

This dance was held on Sunday December 13 from 2:00 - 4:00 Maybe this was a bad time. After all there was a football game going on at the same time. We had wonderful support from nearly four squares of round & square dancers. (I'm sorry, did he SQUARES???? -YUPI SQUARES!!) This is less than the number of dancers at most

regular dances in this area during this time of year. Maybe this is a sign of the times. Maybe there are too many times when we are asked to help others. Maybe there are many other reasons for not helping a seemingly worthy cause.

What could be the reasons? Maybe people did not know about the dance?? Maybe Sunday afternoon is not a good time for a dance?? Maybe most dancers have already given their far share to the kids?? Maybe dancers do not want to support the ECCA dances?? Maybe dancers do not want to support the Salvation Army?? Maybe people do not think a "TOYS FOR KIDS" dance to collect toys & money is a good idea?? Maybe

We were very proud to be part of the staff for this dance along with Dale & Carolyn Mc Clary, John & Gail Swindle, Royce & Carol Arter, Vince & Camille Furtado, and Otis & Linda Lutz. We were also VERY proud of the

news releases you've just read demonstrate, can mean the difference between life and death to your loved ones.

When I contracted a crippling, incurable disease early in life, I used every available conventional medical and alternative healing method over the course of many years without success. Then there's the research into wounds and burns using urea (the primary solid component or urine). As only one research study among many reported: "In America, urea has been used for the treatment of various infected wounds and it has been found to be extremely efficient...ever the deepest wound can be treated effectively.... Urea treatment has been successful where other treatments have failed. For external staph infections we found urea preferable to any other dressing...there are no contra-indications to its use." (Dr. L. Muldavis, 1938, Royal Free Hospital, London). As far back as 1954, the Journal of the American Medical Association (July issue reported that "More scientific papers have probably been published on urine than on any other organic compound." 

entific literature in one single year." All this fuss about a substance that we're told is nothing more than a body waste?

As you read over this extraordinary list of nutritional elements, you can begin to understand why the stories you may have heard of people surviving on their own urine are true. But what about other elements in urine that you've heard about?

FROM THE BARN KITCHEN

Pat's Pralines

Ingredients:

1 and 1/2 cups granulated sugar.

1 cup of firmly packed light brown sugar.

1/2 cup firmly packed dark brown sugar.

Pinch of salt. 2/3 cup milk.

1/2 cup heavy cream.

4 tablespoons butter or margarine.

1 teaspoon vanilla.

I and 1/2 cups of coarsely broken pecans.

Directions

Combine sugars, salt, milk, cream, butter, and vanilla in a heavy pan.

Stir to dissolve sugar then bring to a boil. Boil until mixture forms a soft ball when dropped into cold water or when it reaches a temperature of 238 degrees if using a sugar thermometer.

Remove from the heat and allow to cool for one minute. Then add pecans and beat with a wooden spoon until the mixture turns creamy.

Immediately drop small spoonfuls onto buttered foil or wax paper. The mixture will harden as it cools. If this happens before all the pralines are shaped, add 1 to 2 tablespoons of hot water to mixture still in the pan.

Note: to keep a long time, wrap individually in foil tightly and store in a tight container.

Living is John 3:16, "For God so loved the World that He gave His only begotten Son.."


Go out and share that love with those you love and with people who are looking for someone to love them.




