Jack and Zonie Taylor

Jack Taylor was from Rhode Island and graduated from Coventry High School in 1948. Jack danced the Eastern style of square dancing during his high school days. After graduation, joined the Air Force and retired in 1969. During the late 1960's returned to square dancing in Mississippi and met Zonie. They were married in 1969. They were active in several clubs in the Mississippi area. The clubs included the Magnolia Swingers, to which they were charter members, Jets and Jennys at Keesler AFB and the Belles and Bouys in Gulfport, Mississippi. Jack and

Zonie were decoration and Special Events Chairman for the Magnolia Swingers. They also represented the Magnolia Swingers in a Mardi Gras Pageant. They attended the National Square Dance Convention in New Orleans in 1971, and shortly after they dropped out of square dancing. They returned to square dancing in the fall of 1982 in Florida and have been very active since. They have performed in many areas of leadership.

They were members of the Sun Dancers of Titusville and served as Board Members and vice-presidents. They were presidents of the Sun Dancers in 1984-85. During this time a Brevard council was formed to improve square dancing. They served as active members and were presidents before the Council was disbanded.

Jack and Zonie joined and became active in the Central Florida Association of Square and Round Dances in 1982. They served as Directors of the CFA from 1984 until 1987. They were appointed to the vice-presidents position of the Central Association. During this time period joined the USDA sponsored by Howard Wilson. They were presented the Circle of Service in May of 1986. They were Presidents of the Central Florida Association 1988-89. In May of 1989 they were presented a plaque as Couple of the Year from the Central Florida Association. While serving as president of the Central Florida Association Jack and Zonie became involved in the History of the Federation. In 1990 they were elected to the position as Historians for the Federation. They represented Florida at the USDA meeting in place of Leo Richardson in Anaheim, California. They

LINE DANCING AT THE BARN

So, you're feeling blue. It's Joe and Maggie's last Wednesday line dance session at THE BARN (May 1st) before their departure to Boston. Put on your thinking caps and let's make our alphabetical list for our top 10 dances Joe taught us. I keep updating mine! Please start that daily practice and stay fit till they return the last of October. Go for it! You can do it.

Achy Breaky is my current # 1 choice. It starts with an 8 count right heel down, left, r, l; r out in, l out in, l pivot turn to back, 2 pokas, l pivot turn front, 2 polkas, and 2 4 count jazzy boxes. Besamemucho gets my vote from the B list for #2. Joe describes it as a basic rhumba. Here's your chance to get a right box and left in, plus 2 two steps forward then 2 more boxes, 2 two steps back, a right vine... step r, l behind, st r, cross l over r, l and step out r and drag l; repeat vine and step drag on left side; with 8 count turn around: step front on r, rock back on l, 1/4 turn st r, rock l, tu front on a 4 count sway r 5 l 6 r 7 l 8! Crystal Chandelier takes third place. Left basic, right basic, repeat. 2 scissors: st l together r, cross l over r; st r tog l, crass r over l, repeat on both sides, 2 basic steps fwd, 2 basic steps bk, box fwd, box bk, repeat box steps! D goes to Drinkin' Champagne! As Joe taught us Happy Feet r, 123 rock recover, 2 fwd polkas, Happy Feet l, 2 fwd polkas, 2 count r vine with cha cha cha turn, l v, walk around r on 4 counts, walk back 4. End of dance. How about Just Loving You for # 5? l 2 2 steps fwd 1/2 box fwd rovk recover, 2 2 steps bk 1/2 box r bk ro re, 2 st fwd, l pivot turn bk 2 st, pivot tu frt, cut (cross) l over r 1, 2 r, 3 l, cut r over l. That's it! King of The Road, the very first basic dance as Joe says, is # 6. It starts with a r basic fwd, 123 touch; basic back, repeat r a l basics. Then b r, b l, meringue to r - 8 counts - step together & touch on 8; b l b r, mer l. We're on our way rejoicing! Rock and Roll Angel gets 7th place. 2 basic vines r & l, repeat. Step out in on r, repeat on l, 2 r kick ball change ... kick r ball r change l, march in place with a wiggle to 1234, 2 r ki ba ch, 1/4 turn r 234. Got it! Stand By Your Man rates # 8 on my current list. Easy does it! Box r and l, skate r & l, 2 st bk, 2 st fwd, turn r in 2 st to back, & 1 more 2 st to complete dance! Trashy Woman coming up next for #9, and a change of pace. Fan r 1234, then a star 8: 2 heel r front, 2 toe r back, 1 heel front, 1 heel back, st out r, slap r foot behind with left hand (if you can); basic r, l, front, b turn, bk & r stamp. That's it! Yankee Turnabout (also known as John's Dance) completes my top 10. It begins with a l basic with a stomp! tu r with a 1/4 turn, st l, st r, kick l, rock l r l lift r & turn, rock r l r, l step lift, r st li! Keep on dancing.

Thanks Joe & Maggie for making line dancing fun, & for your talented teaching partnership. See you in the fall.

And in 1994 when we told them we expected at least 500 dancers to attend our Pre-Convention - or "Pre-Cee" as it came to be called - they laughed and said It couldn't be done!!

But we not only did It but we exceeded even our own expectation when on March 5 - 10 we hosted 732 dancers from twenty-one states, at the 46th NSDC Pre-Convention at the Orlando Hyatt Hotel. And we didn't stop there - we had more then 1600 in attendance at the Saturday Night Ball. (Count 'em folks - that's over 200 squares!) These numbers exceed by far any previous Pre-Convention ever held, proving yet again that when Florida sets out to do something, we do it in grand style!

On Thursday morning attendees were taken on a Magical Tour around Walt Disney World properties. Dancers were given the opportunity to 'visit' the lobbies of some of the finest hotels on the East Coast (when I win the, lottery I intend to spend a night in one of those \$1500. rooms) and were free to browse through the souvenir shops before enjoying a lunch, specifically planned for the dancers, at one of Disney's Restaurants. BettyLee Talmedge and her crew of tour guides are to be commended for making this tour both educational and entertaining.

Following a delicious dinner on Thursday evening, attendees attired in 1920's fashion courted Lady Luck at the gaming tables of the Monte Carlo Night. Although some went home with prizes, everyone was a winner by virtue of the fellowship shared by one and all.

On Friday everyone got the opportunity to tour the awesome Orange County Convention Center. If you were not among the group taking this tour you have a pleasant surprise in store in June 1997 when you see the S-P-A-C-E dedicated to dance floors!

Attendees were treated to sumptuous dinner on Friday evening, followed by the legerdemain of a magician brought in just for this occasion. Everyone paid strict attention but none were able to catch on to any of his tricks. Nan Carrier had a few tricks of her own when she was called up on stage, but even she wasn't able to detect how it was done.

The committee breakout meetings on Saturday morning were followed by a

Throughout the entire Pre-Cee, Dave & Shirley Nihart and the Registration & Housing Committee could be found converting Early Birds and registering dancers for the 46th NSDC, resulting in a total of 1446 dancers being registered for the 1997 Convention.

And thus ends the biggest and best Pre-Convention in the History of National Square Dance Conventions. All participants are to be congratulated on the fine job they did in bringing this event to the dancers of the nation. Special



recognition goes to our General Chairmen Worley & Nan Carrier and to Assistant General Chairmen Duke & Doris McCleskey. An extra Yellow Rock to Duke & Doris. Without their planning and hard work this great event could never have taken place. **And they said it couldn't be done!!**

FROM THE BARN KITCHEN

FRESH VEGETABLE PIZZA

2 (8-oz) cans Pillsbury refrigerated Quick Crescent Dinner Rolls
1 Cup Dairy Sour Cream
1 to 2 Tablespoons Kraft Prepared Horseradish
1/4 teaspoon salt
1/8 teaspoon pepper
2 cups fresh mushrooms, chopped
1 cup chopped tomatoes
1 cup small broccoli florets
1/2 cup chopped green pepper
1/2 Onions



Heat oven to 375° F. Separate dough into 4 long rectangles. Place rectangles crosswise in ungreased 15 x 10 inch jelly roll pan. Press over bottom and 1 inch up sides to form crust. Seal perforations. Bake at 375° F for 14 to 19 minutes or until golden brown. Let cool completely.

In small bowl combine sour cream, horseradish, salt and pepper. Blend until smooth. Spread evenly over cooled crust. Top with mushrooms, tomatoes, broccoli, green peppers and onions. Cut into appetizer pieces. Refrigerate leftovers. Makes 60 appetizers.

BREVARD GOVERNMENT IN ACTION

A recent article in the Orlando Sentinel described a traveling exhibit throughout the country of "Dick and Jane: Illustrations of an American Education". It is a historical exhibit of the "Dick and Jane" readers published by Scott-Foresman Publishing and used to teach "whole word", or "look-say" reading skills to millions of American students,

Forty years ago Dr. Rudolph Flesch, in his book entitled "Why Johnny Can't Read", described the problems associated with the whole word" methods and why the system it replaced, that of phonics instruction, was superior. The "look-say" method still became a tidal wave in education, and the results today seem to bear out the warnings of Dr. Flesch.

Employers are concerned that basic reading skills have to be taught to employees. The military began using training manuals written more in the style of comic books. Community colleges and even our universities enroll thousands of high school graduates in remedial reading courses. Over 90% of the letters sent to my office from students contains at least one spelling error.

The article states that "Unlike Dick and Jane's predecessors - the long-winded, moralistic McGuffey Readers, which included text only selections from Dickens, Shakespeare, Longfellow and Emerson - the new readers had pictures, a breakthrough." It goes on to state how the look-say method was implemented using a controlled vocabulary, the "See spot run! Run, Spot, run!" simplistic repetitive writing that many of us suffered through.

Perhaps a better article would be one highlighting the ill effects these Dick and Jane readers have wrought on our nation, and considering the problems with crime and illiteracy, one which called for a return to the "long-winded, moralistic McGuffey Readers and the phonics instruction which had been so successful.

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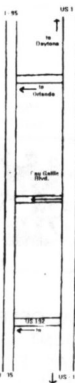
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Dominic Mallozzi
