


Entrance to the SEW & SAVE Hall.

### **FLAG ETIQUETTE**

We wrote this article a couple of years ago and it has been the one which has received the most comments. We would like to make it available again. Let us know what you think.

Many square dance events include playing the national anthem with or without the pledge to the flag. We have often wondered about the proper way to show respect for the flag during these times. While in the Navy and in uniform, there was never any doubt. Now that I am a civilian, I are not so sure.

This month we would explore this important subject. We read the following in a recent issue of Shift Colors, the newsletter sent to Navy retirees. We hope it will help you as much as it did us.

Our nation's flag is to be respected, never defaced or scorned. There are appropriate ways to show respect in the presence of the Flag.

During the ceremony of hoisting or lowering the flag or when the flag is passing in a parade or in a review, everyone should face and stand at attention with their right hand over their heart. Military members who are present and in uniform should render the military salute.

When not in uniform, remove your hat (if wearing one) with your right hand and hold it at the left shoulder, the hand being over the heart. Citizens of other countries should stand at attention. The salute to the flag in a moving Column (such as a parade) should be rendered at the moment the flag passes. If walking, stop, turn toward the flag and stand at attention with your right hand over your heart.

When the flag is displayed during the playing of the national anthem, all present, except those in uniform should stand at attention facing the flag with right hand placed over the heart. If not in uniform, remove your hat (if wearing one) with your right hand and hold it at the left shoulder, the hand being over the heart. Persons in uniform stand and render the military salute. The salute begins at the first note of the anthem and should be held until the last note is played. When the flag is not displayed, those present should face the music and act in the same manner they would if the flag were displayed there.

We are interested in your thoughts about this custom, let us know what you think. We also hope this information has helped you as much as it has us.

# SKIP SMITH, CALLER

On Sunday, April 25, 1999, Central Florida and the Square Dance Community lost a dear friend and square dance caller. He will be missed by dancers here, throughout this country and throughout the world.

He and his beloved spouse Pauline were married for 49 years and were constant companions in all their endeavors. They were very rarely apart. They had three children, Dennis who resides in Massachusetts, Darlene and Eileen who reside in Brevard County. The have 7 grandchildren and 2 great-grandchildren. They also raised foster children for 10 years.

Skip attended High School in Dalton Massachusetts dropped out but graduated after being married. He spent some time in the Navy and was separated just before the Korean Conflict. During his younger years he played the guitar with a small group and his idols were Jim Reeves and Hank Williams. In fact after being married they went on a vacation to see and hear them. Pauline said that Skip serenaded her during their courtship singing and playing the guitar.

Skip worked as a machinist as well as calling part time. When he decided to call full time he had to quit this occupation.

He taught a square dancer College Course at Worcester State Teachers College. He also called for Senior Citizen Groups and a Mentally challenged children's group. He held callers' Schools for several years in the Worcester Area. Skip and Pauline had a traveling club. "Fairweather Squares" for 25 years. He called in Canada and Bermuda. He called at 2 of the German American Festivals in Germany. He also called at many Aloha Hawaiian State conventions. He also toured in England, Austria, Holland, Switzerland and attended many U.S. Conventions. He was a Charter Member of Callerlab, a member of the Moose and ASCAP/BMI. Skip was also a member of many Caller Associations.

Skip had a closed Club named "Eiffel Squares" before the square dance lists were formed and had this club doing all calls that were available to dancers at that time. We met a couple at one of the National Square Dance Conventions and they told us to ask Skip about their club. This was a nice experience for us.

Skip and Pauline moved to Florida in 1979 and he was very well received, he had many calling opportunities in the local area. He took over as the club Caller for the Twirlaways and called there until the Club disbanded. He called many years at Merritt Island, Advanced and Challenge. In Titus-





### Fellow dancers

We are Otis and Linda Lutz in Melbourne, Florida. We have started Danceworld and, with your help, will make this the finest facility in the world devoted to clean, wholesome family dancing.

Let me tell you where we are now.

We have a wonderful building of over 5,000 square feet dedicated to square, round and line dancing. We have a 2800 square foot parquet hardwood floor in the main dance hall and a smaller parquet hardwood dance hall in the same building. The air, sound and acoustics are perfect. We have easy access to hotels, motels and restaurants in the area. Easy access to Danceworld is via the Melbourne International Airport, which is located about six miles away, or via I-95, with an exit only 1.2 miles from our facility. We already have a family park of over four acres for camping and picnics.

A dance facility has been designed for the next phase of dance world. A 100 x 150 x 20 foot high dance facility which will dance over 1,000 dancers is being planned. This is in addition to 120 dancers we can dance in our existing facilities.

We are well known not only in our county and Florida, but throughout the United States and indeed, throughout the world. We currently have over 3,000 members of "THE BARN DANCERS", a non-profit corporation registered in the State of Florida. We also have an Internet presence on the World Wide Web at www.danceworld. org.


We are having very good success in getting new dancers to our classes. In the last six months we have had over 200 new dancers come to the facilities for lessons. We have line-dancing lessons on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday during the day. On Tuesday and Wednesday evenings we have square dance lessons. Thursday evening, before club dancing, we have round dance lessons in our present facilities, all of this in our present facilities. We have reached the point where we have requests for more activities than can be scheduled. We feel that now is a time to expand our facilities.

We need help in this new effort. The new facilities main hall will dance over 400 people and will feature a parquet hardwood floor. The floor is being designed so that it will consist of 50 squares. Each square is readily identified by its inlaid pattern. We are asking for 50 people or groups of people, clubs or corporations to purchase a square for \$5,000 dollars. This will provide about one-third the funds needed to build the facility.

Whose facilities is this?

Linda and I are placing the complete facilities into a trust so that when we die, the complex will continue as it is today, a place built for dancers by dancers. The facility presently consists of a 5200 square foot dance facility, a maintenance garage, a


