



The above exchange points out just a few of the many positive facets of this wonderful activity we enjoy so much. It does keep our mind active as



These two functions are required and make the dance run smoothly. If the president has to constantly beg someone to do these jobs it becomes a thorn in his bonnet. It is more of a stress than anything else. He says, "I don't need this aggravation", and we lose a candidate for office for the next year. What is happening in the square dance community is not unique to this organization. It happens in every organization. We

can eliminate the problem by all pitching in and doing our part. A club with 52 couples as members should only require a couple to do the kitchen once a year and the same goes for host and hostess. Can two weeks a year be so bad? It is not like it is for the whole night. The host and hostess hardest part of the evening is to arrive a little early so they will be there to greet all the dancers as they arrive. I really like being a host as you do get to greet the dancers. Linda and I do that at every dance we attend. We even make sure that at clubs we visit that we greet everyone there. It is one of the main reasons that we dance. We like being around the people. I really don't call that a job. It is fun. The kitchen job is not as much fun. You have to make sure there is water, cups, napkins, spoons and coffee available. You may miss a round or a tip as you make sure the supplies are replenished during the dance. On raids, where refreshments are provided, a little more time is required. One of the duties of the kitchen job is to see that the hall is cleaned after the dance. All cups must be thrown out, food put away and tables and chairs returned to the position they were in when the dance began. Again, if every member of the club will do their fair share, then you would only do it once a year. That is not too rough. It is better than visiting the dentist once a year - and it is not nearly so expensive. Come on dancers, do your fair share. We could more easily get volunteers for the offices if we all did our fair share.

Again this year the reports on new classes are not too encouraging. We must turn this around. We can not think that one day we will wake up and see large classes. We must all work to make it happen. It should be a year round event. Maybe you could take a friend to dinner and have them join you at a dance to see the fun they could have. I personally think the free 10 weeks of lessons is a good investment in our activity. Any businessman will spend a lot of money on advertisement. He must sell his product. The main contributor to the activity should be the caller. The caller must look at new dancers as the lifeblood of his business. Without the dancers, he has no clientele. He would have no income.

Please see that THE BARN OWL receives a list of new officers and banner raid contacts. Make sure that you include the telephone number and the E-Mail address if there is one available. We get lots of calls requesting this information and it is nice to have it available. We would like to start the new year with a list of special dances that each club has planned for the year. 

St. Cloud..... The Wagon Wheel Square Dance Club celebrated their 30th Anniversary with a big party in October. Since we began, we've had twenty-six different presidents. Past President Georgia Blackburn was the first to be honored at the Anniversary Party. She and her husband Jesse were presidents the first half of 1979 and again in 1984 Mike Mikeal was president the last half of 1979 and again in the 90's, more about that later.

In 1981 the club found a very dedicated, hard working cou-

ple when Eddie and Bivian Williford were elected and these two are still at it. Bivian is the gracious lady who decorates our hall year after year after year. But Eddie is the one who has to climb the ladder to hang the decorations. The beautiful tree we have in the hall was Bivian's idea many years ago and without her talent our hall would be very dreary. Eddie and Bivian returned to office in 1985.

In 1986 - Art and Lois Pepkie became our presidents and during that year he added \$118.00 to the club's treasury by arranging for the club members to take a Coke tasting contest. The club received a dollar for everyone taking the test, plus they also gave the club a

huge ice cooler which eventually was raffled off and won by one of our members. Art and Lois returned to office in 1988.

In the year in between - in 1987 the couple that took the office that year is hard to describe. She is a sweetie and he's energetic and can he get a job done! The couple is non-other than George and Marge Newman. Many of us know George affectionally as hot dog."

Now we'll go back a few years to tell you about the last half of 1981, the first part of 1982, all of 1983, 1989, 1990, 1991 and 1992. These are the years Bev and Jack Whitney were presidents of the club. Bev handled all of the publicity for the club during those years and once she dressed Barbie and Ken in our club outfit and won accolades at the State and National Convention. Barbie and Ken were talked about by everyone - as being a great idea and other clubs followed and dressed dolls in their club outfits. Jack, during that time hired all the Guest Callers and Guest Cuers that were needed by the club. Jack continued working for the club in this capacity for another seven years. If you ever want to know anything about the Wagon Wheel Club - just ask Jack. He has records on everything you might think to ask about.

In 1993 we figured to give Jack and Bev a break and the club was very fortunate to get the Mayor of Ashton Junction (that's a spot in the road east of here) Mike Mikeal and his dancing partner Gladys Fender. That year Mike decided we needed to honor Dale on his birthday so Mike made him what he called a "fools cake" - it was a cement birthday cake, made and decorated by Mike. Mike also baked a real birthday cake.

In 1994 and 1995 the club was fortunate to get Bill and Pat Haskell as president. They set up a Knothead trip, the first one in years and so many of our dancers wanted to be a Knothead we filled two buses. That year the city decided to rehab our hall and we had to alternated between several halls to have our dances. Through it all, our caller Dale McClary held class even tho it was a very stressful time for all of us. Our Cuers Jan and Pete Shankle had their round dance class at the St. Cloud Civic Center, where there was NO air conditioning but always a large group of dancers. And our club lived thru it all.



Bill's and Otis's Most Excellent Adventure

"Hey Otis, I want to talk to you."

This was the start of an adventure that I had never even thought of, let alone considered.

Bill Ludwick and I have been friends for over 30 years. We are both engineers and retired and certainly not in great shape. I am over 20 pounds overweight and Bill is at least 30 pounds overweight. He is over six-foot tall and I am 5 - 7. A Mutt and Jeff.

"What do you want to talk about Bill?" I asked. He said he wanted me to go with him on the AT. I asked, "what is the AT Bill"? He said, "the Appalachian Trail!" I said "WOW"!

"Are you serious? We are in no shape for that." Bill said, "maybe you aren't but I walk every day." Bill is a member of the hiking club and he does 6 to 10 mile walks every week – at least twice.

Well I didn't have any idea of what we were talking about doing. So – I went to the computer and looked up the Appalachian Trail. It is located at a place called TRAILPLACE.COM. I still didn't know what was involved in "doing the AT".

As I studied the maps and trail logs on the site left by folks who had walked the AT, I found out that there are no motels or restaurants to utilize. Seems like everything you need to survive is carried on your back! There are not even any fountains or water faucets there. You have to find a stream or some such to get your water. And that may be well off the trail. I finally said to Bill that this may be a mistake to try this. Well Bill said he would go by himself if I didn't go with him.

What could I do? Bill was my friend and he was going to walk the AT. OK, I said - we will do it.

So in September, 1999, Bill and I planned to go for 7 days on the AT. We would start in Ga. And if all went well, we would make it to Haiwassee, Ga. where his son would pick us up. We would attempt to hike over 70 miles in the wilderness with only what we carried on our backs. The more we talked about it the better I liked the idea. Finally we made THE commitment. We went and bought our equipment that we would need. Bed rolls, sleeping bags that would enable us to survive in freezing temperatures, tents, back packs to carry our stuff in, water purifying system, stove, water bottles and, of course, food. It costs a lot to get outfitted to live in the wilderness for a week. More

than I thought it would. As Bill and I wanted to remain friends after the week on the AT, we decided to get separate tents. Bill said he really snored!

The last week of September I started trying to train for the "Walk In The Woods" by putting on my back pack with all my supplies in it and walk on my treadmill. Man did it take a long time for 15 minutes to pass – at 2.2 MPH with the treadmill set to maximum incline. I called Bill and told him that we might be able to complete the approach trail to the Appalachian Trail. This approach trial is 8 and ½ miles longs – all up a mountain. Maybe we could make it that far in a week. Up to the time on the tread mill – with the back pack – I had thought we could really hustle and make it to Fontana Dam – on the NC border – a distance of a 163.5 miles. This will take TWO weeks.

After one week on the treadmill I was up to 1 hour with the backpack on at 2.2 miles per hour – at full incline. I was very happy to tell Bill that it might be possible to get to Haiwassee in a week.

In order to provide a little security for us I bought a cell phone that I was assured would work anywhere in the US. I also had packed in my backpack a digital camera with 20 diskettes so we could take a lot of pictures to prove that we did it and to show what it is like. We plan to take lots of pictures to document this adventure and to show some of the great sites we will visit on this trip. Linda said she would expect a call after 2 days (or sooner)!

With all the equipment bought and packed in our back pack we were ready to start this adventure. How would it go? Would we really make it to Haiwassee? Is it possible to make it to Fontana Dam?

To check out our equipment and to see that we not only have it, but can use it, we plan to camp out on October 28th at the Earnest and Dallas Lutz Family Park at Danceworld in Melbourne, FL. This was our test to see if we had everything we needed and could use the equipment. This was the last opportunity to cancel this adventure. We had been studying the maps and collecting all the "stuff" we would need for this "most excellent adventure". It was nearly time to walk the walk after all the talking and planning we had done.

Could Bill and I do it? Can we survive without Linda and Pat? On this trip we not only have to do the things these wonderful wives do for us but we also have to find and purify our water. Build camp every night. Build a latrine. Hang all food from a tree to keep critters and bears out of it. Next month we will be able to tell you what happened on our Most Excellent Adventure.
