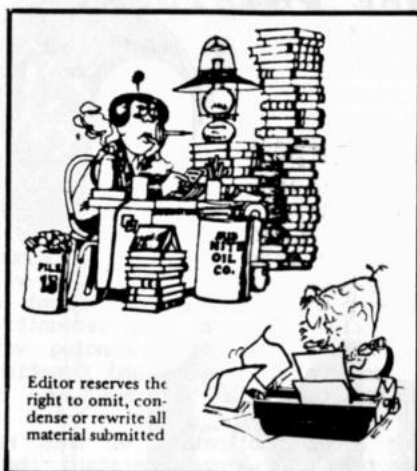

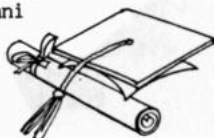

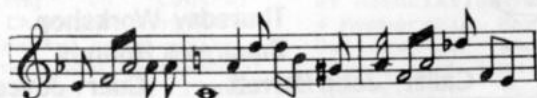

LETTER FROM THE EDITORS

Dancers, are you aware of the many levels of organizations and the network of individuals whose efforts result in your square dancing enjoyment? The first level of course is your "home" club and the organization within it. Joining a club does not mean that you now can just pay your money and dance. Along with membership goes responsibility and obligation.

Every member-run club requires the participation of its total membership in order that everyone can dance and have a good time. Ask your officers how you can help. Most clubs need greeters, kitchen workers, committee members to help with special dances and activities and also "angels" to help with the new beginning class of dancers. You will "get your feet wet" slowly and become familiar with the club operation so that in the future you could serve as a committee chairman or Director of the club. If everyone works a little, no one will have to work a lot.

The next level is the Central Florida Square and Round Dancers Ass'n (CFA), it is one of five regional associations in the state. CFA covers nine counties and governs many of the special programs in the area, for example, Blood bank, Insurance Program, State Convention every 5 years and the Keepin' Posted.

Then there is the Florida Federation of Square Dancers. It ties together all five regional associations by holding several meetings a year that are attended by delegates from all regional associations. They conduct workshops on issues concerning square dancers throughout the state and also coordinate with the Callers, Cuers and the sponsoring regional association to put on the State Convention.

There is also a national organization, United Square Dancers of America (USDA). It is through its efforts that square dancing is being named the National Folk Dance in many states. It also governs the insurance program that is available to all dancers.

Beyond all of these there is an international organization called Legacy. It is a service-leadership organization and provides guidance and a manual to improve leadership skills. It conducts national surveys to measure dancer opinions and attitudes. It also provides a "kit" of ideas and promotional materials as an aid to encouraging people to become square dancers.

These are only some of the functions of the above organizations but it does give you an idea of the numbers of people involved. The important thing to consider is that the fun you derive from dancing is due to the effort that someone else has put into the activity. So give a little back and VOLUNTEER. You'll be glad you did and even enjoy your dancing more!

There are over sixty (60) Square and Round Dance Clubs in Central Florida for your enjoyment. If you have not already joined the Club of your choice, you are urged to make this your first priority!

The Central Florida Square and Round Dancers Association offers you the opportunity to enhance your Club Membership, expand your circle of Friendships, gain additional FUN and Pleasures, as you experience the choreography and patter of new Callers.

WHAT, you ask is the Central Florida Square and Round Dancers Association? To AnswerYou need to know some of the background of Florida Square Dancing. The Florida Federation of Square Dancers has organized the State into FIVE Areas of interest... the Northeast (Jacksonville, etc), Northwest (Pensacola, etc), West Coast (Tampa, etc), Southeast (Miami, etc) and CENTRAL (the counties of Brevard, Indian River, Lake, Marion, Orange, Osceola, Seminole, Sumter and Volusia).

PURPOSE.. To promote Square and Round Dancing in Central Florida - Chartered by the State to promote co-mingling, personal contact and fellowship among members of the Clubs within the NINE County Area.

BENEFITS.. Many, BUT most important are:
CFA BLOOD BANK - Membership in CFA entitles YOU to FREE Blood should the need arise (even though YOU may not have donated, personally). When a Member Dancer does donate, the entire household family is entitled to FREE Blood! All donors receive a 'dangle' for donating. AFTER giving eight pints (Gallon Club), you receive a 'bar' for your Club badge.

INSURANCE.. The United Square Dancers of America offers CFA Members (through their 'Home Club'), a Commercial General Liability and Accident Medical Insurance Program, for an affiliate membership fee. This fee is set each year based upon the previous year usage. Currently this fee is right at TWO (\$2) dollars per year (per insured member).

ADDITIONALLY..Membership in CFA offers you:
* A discount at Association Dances (4 to 5 a year).
* Quarterly Issues of Central Florida's News publication - "Keepin' Posted".
* Enjoying the FUN and FELLOWSHIP of others who are interested in Dancing.
* An opportunity to lend YOUR voice to the planning and future of Square and Round Dancing, in Florida.
* Each fifth year (1993 next) the opportunity to take part in the organization and planning of the Florida State Square and Round Dance Convention, for all the Dancers of Florida!

FINALLY.. Membership dues are established at Seven Dollars for a first-time affiliation, which will include your Badge, Year Bar, and Keepin' Posted, together with all the benefits of Association Membership.
* Membership Renewal is Three Dollars per annum (July thru June), and includes Year Bar, and Keepin' Posted, together with ALL benefits.

NEW DANCERS BILL OF RIGHTS

A new square dancers has the right:

1. To a class experience that is both educationally and socially enjoyable.
2. To patient and dignified treatment by the class instructor(s) and sponsors.
3. To gain experience dancing to other callers and, if possible, with dancers from other classes prior to their graduation.
4. To receive advice and assistance in acquiring appropriate clothing for square dancing.
5. To instruction and practice with the approved definitions, timing and styling for each listed call.
6. To information about the history and heritage of our present square dance program.

We encourage ALL callers and square dancers alike to help put FUN and FRIENDLINESS into square dancing.

You will feel comfortable and have a wonderful time dancing at that level. Don't be timid, just walk onto the floor and join any square. If squares are full, walk onto the floor and hold up your hand. The caller will notice and point other dancers in your direction. Try to get into or form a square near the front so that you can hear and understand the caller. Sometimes those halls do not have the best acoustics and if you have danced only to your caller while taking lessons then other caller's voices and their pronunciation may sound "foreign" at first. "What'd he say? What'd he say" You'll hear a lot of that among the dancers in the squares. Relax and enjoy - you'll have a wonderful time.

SQUARE DANCE CODE OF ETHICS

1. **COURTESY**—As a square dancer I respect other dancers and callers and treat everyone with courtesy.
2. **FRIENDLINESS**—I go beyond the matter of form because those who participate in this activity with me are all my friends.
3. **LOYALTY**—I support my own club in all activities because it means that the continuance of square dancing depends on my personal loyalty.
4. **CLEANLINESS**—I do not wish to offend anyone. I am very particular of my personal habits, breath and cleanliness.
5. **ABSTINENCE**—Many Square Dances are held in public facilities where liquor is forbidden and their continued availability is dependent upon a favorable public image of square dancers. The co-ordination required for following the calls is impaired by drinking and close contact in a square with one who has consumed alcoholic beverages may be offensive. Therefore, I recognize the validity of the efforts to maintain a separation of square dancing from drinking, and will refrain from its use before and during the dances which I attend.

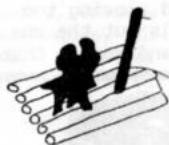

ROUND DANCE

From Cathedral Chimes, Christchurch, N. Z.

STYLING THE ROUNDS. I have noticed of late that the tendency to WALK rather than DANCE is creeping into ROUND DANCING. People seem to be placing their feet on the floor, heel first rather than ball of the foot first. Think about it. When you walk it's heel first but not in ROUND DANCING. In International Ballroom the heel is often placed on the floor first, but in ROUND DANCING, the ball of the foot is placed first unless one is doing a heel/toe type step or a heel turn.

Also, I have noticed of late that feet are not being placed on the floor flatly. Many dancers are placing the sole on the floor with either the inside or outside edge of the shoe visible. To be correct, the sole of the shoe should NEVER be seen. When you Spin, Sweep, Flare, Step-Swing, Rise, etc., the sole of the shoe should remain parallel to the floor.

It may take some concentration by the dancers but the tutors cannot escape from being at fault if they have not insisted in the teach (or review) situation on the niceties of the dance. Sloppiness is too easily learned and mediocrity is not an acceptable standard.

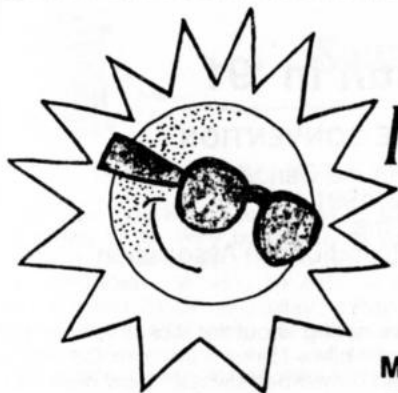

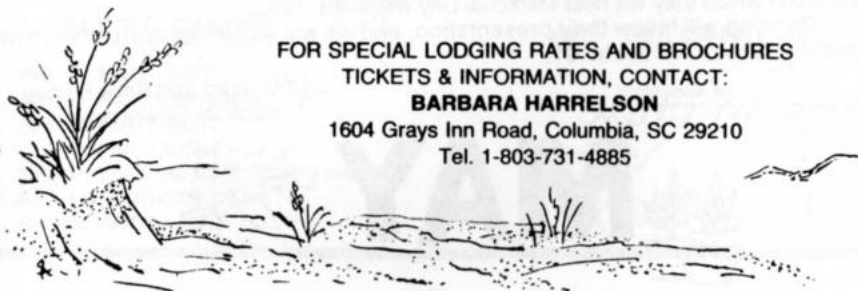

SUMMARY OF THE MINUTES

TREASURY - The balance on hand is \$1,606.81. The balance in the following additional accounts is: Insurance - \$504.00, Keepin' Posted \$184.12 (\$210 was paid out of the K.P. account for the Camping Weekend rent), Contingency Fund - \$3,500. The loan of \$1,500 to the 1993 Convention Committee will be paid back to CFA as soon as the advance is made from the Federation.

AREA REPORTS - All area reps present reported that graduations would be taking place across Central Florida in April and May. It was suggested that as many CFA Officers as possible should attend to promote CFA.

BLOOD BANK - 10 units of Blood have been donated to the CFA account since Sep. See report elsewhere in Keepin' Posted.

INSURANCE - There are 35 clubs with memberships totaling 2,085 currently insured, only 3 clubs have not paid their insurance fees.

KEEPIN' POSTED - A request was made and granted by the Board for \$300 to cover the expense of printing extra issues of the May Keepin' Posted. These will be given to the new graduates whose names the editors receive by the deadline. The May issue will be the last issue published by Lou and Muriel Chabot. No one has come forth yet and volunteered to be editor.

CAMPING WEEKEND - Many reservations for camping have been received, the Caller will be Don Furnish and the Cuer will be Roy Brown. The Schmidt's will perform Golden Nut initiations on Fri and Sat nights as there has been such an overwhelming response.

CFA DANCES - The June 16 Dance will be a Leo Richardson Benefit Dance in addition to a President's Ball. Central Florida Callers and Cuers will donate their time.

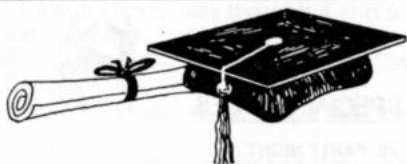

ADVANCED DANCING IN ORANGE CITY

Many of our dancers have left for points North so we are finishing up this season at the end of April. We plan to resume A-1 Dancing in the fall and expect that then we'll be dancing more and workshopping less. Then we will move on to A-2.

The following paragraphs which quote Ed Foote in an article he wrote for the 1988 American Squaredance bear repeating.

"The big weakness which is seen among countless Advanced dancers today, is a failure to understand Mainstream and Plus calls. Callers are not working Mainstream and Plus calls DBD (Dance By Definition) or APD (All Position Dancing) nearly enough with Advanced dancers.

We know that DBD is not a requirement for the Mainstream and Plus plateaus; it is an options and many, if not most, MS and Plus clubs do not use much DBD. Fine. But MS and Plus DBD is a requirement for Advanced, and the only way dancers are going to learn it is for the callers to teach and call it.

Why is MS and Plus DBD a requirement for Advanced? Because these plateaus constitute the very foundation of square dancing. If we are going to build on top of this foundation with an additional plateau, the underlying foundation must be strong. If a building does not have a strong foundation, it will crumble when a superstructure is added. The same idea applies to dancers attempting to add Advanced to a foundation of MS and Plus."

We can say "AMEN" to that! We have certainly learned these past 2 years how important that foundation is. Thank you, Carl Rod.
