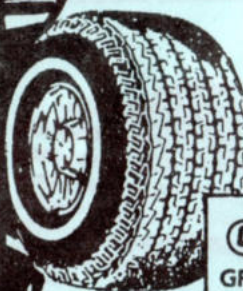

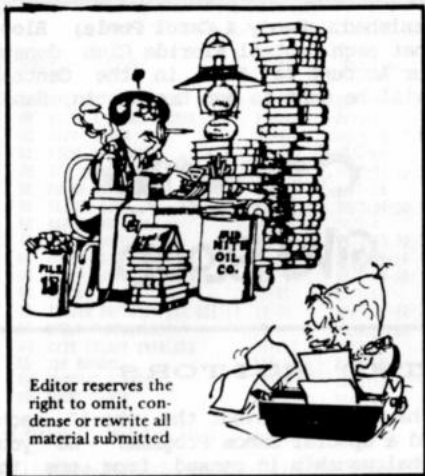

LETTER FROM THE EDITORS

Do your committee Chairman or Officers have to "re-invent the wheel" each time the Club Changes Officers or you hold a Special Dance Program? Do you keep good records so that when a job or chairmanship is passed from one to the next, the new person in charge will know exactly what is expected of him/her? Do you keep a "Party" or "Special Dance" file so that there is a quick reference of complete information that answers the questions - HOW, WHEN, WHERE, WHAT, WHY, HOW MUCH, WHO? Do you have recipes, proportions and procedures for making coffee and punch and purchasing food for a specific number of squares? Do you have guidelines or "standing rules" (other than By-Laws or Constitution) that explain the duties of Chairman of Membership, Refreshments, Publicity, Host & Hostess, Special Dances?

If you don't have any of the above then you probably have a hard time getting dancers to fill these positions. Start now keeping good, thorough records. Each time you hold a special dance, make sure that the Chairman turns in a report with the "vital statistics" of the dance, such as; how it was publicized, how many attended, what the program was, what special food was purchased, how much, was any left over, could you sell the leftovers, how many pots of coffee, how many bowls of punch, did dancers like that punch recipe, what decorations were used, if kept where are they stored, was the party enjoyed by most everyone, who were the names of committee members and chairman and what was the TOTAL COST OF THE PARTY.

This report is such a helpful tool, not only for future committee members but for the officers as an aid to planning the year's expenditures. Perhaps two copies should be made of the report in case someone is out of town, one filed with the Program Chairman and the other with the Secretary.

This editorial was prompted by a humorous article from USDA News, FIRST SQUARE DANCE ASSIGNMENT, that we have reprinted (in part) elsewhere in KP. Jim Segrave's article is the extreme of the situation but it will ring true to many people who have been assigned a task for the first time. Please read "First Square Dance Assignment".

1993 STATE CONVENTION COMMITTEE MEETING
December 1, 1990
SUMMARY OF THE MINUTES

Many enthusiastic dancers attended the meeting in Ormond Beach in December. The various "milestones" were explained (a time frame for specific activities to be completed) and the idea was discussed to hold frequent "mini" meetings in the future with individual committees and to hold meetings of the entire committee only in April, July and October of 1991.

OUTFIT: The fabric for the Convention/Kick-off Outfit has arrived and will be cut into lengths and distributed soon. The goal is to begin selling it at the CFA dance in Kissimmee on March 30. Only this fabric will be sold (\$2.00 per yard); all other fabric and notions needed to make the outfit may be easily purchased or already exist in "milady's" sewing basket. The pattern, is Authentic #275. King's Kid Corral and Dancin' Duds have told us that its available now in all sizes - check out Yellow Rock Headquarters and Sandy's Boutique, they probably have it now also.

LOGO: The completed Logo design, by Tom Saville of the Sun Dancers, was circulated among the committee to a chorus of "oohs and aahs". He did such a beautiful job designing the logo - CFA is indeed fortunate to have such a talented member! This Logo will be used for stationary, buttons, ribbons, registration forms, programs and probably promotional items.

KICK-OFF: There will be a big "push" soon to recruit dancers for the Kick-off. This will be a most unusual and colorful production and every club in Central Florida will be asked to participate. All dancers will want to become involved because of the theme, the colors and the music. Aren't you anxious to hear more about it?

FASHION SHOW: Muriel and Lou Chabot and Carol and Randy Poole have agreed to arrange and coordinate the Fashion Show. It is already in the planning stage and promises to be unique. Plans will be revealed later but keep it in mind, we are counting on many of you Central Florida seamstresses to participate.

Attend the CFA Dance in Kissimmee on March 30 and hear a very brief presentation of the Kick-off plans. See the outfit and pick up instructions and material. A Sewing Clinic Chairman is still needed, we hope that by the next Convention Committee meeting someone will have volunteered. It is scheduled for April, watch and listen for announcements so that you too can be a part of the Greatest Show in Central Florida history.

This willing and capable person and partner have a major responsibility in a Caller-run club and in addition they work on committees for Special Events and Chair some of them. They also belong to a Member-run club and there too, have a major responsibility and serve on committees. Consequently their time at dances is spent making sure that others have a good time with little time left for them to even dance.

Is the competition so keen to boost membership and attendance among clubs that they are over working their willing members? Are the clubs focusing too much on parties and special events and wearing out their willing members? Are a few dancers working hard to make square dancing fun for the many? This is not fair! If a club is going to hold many special events throughout the year then all members should be expected to do their share.

WHAT IS ROUND DANCING

by Wayne and Barbara Blackford

Round Dancing is a term used for a large number of dances performed by couples. They move around the room in one direction in order to accommodate all the dancers, hence the name "round dance". But, Round Dancing is more than these words imply -- it is the beauty of the movement to music and expression of emotions. It is the challenge of learning graceful steps, the discipline of body, mind and self and the mastering of various rhythms and routines. The sharing of a few hours with friends in class/club is the satisfaction of accomplishment. The circle has always symbolized giving and receiving and just so is round dancing. It is each dancer, expressing his happiness in the movement and enjoyment of the music.

Round Dancing is a product of the United States. As early as the 18th century there were dances in which couples progressed in a counter clockwise circle around the room.

SQUARES and ROUNDS complement each other. We believe that they GO HAND IN HAND and separation would be a great loss to both activities. People who do both square and round dancing, we believe, stay in the activity longer. When interest in one lags, the other will keep them going to dances.

In most cases, square dancers who also round dance, are smoother square dancers, and people who do both generally make better dancers. Round Dancers learn to listen to music phrasing and will dance within the phrasing and at the tempo the music dictates. We have noticed that favorite callers are the ones who can put the square dance movements together with the music, creating smooth and enjoyable dancing because every movement "fits" the music.

We appreciate all square dance callers and want to thank those who encourage their dancers to learn to round dance, those who also get out and round dance between their own calling tips, and those who encourage and cooperate with the round dance leaders.

FLORIDA FEDERATION OF SQUARE DANCERS

Much was accomplished during the January Working Weekend in Orlando. Delegates at this meeting are the Presidents of the five Florida Associations, several representatives and Federation past presidents. Although others may be in attendance, only the delegates may vote. Many excellent ideas and recommendations are the result of this Annual meeting.

On Sat. morning, a business meeting was held and status reports were read by the five association Presidents, by each Editor of an association's publication and by each of the Convention Chairmen. There were also reports from Special Interest chairmen such as Insurance, Legacy, Showcase of Ideas, etc. Then in the afternoon the delegates split into several committees to study the various aspects of square dancing that affect you, the dancers of Florida. Suggestions are made based on experience of the delegates in their own association or club, proposals are tossed around and then conclusions are reached to benefit you.

Of course the most exciting decision made during this weekend was that Florida shall bid to host the 1997 National Convention. (See article in KP) However many other important situations were discussed and some of the recommendations made were: Each association should appoint a Publicity Coordinator; Clubs could provide care for children while parents attend Beginner Square Dance Class; Include Insurance fee in club dues; Teach more styling (hand positions - use of skirt); "Barbie Dolls" to be displayed in such a manner to suggest seasonal activities for Showcase at National; Permit sale of Convention promotional items at prior State Convention; During each Beginner Class session allow for a few moments of indoctrination (etiquette - participation in Club - hierarchy of associations); Member couple sponsor new graduate couple; rotate couples in Class squares. Also a Florida Federation Logo was adopted (design - Central's Tom Saville) depicting dancers, oranges, sand, water and a space ship.

The Federation meetings are extremely interesting and the dedication of these delegates is to be commended. They travel from as far away as Pensacola and Miami to attend it to help make Square Dancing in Florida the best that it can be.

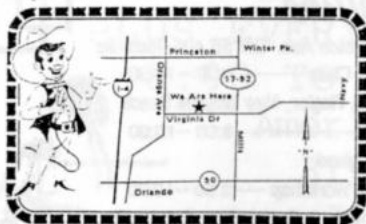

November 17, 1990

SUMMARY OF THE MINUTES

TREASURY - The balance on hand is \$2619.32. The balance in the following additional accounts is: Insurance - \$504.00, **KEEPIN' POSTED** - \$1088.48 (prior to Dec. issue expenses) and Contingency Fund - \$3,500.

BLOOD BANK - In October CFA had a balance of 21 units. When donating blood the account number is 678. Several members have had surgery and blood has been drawn from the account. A request has been made that all Clubs donate at least one unit of blood during the next 3 months.

KEEPIN' POSTED - The solicitation of Holiday greeting signatures and Greeting cards was a huge success, in total they brought in \$363 however, regular advertising dropped off. In preparation for the May issue when complimentary copies are given to new square dance graduates, the area representatives were urged to tell the clubs to send their graduate's names to KP by March 15.

CAMPING WEEKEND - Scheduled for Friday, April 19 at 12 noon through Sunday, April 21 at 10 am. Don Furnish will call and the Schmidts will perform the "Golden Nut" initiation at the after party following the Sat. night dance. See article and ad in KP.

CFA DANCES - It was suggested that area Clubs donate a free pass to their dances as door prizes at CFA dances. There will be a Host and Hostess greeting dancers in the future, Duke and Doris McCleskey volunteered to host the next dance. It will be in Kissimmee on March 30, John Barrett will call, Jim Cowan will cue. The June dance and election of officers will be on June 16 at the Central Florida Fairgrounds. It is being held on this date instead of the 5th Saturday because so many CFA officers and members will be away attending the National Convention at that time. Also the August 5th Saturday dance which would fall on Labor Day Weekend has been changed to September 8.

NEW BUSINESS - The Clubs will be asked to display "Barbie Dolls" again in the Showcase of Ideas at the National Convention.

Nominating Committee will be George and Buena Beis and Randy and Carol Poole.

In Foreign countries -- Japan, Germany and Poland, for example, the same choreographed dances are cued in English, and only couples under age 50 round dance. (Unlike in Florida and elsewhere across the US.) That's because those born after World War II, were required to learn English, and can understand the cues.

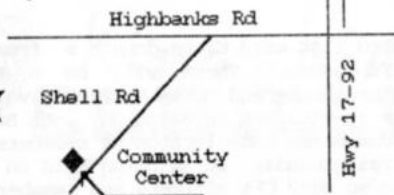

FIRST SQUARE DANCE ASSIGNMENT

by Jim Seagraves (paraphrased and shortened by KP Editor)

John had just completed square dance lessons and upon joining the Club had volunteered to chair the Club Publicity Committee for their big dance of the year. Although he was somewhat fearful about this "unknown" task, he was enthusiastic and anxious to get started. He relates his story below.

"Now, I have one question: WHAT DO I DO? I'll ask the Dance Chairman. But since he had never held that position before, he did not know what was required of the publicity committee. He suggested I ask the Club President, his answer was "just publicize the dance" That is all the guidance and assistance I received.

Now I've got several questions that need answers: WHAT DO I DO? HOW DO I DO IT? WHEN DO I DO IT? WHERE DO I DO IT? I'm lost, frustrated, discouraged, I don't know where to find help and no one seems to care. So I considered my options. Don't do anything - wait until someone tells me what to do - or pursue the problem and seek guidance, assistance and information.

I chose the latter course and searched for Club guidelines or procedures for conducting a dance special or for the Publicity Committee and found none. I also looked for reports of the dance held last year - none found! Can you believe there are no records of last year's dance?

Finally I found the individual that had the publicity job last year and was told to "develop a flyer and distribute it to every one" Now I've really got some questions: Added to the above is, WHAT IS MEANT BY "PUBLICIZE THE DANCE"? WHAT IS A FLYER? HOW DO YOU CONSTRUCT A FLYER? WHAT SHOULD THE FLYER CONTAIN? WHO DO YOU DISTRIBUTE IT TO? HOW DO YOU DISTRIBUTE IT? WHO PRINTS THE FLYER? HOW MANY DO I PRINT? WHERE CAN I FIND THE INFORMATION I NEED? HOW CAN I GET OUT OF THIS MESS? HELP - HELP - HELP!

This job is snowballing into mass confusion and I'm not getting anywhere, no answers, just more questions, doubts and frustrations. I'LL NEVER DO THIS AGAIN! I checked with the other committees and they are just about as lost as I am and the dance is just around the corner. Once again I consider my options. Resign from the committee assignment, quit the club, don't do anything, wait until someone tells me what to do, do anything - right or wrong - continue to pursue the quest for information and knowledge. NEVER, NEVER accept another assignment!"

Does this sequence of events ring a bell? Have you experienced this same sad tale of woe? Why should anyone have to go through this disaster. Isn't it silly or perhaps criminal for any club or their members to experience this year after year? After sponsoring an annual dance for several years there should be a great expertise developed within the club and a wealth of information and know-how available. But, naturally, it is not put on paper and documented. Therefore, the expertise drifts away with the passing of time and the poor volunteers must "re-invent the wheel" or "start from scratch."

Of course the article did not end there, Jim made recommendations similar to the suggestions in our Letter from the Editors. He stated that a club should have a "Dance Folder" that contains a copy of all the relevant Club Guidelines, Procedures and "How-To" Information. This "Master Copy" should never be passed out but be kept up to date and "copies" only given out to committees and involved individuals.

Jim then developed a different scenario with "John" having all of the information he needs at his finger tips. He has last year's report of the special dance party, a sample of what was used, the job is easy and fun and he knows what he is doing and how to do it. He might even volunteer to be the DANCE CHAIRMAN next year.
