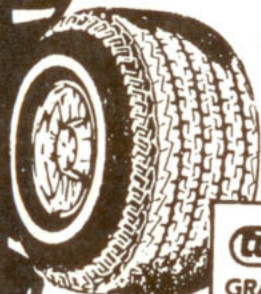

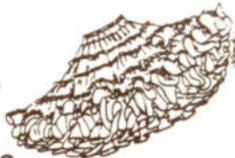

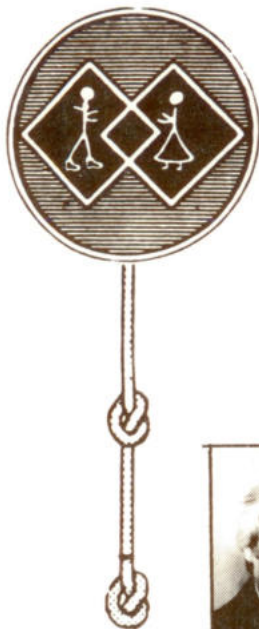

### THIS CLUB HAS BEEN MAKING HISTORY

If you have not attended a Pirate dance or not been visited by that Club, then you have missed an entertaining spectacle! When the Pirates march into a hall, dressed in dramatic black with the Pirate's head decal leering at you from all of their backs, carrying their "treasure chest of jewels" and lugging their "anchor", it is a sight to behold.

They are a fun group of people and those who attended the Camping Weekend and the Pirates anniversary dance enjoyed a sampling of their "acting and singing" abilities as well.

Their callers, Jim and Terry Louder are also a big part of their act and an inspiration to all of them. Since their membership has doubled in one year, you know the Pirates are doing something right.

We are pleased to reprint here the History of the Pirates as provided to us by their Scribe, Dottie Hammon.

### HISTORY OF THE PIRATES SQUARE DANCE CLUB

On December 17, 1987, a group of square dancers got together for an organizational meeting for a new plus square dance club. This meeting was to formalize what had been a matter of informal discussion on prior occasions. Those involved were seeking to develop a club with a unique concept. The idea was to hold a club dance one a month; the rest of the club's activity was to consist of banner raids on other square dance clubs.

The next order of business was to seek a name appropriate to the intent and purpose of the club. Several names were suggested; the majority of those present agreed that the name "PIRATES" well suited the intent of the club and that name was adopted.

The question of club outfits was raised, and the group agreed on an outfit of all black - shirt and trousers for men and skirt and blouse or dress for the women. All were also to wear red scarves. In addition, men were to wear a red sash. Both men and women were to wear a white vest with a "PIRATE" insignia on the back. The design of club badges was also to incorporate the same design as the insignia on the vest - the portrait of a pirate with a knife in his teeth.

The question of who would serve as officers was brought up, and discussed; several couples were asked and agreed to serve. Since the club theme was to be nautical, it was decided that the officers should have nautical titles. Accordingly, the club's first officers were as follows:

It was decided that Jim Louder be asked to call for the club; he agreed to be our caller, and, consistent with the Club's nautical theme, was given the title "BOATSWAIN". Jim has continued to call for us throughout the year 1988 until the present time.

Our initial Club dance was held on January 23, 1988. Until July, 1988, Club dances were held on the 2nd Saturday of each month. At that time it was decided to expand to twice a month for our Club dances. Our dances are now held on the 2nd and 4th Saturdays of each month.

Initially, the club had 39 members. At our first dance, 45 members were present in Club outfits. We finished the year 1988 with 86 members.

During the year 1988, the Club scheduled and carried out, two or three banner raids or retrievals each month, including a mystery bus trip. Our full year's activity resulted in a total of 23 raids and 12 retrievals, and a performance at the Florida State Convention.

Our Club dances throughout the year have been well attended, and we look forward to 1989 being an excellent year for attendance as well.

## CAMPING AT 1989 FLORIDA SQUARE AND ROUND DANCE CONVENTION

Camping facilities will be provided at the Central Florida Fairgrounds at 4603 W. Colonial Drive which is close to the Expo Centre. Campers will use the south service gate to enter camping area.

Electricity, water, and dump stations are available. An extra "Y", water hose and extension cord may be needed in some cases. Sites are not designated or numbered so if you want to be with a group, we suggest one couple come early and plan the parking for their group.

A shuttle bus will run to and from the Expo Centre only. Cost of the bus for the entire weekend is \$10.00 per person. Camping fees are \$9.00 a day per R.V. unit.

The south service gate will be for the use of campers only. A quiet hours ordinance is in effect after 11:00 p.m. Security will be provided for the evening hours and the gate will be locked at midnight. Anyone staying out later should let us know so we can unlock the gate for them.

## UNITED SQUARE DANCERS OF AMERICA INSURANCE PROGRAM

### CLAIM PROCEDURE

When an accident occurs the club president or injured dancer should PHONE the CFA Insurance Chairman as soon as possible. The Insurance Chairman will mail a medical claim form to be filled out by the claimant and the doctor. This claim must be filed within 20 days of date of injury. If bills are not available, please send the claim in anyway so that it can be recorded; the bills must follow as soon as possible. The CFA Insurance Chairman will sign the form in the space provided and send it to the USDA Insurance Chairman.

Claims will not be processed if sent directly to the Rhulen Agency by the claimant or the club. The Rhulen Agency will send them to the USDA Insurance Chairman for verification. If a member has other insurance which covers medical expenses resulting from injuries, the USDA insurance will pay all covered cost not paid by the member's primary insurance up to the limits of this policy. Please be advised that the claim will be processed more efficiently if the letter of denial or explanation of benefits from the Primary Carrier are included with the claim material. The Accidental Death and Dismemberment provision are not affected by any other insurance.

Please instruct all claimants that they should not leave the claim forms with the doctor or hospital to mail. The claimant should personally mail or deliver the form to the CFA Insurance Chairman. If a claim is forwarded without bills, it will be held by the insurance company until bills are received. If treatment is to continue over a period of time, bills should be sent in as they are received by the claimant.

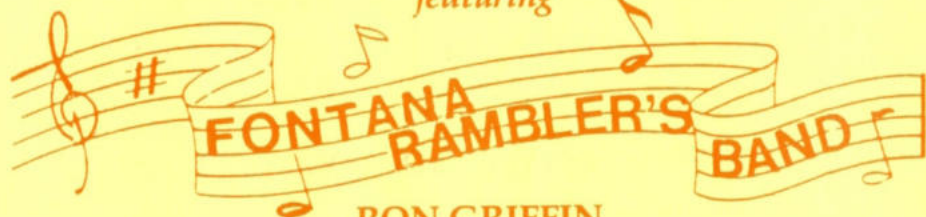

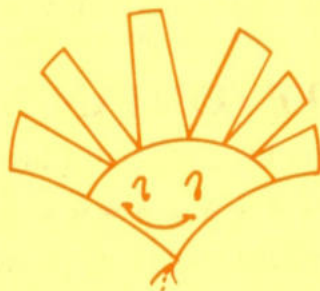

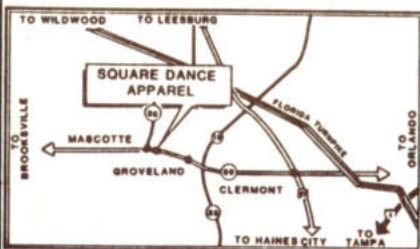

January 8, 1989

SUMMARY OF THE MINUTES

**TREASURY** - Balance on hand is \$7231.59. This includes \$5000 in the Building Fund and \$644.96 in the Keepin' Posted account. There will also be a separate account for the Insurance Chairman in the future.

**AREA REPORTS** - Area Directors reported that all CFA banners are being retrieved and flyers delivered.

**USDA INSURANCE** - Seventeen Clubs and 1218 members are enrolled in the program. Six Clubs had not yet renewed and there have been inquiries from other Clubs. An alternate contact, Roger and Elsie Chapin, has been appointed in case the Pooles are not available. See Insurance Report elsewhere in KP.

**KEEPIN' POSTED** - The cost to print and distribute 500 copies (28 pages) was approximately \$440. More advertising is needed in order to make it self-supporting and more input is still needed from CFA Clubs.

**BLOOD BANK** - There are 40 units available. See report elsewhere in KP.

**PRESIDENT'S BALL** - April 29th at the DeBary Fire Hall. See advertisement in KP.

**TAX EXEMPT STATUS** - Information will be gathered and forms will be filed to apply for tax exemption following procedures set forth by the Federation.



**DANCE SCHEDULES** - A list was made of suggested Callers and Cuers for the 5th Saturday dances to be held on 7/29/89, 9/30/89, 12/30/89, 3/31/90, 6/30/90. In the future one dance will be arranged at each Board Meeting instead of five dances being discussed at the first Board Meeting of the calendar year.

**BUDGET** - A committee was named to establish a budget for the coming year.

**BANNERS** - The Banner program will be discontinued since it has not accomplished the original goal. See the President's Message in KP.

The next Board Meeting will be 4/9/89 at the Taylor's and the next General Membership Meeting will be on 4/29/89 at the DeBary Fire Hall followed by a Covered Dish dinner, bring a dish and your own place setting.

# FLORIDA FEDERATION of SQUARE DANCERS

Many people and organizations are at work to enable you to enjoy Square Dancing. However, you may not have heard much about the organization which ties all dancers in Florida together, THE FLORIDA FEDERATION OF SQUARE DANCERS.

This body is made up of five Associations of which Central Florida Ass'n is one. Each association sends delegates to the several Federation annual meetings, where they participate in workshops and exchange ideas to make your dancing activity even better. They coordinate with the Callers and Cuers and through the sponsoring regional Association (last year it was Central, this year it is Northeast) combine efforts to put on the Annual State Convention.

The Federation conducts leadership seminars in connection with the International square dance organization, Legacy. The Federation is interested in ideas and suggestions from all dancers and strives to improve all phases of your dancing life.\*

The following is a synopsis of some of the meetings and discussions of problems and possible solutions that took place at the Federation's last working weekend on January 14, 1989. Each delegate was assigned to a committee on Saturday to discuss the issues below and on Sunday to report to all the Delegates what their recommendations were.

FINANCE prepared a 1989 Budget and made several recommendations concerning procedures.

SQUARE DANCE PRESERVATION discussed Dancer Attrition and recommended following the Northeast Assn's lead of urging dancers to remain in Mainstream one full year before moving on to Plus. Also recommended "down playing" the need for elaborate and expensive Square Dance attire but still requiring long sleeve shirts for men and skirts for ladies



PUBLICITY discussed how to get favorable Media coverage.

SHOWCASE OF IDEAS discussed displays which represent Florida and methods of transporting those displays to the National and State Conventions. It was also agreed to give out "Orange" stickers to dancers at the National Convention.



PROCEDURES OF SQUARE DANCING IN THE SCHOOL SYSTEM: Based upon the declaration that Square Dancing is now officially recognized as the Florida State Folk Dance, correspondence will be initiated with the Florida Department of Education urging instruction of Square Dancing at all levels of the public school system. Furthermore the recommendation is that all instruction be given by a certified Square Dance Caller rather than a physical education instructor.

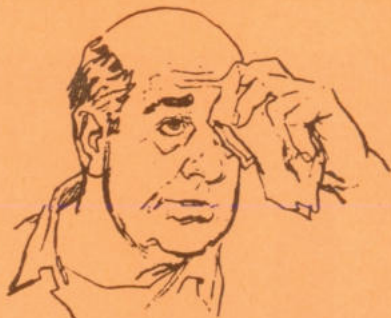

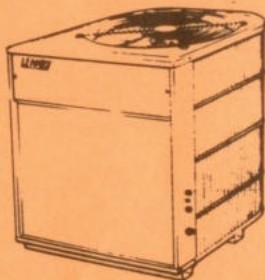
