FROM THE LOFT

Square dancing is at its zenith now. We are having large crowds at our regular dances with all the winter dancers here now. We sure do enjoy having them all "home" again. We hope each of you are having as much fun being here as we have having you here!

Did you see the February '96 Smithsonian? There is an eight page feature on square dancing at the 44th

National Square Dance Convention. The photos are beautiful and the write-up very informative in delineating the differences from what square dancing was and now is. Need to find a way to get this information into the hands of the general public. Would not hurt our recruiting efforts at all!

Some of our clubs are hurting! Like countries, clubs fail from within, not from without. Decay causes club failure. The last few issues of the BARN OWL had articles on Club Erosion. I don't know if these articles were read or not. The point is that all of the problems discussed were problems from within. If a country is attacked from without, it becomes stronger. The Yellow Rockers were about broke. Attendance was down to 1 and 2 squares. They were attacked from the outside. Our identity was threatened, our customs were challenged, our fellowship was ridiculed. What happened? The members joined together and did what was necessary to survive. As a result the Yellow Rockers are now a thriving club. Clubs need to pull together. If we try to blame someone else for the problems, the real cause of "Club Decay" will get worse. Ignoring a problem does not make it go away or cause it to get better. We can say the same thing about square dancing in general. If we display excitement, others will want to become part of the group. Enthusiasm is contagious. It will spread as quickly as the disease of decay. History has shown that countries fall from within. The same is true of all organizations. It starts with no one accepting responsibility. It grows as we fail to welcome visitors to our activities. It reaches full bloom when we don't grow by getting folks to join our activity. Where do YOU stand? Is square dancing an important part of your life? Is it enjoyable? Do you try to contribute to the club activities? When called upon do you respond gladly? A vibrant, growing organization has many people contributing. It may be only bringing refreshments. It may be being receptive to serving as an officer. It may be the important contribution of being an angel for a new class. Do you support the class so that the new dancers will become ambassadors in recruiting more new dancers? Remember, our new dancers know folks you don't. They can supply the new blood that is necessary for not only the survival of our clubs but for their growth. If you think square dancing is important, than your enthusiasm will be felt by others and our clubs will grow. We can not and must not blame the outside forces for what we bring upon ourselves!

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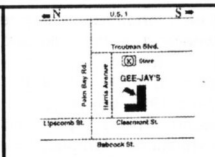

Why Go To 'BIG' Dances?

With Spring fast approaching we thought this would be a good time to discuss big dances and why we think it is a good idea to attend.

One of the most obvious differences we notice at a convention or festival is the number of dancers. One of these events can have from several hundred to several thousand dancers. Just imagine 2000 or 20,000 dancers all at one dance at the same time. What a sight!

Another feature of these big events is the number of callers and cuers on the staff. These events typically have four, five or more callers and two or more cuers. This staff provides a wide variety of calling/cueing styles. The large crowds typically bring an extra excitement to the dance.

The Florida State Convention is held each year, over the Memorial Day weekend, in the Lakeland Convention center in Lakeland, Florida (about 1.5 hours from Melbourne). In 1997 the National Square Dance Convention will be held in Orlando at the Orange County Convention Center. This event, in June 1997, will bring over 20,000 dancers, callers, and cuers from all over the world. This 3 day convention will feature dancing, workshops, fashion shows, exhibitions, demonstrations, and MUCH, MUCH more. This is the premier square dance event of the year.

The advantages of attending these large square dance events include the opportunity to meet new friends from far-way places, the opportunity to dance to some very fine callers and cuers, and to share in the excitement of a gathering of this size.

If you haven't yet thought about attending one of these big square dance happenings, we encourage you to start thinking about the Florida State Convention on Memorial Day weekend (May 24 - 26, 1996) in Lakeland and the National Square Dance Convention in June 1997 in Orlando. Both of these events will be great fun with several thousand dancers attending. Another big festival in our area (Lakeland) is the Sunshine Festival held each January in

WORD STUDY OF THE WORD

FORGIVE - The dictionary gives the following: 1. To excuse for a fault or an offense; pardon. 2. To renounce anger or resentment against. 3. To absolve from payment of (a debt, for example).

In the Bible, the words forgive and forgiven have the same meanings. I think that these meanings will surprise you and they have a far more reaching connotation than we are familiar with. The word not only carries the normal meaning of "forgive" from the dictionary definition above, but goes on to a very real active aspect. The first usage of the word "forgive" in the Bible is in Genesis 50:17. (5375) "So shall ye say unto Joseph, Forgive, I pray thee now, the trespass of thy brethren, and their sin; for they did unto thee evil: and now, we pray thee, forgive the trespass of the servants of the God of thy father."

The literal meaning of this word "forgive" is as follows: Accept, advance, arise, bear up, bring forth, cast, contain, desire, ease, exact, exalt, extol, furnish, give, help, hold up, lay, lift up, magnify, respect, spare, yield.

Consider the importance of this word in the sense of God saying He will "forgive our sins" and Jesus asking God to "Forgive them in that they know not what they do." The word becomes active, rather than passive. It becomes a positive healing word rather than one of a passive yielding to an outside force. Forgiveness can become the healing force instead of the start of a healing. We are not always going to be able to change the situation. We can not expect to change an individual to our liking. We can not expect things to always go as we desire or think they should. If our use of the word "forgive" is to just be the "dictionary" definition, then we can not expect much positive to come from the "forgiveness". On the other hand, if we take the definition as given in God's Word, then the act of forgiveness is an on-going active event that will result in real and lasting changes. This will be true of not only our interaction with others but in our interaction in our activities. Think of the times in your own life when you forgave someone in the "dictionary" sense of the word, and then we had it all to do over again. If, on the other hand, the positive - active - aspects of the word had been applied to the lives or actively involved, real, positive change could have resulted. Of course, we know which is easier. The "dictionary" definition is far easier to apply and does not really require much effort on our part. In fact, that is considered the noble thing to do. The problem is, that in all aspects of our lives, going half way really doesn't get the job done. Many times, going half way makes matters worse. The next time something happens, no matter how insignificant, that requires "forgiveness" try to apply the Biblical definition of the word to the situation and see if a lasting solution doesn't come forth.

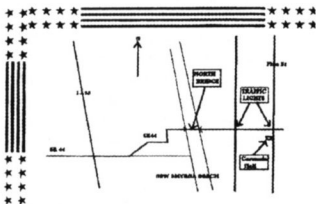

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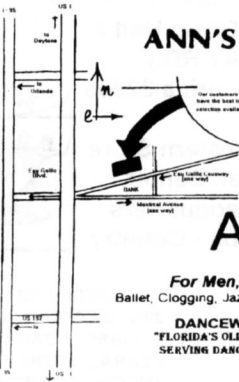

Natural Alternatives to Prostate Medications

Saw Palmetto Berry Extract

Saw palmetto (*Serenoa repens*) is a small scrubby palm tree native to the West Indies and the Atlantic Coast of North America from South Carolina to Florida. It bears berries that have a long history of use in folk medicine as an aphrodisiac and sexual rejuvenator. These berries have also been used for centuries in treating conditions of the prostate. In recent clinical studies, the therapeutic effect of the fat-soluble extract of saw palmetto berries has been shown to greatly improve the signs and symptoms of an enlarged prostate. The purified fat-soluble extract is a well-defined medicinal plant extract containing between 85 and 95 percent fatty acids and sterols.

Like Proscar, the therapeutic effect of the saw palmetto extract appears to be due to its inhibition of dihydrotestosterone, the compound that causes prostate cells to multiply excessively. However, the Saw Palmetto extract goes well beyond Proscar in that it not only inhibits the formation of dihydrotestosterone, but also inhibits its binding at cellular binding sites. Since Proscar has no effect on blocking the binding of dihydrotestosterone, saw palmetto has much greater antagonizing effects on dihydrotestosterone in the prostate than does Proscar. SAW PALMETTO VERSUS PROSCAR

weeks. In contrast, Proscar is effective in reducing the symptoms in less than 50 percent of patients after taking the drug for one year. To illustrate saw palmetto extract's superiority over Proscar, let's look at the effect of both on the maximum urine flow rate, a good indicator of bladder neck obstruction due to an enlarged prostate. The following data is based on pooled information on saw palmetto extract from studies on Proscar found in the Physicians' Desk Reference.

Table 1 Saw Palmetto Versus Proscar on Urine Flow Rate (milliliters per second)

	Saw Palmetto Extract	Proscar
Initial measurement	09.53 ml/sec	09.6 ml/sec
3 months	13.15 ml/sec	10.4 ml/sec
12 months	not measured	11.2 ml.sec
% increase	38% in 3 mo.	16% in 12 mo.

Clearly, the saw palmetto extract is superior to Proscar. It is also significantly less expensive, as it is at least one fourth the price compared with Proscar. Unfortunately, most men with BPH will never hear about the saw palmetto berry extract. Merck has the FDA to thank for that. Despite saw palmetto extract's clear superiority over Proscar, in 1990 the FDA rejected an application to have saw palmetto approved in the treatment of BPH. The result is that even though saw palmetto extract is more effective, less expensive, and much safer than Proscar, manufacturers and distributors of the extract cannot make any claims for their product. In Europe, *Serenoa repens* extracts are widely prescribed by physicians as medicines. In the United States, *Serenoa repens* extracts identical to those used in Europe are available in health-food stores as "food supplements," and no health claims can be made. As a result, very few men know about this natural alternative.

Dosage instructions for saw palmetto: The dosage of fat-soluble saw palmetto extract standardized to contain 85 to 95 percent fatty acids and sterols is 160 milligrams twice daily. If you want the best results, make sure you are using the right extract at the right dosage. Saw palmetto extract is completely safe--no significant side effects have ever been reported in the clinical trials of the extract or with saw palmetto berry ingestion. Detailed toxicology studies on the extract have been carried out on mice, rats, and dogs and indicate that the extract has no toxic effects.

HOMEOPATHY

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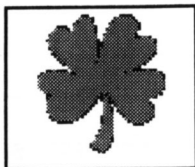
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
