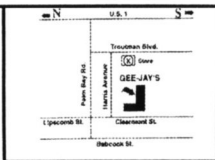

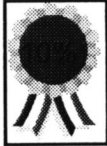
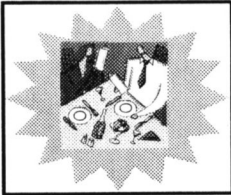

CLUB EROSION

Continuing Club Officers activities that contribute to club erosion.

Do not plan each dance night, giving consideration of fun activities, caller gimmicks, recognition, awards, fun badges, announcements, etc.

Do not maintain effective communication with the caller and club members

Do not detect or recognize the existence of club problems or reacting promptly to resolve problems.

Do not adhere to the established Club governing documents, rules or policies.

Questionable financial judgment. Makes hasty decisions without thoroughly examining the impact of the decision. May be an indication of a lack of foresight or lack of experience and knowledge of "long range" typical club operations and club leadership. New short-sighted officers that have never experienced 3 - 5 years of cyclic club operations may have that innate desire to "spend the money" if the club treasury appears to reflect a surplus of funds.

Do not do a thorough job of planning and preparing Club Board Meetings.

Do not motivate club members or club caller.

THE CLUB CALLER:

The following are typical examples of failures of a club caller that contribute to club erosion:

Do not advise the club officers of potential club problems. As the quarterback of the Square Dance Team, and possessing many years in the calling profession, the caller should recognize potential club problems and advise the club officers before the club suffers club erosion.

Do not take timely appropriate action to discourage cliques or set squares.

Do not call the lackluster response or attitude of the club members to the attention of the club officers and recommend solutions or methods of improving the dancers' attitude.

Contribute to the loss of club enthusiasm. The lack of enthusiasm of the club members may be emulated by the caller.

Inadequate program or insufficient stimulus provided to motivate the club officers and members.

Not planning and presenting a stimulating dance every club night. Using caller gimmicks, new calls, new material, surprises, etc. to stimulate the dancers.

BREVARD GOVERNMENT IN ACTION

The Brevard County Commission has presented four bills to our State Legislative Delegation for consideration during the session this year. These bills have been requested in an effort to save local taxpayer funds lost through direct expenses and indirect administrative and regulatory expenses.

The first request is to have part-time and temporary employees exempted from the State retirement system. The County is billed for contributions for these employees when in reality, few if any of the employees in these categories, ever achieve vesting in the State program.

The second request is for permitting exemption when the County or Cities need to clean or dredge canals which have been channeled for drainage. The current rules require permits for many of these canals, and this paperwork hinders the efforts to maintain good flowing drainage and delays actions when emergencies arise due to unexpected high water.

The third request is to eliminate the need for any governmental agency to pay mitigation costs to any other government agency. For example, Brevard County is expanding the Cocoa landfill to meet the needs of the residents. State agencies have required the County to spend over two million dollars to acquire and deed to them property west of Eau Gallie if the County is to get the permits necessary for the expansion. The mandatory payment of such mitigation drives up the cost of many public works projects.

The fourth request is for the Legislature to amend rules concerning the collection and disbursement of voter approved millage. In particular, the County has been in a legal dilemma over the expenditure of fund for Environmentally Endangered Lands, a levy approved by the voters. It is expected this change will clear any technicalities involved in the use of these funds for their voter intended purpose.

The County Commission presents its package once per year. If any resident has an idea for changing State rules, they are welcome to present their ideas personally to the delegation or through their elected representatives.



COUNTER AND PRESCRIPTION DRUGS
