styling?

There were, at one point in time, several accepted points of courtesy and styling. Where did they go? When did the "grand square" stop having 32 beats of music? When did a weave the ring become a bump and grind display of twirls and patty cakes? When did "promenade half way around" involve either the designated couples rushing headlong through the middle or the other couple doing some sort of highland fling? When did "do-si-do" become a swing? When did "circle to a line" change to what it is today?

Every time I hear dancers complain about the condition of the activity, it makes me wonder what is missing. The older dancers remember when courtesy and grace were as much a part of the activity as the socializing. They remember when a courtesy turn was just that, not a crack-the-whip and twirl; when a square thru was done by letting go of the hands. Today's dancers have little idea what a grand square feels like to be danced in time to the music. They are too busy twirling and swinging and so many other things that can't be defined, to even consider being in step with the music. It's as if they need to hurry and get back to where they started before anyone else does. It really is not a race.

I know, I've heard the arguments, "Most of the dancing is boring." "Everyone else is doing it. I don't want to look like a geek." "It's more fun this way." And on and on and on, ad nauseum.

Perhaps we should be putting the grace and styling back into square "dancing". After all, isn't dancing supposed to be graceful? Instead of rushing into the middle and throwing off the timing of the figure, maybe we could try promenading half-way around (the outside). Instead of trying to tie each other in knots and using more beats than we should, maybe we should try doing a square thru in ten beats (that would mean letting go of the hands). Perhaps we should try stepping in time to the music and using 32 beats to do a grand square (no twirling, tangos, kicks or anything else). Perhaps we could even do a do-si-do back to back (no swinging).

I'll bet if we all really made an effort to move in time to the music and perform the moves the way they were taught, we could put the grace and styling back into square dancing.

But, that's just my opinion. I could be wrong.

The purpose of the United Square Dancers of America is to promote and perpetuate the total square dance movement, which includes square, round, contra, clogging, line and heritage dancing; establish a line of communication from the individual dancer to a recognized unified body to make decisions at the national level; provide for education to further the growth and enjoyment of square dancing; encourage cooperation between member clubs, state associations, councils, federations, national, international organizations; provide a forum for implementing the benefits of membership and to represent square dancing to the general public as a wholesome, enjoyable family type organization.

## Annual Meeting

The USDA annual meeting will be held on Wednesday, June 24, 1998, in the Radisson Plaza Hotel, 101 Tryon Street, Charlotte, NC. Registration will commence at 12:30 p.m.

This is the official meeting of the Board of Directors who provide the guidance and direction for the world's largest national square dance organization. The Board consists of delegates from all USDA affiliates (state organizations). **Visitors are welcome** but may not vote on items brought before the board.

## **NEW FLORIDA STATE SQUARE DANCE OUTFIT**

May 26, 1998

The new Florida state square dance outfit is a white eight gore skirt on the outside with eight hidden colored gores on the inside which flare out when twirled. These colored gores are about one-half the width of the outside gores and are in alternating rainbow colors of yellow, blue, pink and pale green. The colors represent the following: yellow, the sunshine state; blue, the ocean; pink, the sunset; green, the continuous green season. Tiny colored bows sit above each hidden gore of the same color.

The top is a white peasant blouse with tiered sleeves of green and yellow topped with a blue ruffle. A pink bow sits at the center top of the ruffle to discretely pick up the remaining rainbow color of pink.

The man's white shirt has alternating rows of the same rainbow colors on the yoke. The pants can be white or one of the rainbow colors.

The instructions on preparation will be sent to each association president for distribution within the next few weeks.

- to prepare dancers to dance to national callers at conventions and specials
- to develop a network for sharing ideas and exchanging information; to build and strengthen the dance community.
- to foster healthy competition in the spirit of fun by "capturing" other club's banners
- to establish new friendships and strengthen the old
- to get more enjoyment by sharing a common hobby with others who love it just as much as you

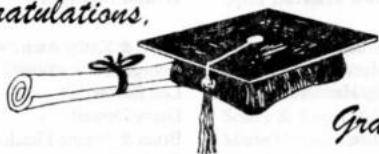
