During the past four years the square dance activity, represented by CALLERLAB, LEGACY, United Square Dancers of America, the National Executive Committee, and others, has been searching for a celebrity person to represent square dancing as a national spokesperson. Well, guess what! IT IS A DONE DEAL!!!

At the recent CALLERLAB convention in Kansas City, the CALLERLAB Board of Governors and representatives from several other national square dance organizations, approved endorsement of Rebecca Holden as a spokesperson for

square dancing (see the CALLERLAB press release elsewhere in this issue). Rebecca is an outstanding choice as a spokesperson, she is excited about this opportunity to help our activity and she is very capable of bringing that excitement to the people she talks with. She will certainly bring an added dimension to our public relations effort.

Rebecca will be making personal appearances at several large square dance events through out the country, representing square dancing. These appearances include several state conventions and of course, the National Convention. She will be in San Antonio, so be sure to look her up in the vendors area. She will be very happy to chat with you. Other possible appearances include national TV shows such as The Today Show, Good Morning America, and other national talk shows. JERUSALEM - 3389 and 3390 Old Testament, Strong's Exhaustive Concordance

Revelation 3:12 "Him that overcometh will I make a pillar in the temple of my God, and he shall go no more out: and I will write upon him the name of my God, and the name of the city of my God, which is new Jerusalem, which cometh down out of heaven from my God: and I will write upon him my new name."



Hawthorn (Crataegus oxyacantha)

The beneficial effects of hawthorn extracts in the treatment of angina are a result of improvement in the blood and oxygen supply to the heart by dilating the coronary vessels, as well as improvement of the metabolic processes in the heart.

Various flavonoid components in hawthorn have been shown to inhibit constriction of vessels in a manner similar to the calcium-channel blockers; however, this is only part of the total picture. Hawthorn also improves energy production within the heart as a result of the flavonoids improving the utilization of oxygen by the heart. The net result is improved heart function and an increase in the force of contraction. This is in stark contrast to beta-blockers and calcium blockers, which actually reduce heart function. The effects of Hawthorn also make it beneficial in cases of congestive heart failure and rhythm disturbances. In addition, the procyanidins of hawthorn are known to decrease cholesterol levels and the size of cholesterol-containing plaques in the arteries.

Hawthorn's ability to dilate coronary blood vessels has been repeatedly

BREVARD GOVERNMENT IN ACTION

Aquaculture is an environmentally cleansing industry, and does not create water pollution. The April 25 article fails to give one fact or even a theory, as to how raising clams in the river "could encourage water pollution". Given the "complex web of state, federal and local regulations" cited in your article, it makes sense for Representative Sembler to work on a bill in an area in which he has experience. Mr. Sembler is already in the business, and his efforts to cut back the mountainous paperwork only opens his business to more, not Less, competition. This is to be commended given the efforts of most PACs and lobbyists to protect what they have and create laws to exclude others from competing in their profession.

The abbreviated Palm Bay beltway study fails to report both sides of the issue and to emphasize that the route does not go east through adjoining communities. The proposal defeated Tuesday night was to provide minimal funding for survey for the route. The proposed southern leg makes a full loop around Palm Bay from Malabar Road to Babcock Street (south of the city limits) and then returns north on a widened Babcock Street to Malabar Road, covering the outside of both southwest and southeast Palm Bay. It does not go east of Babcock Street through Grant, Malabar, Valkaria, or Micco. This was the original proposal of three years ago. The story also fails to point out the critical problems going north from western Palm Bay on a single route, Minton Road, for a still growing area of nearly 50,000 residents.

The beltway did not benefit Palm Bay residents at the expense of other neighbors, and aquaculture does not benefit individuals at the expense of river quality. I have rarely seen two such positive proposals receive so little objective debate and coverage.

demonstrated in experimental studies. This positive effect appears to be due
to various flavonoid components in hawthorn that cause the relaxation of the

smooth muscle that surrounds the artery.

Improvement in heart metabolism has also been demonstrated in humans and animals to whom hawthorn extracts have been given. The improvement is a result not only of increased blood and oxygen supply to the heart muscle, but also of hawthorn flavonoids interacting with key enzymes.

To summarize, Hawthorn extracts have exhibited a combination of effects that are a great value to sufferers of angina or other heart problems. The dosage depends on the type of preparation and source material. Standardized extracts, similar to those used in Europe, are available commercially in the United States at health-food stores. These extracts are the preferred form. The dosage for hawthorn extract standardized to contain 1.8 percent vitexin-4'-rhamnoside or 10 percent procyanidins is 100 to 250 milligrams three times daily.
