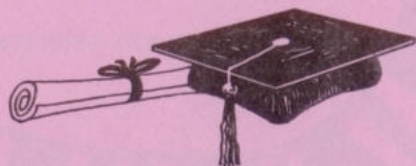

## SEWING CLINIC

I also learned how to search the regular pattern books for dresses that had a bodice sewed to the skirt at the waist. Finally, my dresses did not have to all look alike!

I have visited the sewing clinic at every convention we've attended. At every one I have acquired some knowledge on constructing square dance outfits. I have brought home booklets packed full of ideas from how to put life back into petticoats - to making a man's tie. You should definitely plan a visit to the sewing clinic at this year's convention.

## KICK-OFF

What's a Kick-off? A Kick-off is a show organized by the Square Dance Association in charge of the following year's convention. The square and round dancers of that area work many, many months to put this show together.
