## **SOUND ENHANCEMENT BENEFIT DANCE**

### **“TACKY TOURIST DANCE”**

Search the back corners of your closet and the deep dark recesses of your drawers and mark your calendar for Sat., November 9th. This is the date of a benefit costume dance with nothing to sew and nothing to buy! The theme will be a "TACKY TOURIST DANCE", so somewhere you already have the perfect costume in your possession! Prizes will be awarded for the best "TACKY TOURIST" outfit! Use your imagination, find your zaniest T-shirt and hat and come looking your tackiest!

This benefit dance is to purchase a sound enhancement system for the permanent use and enjoyment of all the dancers at "THE BARN". Reaching our goal of \$800 - \$1,000 will enable us to purchase a transmitter and three to five personal receivers.

A sound enhancement system consists of a transmitter and several small receivers to be worn by those who are hard of hearing, The calls are sent directly to the receivers and into the small ear pieces worn by the dancers. This eliminates distracting and extraneous outside noises that interfere with hearing the calls in those who are hearing impaired. The receivers would then be signed out to dancers on a nightly basis. Some dancers may already own or would like to purchase their own receivers to use at "THE BARN" and elsewhere.

Jerry and Del Reed, Dale and Carolyn McClary and Colin and Peggy Walton are callers for the event and will be donating time and talent. Otis and Linda Lutz have donated the use of "THE BARN" for the evening. Cues to be announced at a later date.

We need volunteer couples to help brain-storm ideas and to decorate on the night of the event. Please, contact Jerry and Del if you would like to help with this worthy effort.

The word "religion" is used 4 times in the Bible and all in the New Testament. The word "religious" is used two times, also in the New Testament. Acts 26: 5. Paul says ""That after the most straitest sect of our religion I lived a Pharisee". In this case, the word "religion" comes from 2356 which means ceremonial observance. James 1: 26-27

26: If any man among you seem to be religious, and bridleth not his tongue, but deceiveth his own heart, this man's religion is vain.

27: Pure religion and undefiled before God and the Father is this: to visit the fatherless and widows in their affliction, and to keep oneself unspotted from the world.

How can we then say that one religion is better than the other? Can't everyone take care of the fatherless and widows?

Fatherless comes from 3737 and means "bereaved, orphan or parentless, and comfortless." Widows means (5503) deficiency and without husband.

In other words, if we have pure religion, one that is undefiled before God, we will simply do what we have delegated to the government to do for us. We have done so much of this 'delegation' that we can put from our minds the things we ought to do. We can hide in the 'ceremonial' aspects of 'religion', observing what man has directed and all the time think we are better than someone else because of our "religious" affiliation. Since '94, there is a public perception of retreat from those programs..of bowing to media mauling.

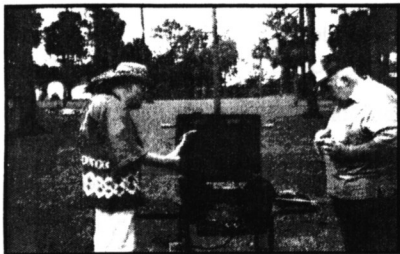

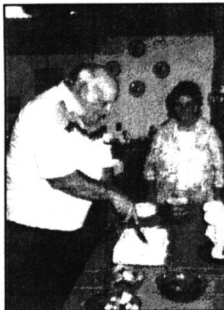


Dale's birthday! It was his *σιξτηψ σεχονδ!* I think that is how Dale told it. In any case, Happy Birthday, Dale.

1 can Pillsbury Chocolate Fudge Creamy Supreme frosting

1 cup chunky peanut butter

1 egg

# NATURAL ALTERNATIVES TO OVER THE COUNTER AND PRESCRIPTION DRUGS

## Hawthorn (*Crataegus Oxyacantha*)

Hawthorn extracts are widely used by physicians in Europe and Asia to reduce blood pressure, angina attacks, and serum cholesterol levels. The mild blood pressure-lowering effects of hawthorn extracts have been demonstrated in many experimental and clinical studies.<sup>1,2</sup> Hawthorn's action in lowering blood pressure is quite unique, in that it does so through a combination of many diverse actions. Specifically, it dilates the larger blood vessels, inhibits ACE similarly to the drug captopril, increases the functional capacity of the heart, and possesses mild diuretic activity.

The dosage of hawthorn depends on the type of preparation and source material. Standardized extracts available in American health-food stores are the preferred form for medicinal purposes. The dosage for a hawthorn extract (standardized to contain 1.8 percent vitexin-4'-rhamnoside or 10 percent procyanidins) would be 100 to 250 milligrams three times daily. Unlike synthetic drugs, hawthorn extracts are without side effects and are extremely well tolerated.

The blood pressure-lowering effects of hawthorn extracts generally require up to two weeks before manifesting themselves. It appears this time is necessary to achieve adequate tissue concentrations of the flavonoids.

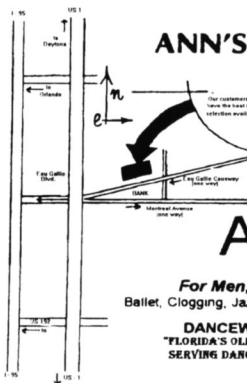

## BREVARD GOVERNMENT IN ACTION

The Brevard county commission met on August 1 to set the tentative millage (tax rate) for the upcoming fiscal year. This millage may be adjusted downward in subsequent meetings, but cannot be raised. The Board voted 3-2 (Cook and Ellis dissenting) to establish a millage which is a shade less than last year. The dissenting Commissioners had supported a slightly greater reduction.

During this budget cycle the Commission has held countless meetings, many lasting all day, to determine where your tax dollars will be spent. New expenses this year include \$600,000 to operate the new wings of the minimum security facility and nearly \$900,000 in additional State mandated Medicaid costs. The Commission is revising the budget to account for these additional expenditures by cutting elsewhere in other departments.

Large expenditures for this year include additional equipment for maintaining ditches and canals in order to work through the backlog of flooding problems. Stormwater projects requiring capital outlays, as well as large drainage basin studies, are planned to further work on flooding problems in the Melbourne/Eau Gallie/West Melbourne area.

Overall, the County Commission has worked together to avoid a tax increase. Thanks to the new charter amendment passed last March, capping property tax increases at 3% (or the inflation factor), the County Commission is now one elected body which cannot greatly raise taxes at will. This County Commission has made a commitment for the last three years not to raise taxes, and despite our other disagreements, this line has been held.
