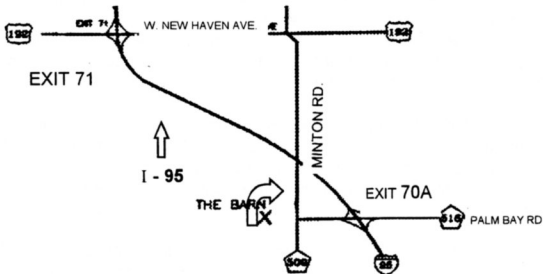

they see. Don't prejudice, just get those flyers out. Here at THE BARN we are starting a new 10/10 class on August 24th at 7:00 in the evening. We have nearly 4 squares pre-registered already. We have had flyers out for the last 2 months. In fact, we keep flyers out continuously.

There are many dancers and callers who feel that the free 10 weeks of lessons is bad. As a business proposition it makes sense to me. Consider this. Free lessons bring in 10 squares and we give them 10 weeks of free classes. We then charge 10 squares for an additional 20 weeks of lessons. Consider \$3.00 per person per lesson. We will have 80 dancers paying \$3.00 per week for 20 weeks or \$4800.00 in income. Now consider getting 2 squares for 30 weeks paying the same \$3.00 per person per lesson. This would give us \$90.00 times 16, or a total income of \$1440.00. Notice that \$4800.00 is more than \$1440.00. You may say that not all 10 squares stay for the 30 weeks and I say that not all 16 dancers stay for the 30 weeks. If we really believe that square dancing is fun if only people will try it, then what can possibly be wrong with giving the first 10 weeks free? Most clubs will give the first 2 weeks free anyway. That 2 weeks free was not even considered in the above calculations. Look at it like the Internet. All services will give you free 30 days on the Internet as they believe you will stay for the long haul. Linda and I believe that square dancers will also stay for the long haul. This is why we give the 10 weeks free. It is an investment in the future.

Many of you know and have been concerned about Jude Zrutskie. We have really good news to report to you. While at the convention in WI, Jude was there and she was eating. She looked much better and said that things were improving for her. We want to keep her in our thoughts and prayers. Terry and Jude are a wonderful couple to know and we all know Terry is a "Rip and Snort" kind of guy. He certainly worked hard here at THE BARN on the Memorial Hall and clearing the land for the Park. We certainly wish them the best. They will be returning in Oct. along with Kip and Linda Werner. We all welcome those two couples back in a square with us. Again, Kip and Linda, congratulations on a job well done with the fashion show. Your talents could be put to good use if Florida bids on another national convention as expected. It will give you something to do!

As we approach the Millennium ticket sales are going good and we do expect a sell out crowd. If you want to attend the last New Year's Dance of the Millennium, get your tickets now. A real party is planned for you with a great sit down dinner. We have a great lineup of callers for you and Phyllis Williams will do the rounds.

I have received an update on the Branson trip scheduled for October 25th. It is a real bargain at \$899. Per person. We need to get the paper work in as we may need to get two busses lined up. Brochures are available at THE

They are held at various locations so you do need to pick up a brochure which are available at all clubs. Try it, you will like it. The new area representative for the CFA in the South Brevard and Indian River Area is Sheila Cootes. Please support Sheila when she comes to see you. We need all dancers to join the CFA and help build a strong organization to present the State Convention and to build the blood bank and present square and round dancing to the general public. The cost is cheap and when you consider the insurance program, it is a real steal.

The youth group is progressing nicely. We have 2 squares dancing on Saturday morning at 10:00. We have been having new youth each week so we have now started requiring the new dancers to come at 9:30 so they can be taught the fundamentals before the regular class begins. We have hopes of having this group ready for the State Convention in Lakeland in 2000. We thank the dancers coming on Saturday morning to help us with this group. We thank Skip Clelland for filling in for us on the 7th of August while Linda and I were at the state convention in WI. On Saturday, August 14, we had 17 young people at our class. We had 8 present at 9:30 to get them started. On Saturday, August 21st, we met again at 9:30 for the new students and then after the 10:00 class we had a picnic in the park. It is a real pleasure meeting with these really fast learners. If you know of any young people that you would like to see get into this activity please invite them out for our 9:30 session on Saturday morning. We will be getting them in dance outfits shortly. We do hope to be doing demonstrations around the state by Christmas.

If you haven't done so yet, start inviting folks out for the new lessons that are about to begin at your club.

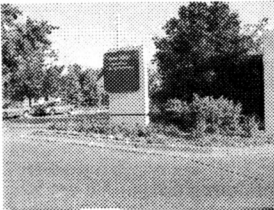
"Major Impact" are two words that are tossed around quite often these days. Many times, however, neither word is completely applicable. But.....Those two words are completely applicable when describing the "God Bless the USA" record. What started out as an idea to raise a little money for the Foundation has snowballed into a MAJOR Square dance event.

To bring everyone "up to snuff" - the record idea was the brainchild of Doug Bennett and Tony Oxendine. The goal of the project was to raise money to hire a professional marketing firm to help all of us figure out how to attract more "civilians" into our activity. The tune was recorded by 11 CALLERLAB members during the annual CALLERLAB convention in April. At the Tuesday night

banquet, the artists gave a "live" performance, receiving a standing ovation from their peers. Actually, they gave two "live" performances. The first time, someone (whose initials are Tony) put the wrong tape in, and everyone wound up doing a "live" version to the vocal side. But being the pros that they are, they did it a second time to just the instrumental - receiving another standing ovation. Makes one wonder if any one REALLY knew about the first one??????????

The callers in attendance at the convention were offered the opportunity to purchase (sight unseen) a special limited edition version of the record. The prices for the record were \$25 for a "normal" record, \$50 for one signed by all of the artists, and \$100 for one signed and specifically numbered. In addition, there was an auction for record number 001.. The bidding was fast and furious. The opening bid of \$500 was passed early. The next bid of \$1000 was quickly passed as well. The winning bid was

(get this folks) \$2000. Imagine that - \$2000 for ONE record. The lucky recipients of record number 001 were Bill and Peggy Heyman. Bill and Peggy truly stepped up to the plate in showing their support for square dancing, and our hats are off to both of them.

Immediately after the auction, Doug, Tony, and several volunteers "borrowed" the CALLERLAB registration table to take orders for the record. Man, were they in for a shock! Within a few minutes the line was wrapped around the corridor. Callers were clamoring over each other to buy a copy of the record. CALLERLAB members and partners from all over the world were in line to lend their support to our activity. There was a line at the table for more than an hour and a half.

When the crowd finally dispersed and the money was counted (thanks for all the help, Dar) there was almost \$10,000 in record sales and another \$2000 from the auction - bringing the total to nearly \$12,000.

But that was just the start. In June, the regular vinyl record was produced and offered for sale. Tom and Pam Dillandar of Palomino Records and Bill and Peggy Heyman of Hanhurst's Tapes and Records agreed to distribute and sell the record at no cost. ALL of the money was to go to the Foundation. Orders started pouring in. The record was the number one best seller for both June and July (and maybe August, too). The initial 1000 pressings were gone quickly, so another 1000 were ordered. Those too, flew off the shelves, so a third thousand was ordered. Most of the people in the record business anticipate that there will probably have to be several more re-pressings. Several callers have sold the record at their dances. A couple of these callers have sent in for over \$1000 in sales and donations. Several dancers have bought copies for \$100 and more. It is anticipated that the record could sell as many as 5000 copies - something virtually unheard of in the past decade.

But..... most dancers don't own turntables, and we wanted to get the dancers in on this. So, a cassette tape was produced. Jon Jones graciously donated enough money to press 300 tapes. The CALLERLAB Executive Committee then decided to press an additional 200 copies for a total of 500. The Foundation would pay for the additional 200 copies. We thought that after the National Convention in Indianapolis there would be enough tapes on hand in the Home Office to fill incoming orders. WRONG!!!!!! The tape sold out at the National Convention. Don't worry, more tapes have been ordered, and you can get them from the CALLERLAB Home Office, Palomino, or Hanhurst's.

We do not yet know the exact amount of money that the record and tape

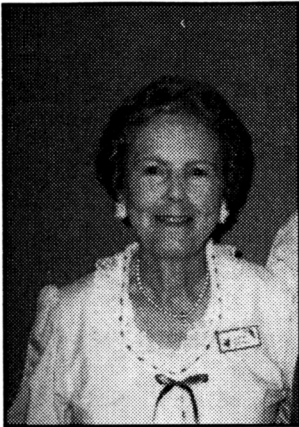

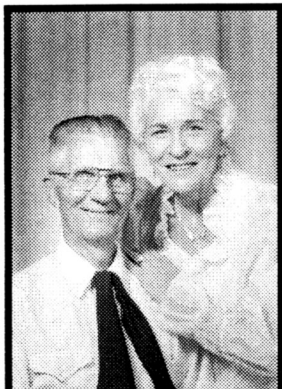

WORD STUDY OF THE WORD

EVIL

Every day we get bombarded by more acts of violence. The information we receive via TV, radio and the press gets more violent every day. What is wrong with our world? Can we make any sense of it? I would like to look at Romans, chapter 1, verses 20 through 32 to seek an answer to the above questions.

Ro:1:20: For the invisible things of him from the creation of the world are clearly seen, being understood by the things that are made, even his eternal power and Godhead; so that they are without excuse:

Ro:1:21: Because that, when they knew God, they glorified him not as God, neither were thankful; but became vain in their imaginations, and their foolish heart was darkened.

Ro:1:22: Professing themselves to be wise, they became fools,

Ro:1:23: And changed the glory of the uncorruptible God into an image made like to corruptible man, and to birds, and fourfooted beasts, and creeping things.

Ro:1:24: Wherefore God also gave them up to uncleanness through the lusts of their own hearts, to dishonour their own bodies between themselves:

Ro:1:25: Who changed the truth of God into a lie, and worshipped and served the creature more than the Creator, who is blessed for ever. Amen.

Ro:1:26: For this cause God gave them up unto vile affections: for even their women did change the natural use into that which is against nature:

Ro:1:27: And likewise also the men, leaving the natural use of the woman, burned in their lust one toward another; men with men working that which is unseemly, and receiving in themselves that recompence of their error which was meet.

Ro:1:28: And even as they did not like to retain God in their knowledge, God gave them over to a reprobate mind, to do those things which are not convenient;

Ro:1:29: Being filled with all unrighteousness, fornication, wickedness, covetousness, maliciousness; full of envy, murder, debate, deceit, malignity; whisperers,

Ro:1:30: Backbiters, haters of God, despiteful, proud, boasters, inventors of evil things, disobedient to parents,

Ro:1:31: Without understanding, covenant breakers, without natural affection, implacable, unmerciful:

Ro:1:32: Who knowing the judgment of God, that they which commit such things are worthy of death, not only do the same, but have pleasure in them that do them.

We start our study by noting that God has made Himself known through the things that we see and experience. There is none that has an excuse that they could not know that there is a God. The more we learn the more that God is revealed. It is not a lack of God revealing Himself to us that is the problem, but rather, our own vain attempts to explain Him away so that we can escape the judgement that is sure to come upon the world. I am not talking about a "hell" that I do not believe exists, but I am talking about the present condition of the world in which we are now living.

We can see these "wise" men daily on TV or in the press telling us that there is no God. That we all evolved from something. We are left wondering where this "something" came from. We are told that the "big bang" is the answer. Where did the "stuff" for the big bang come from? There is no answer that these "learned" men can supply us that can explain what we are, where we came from, or where we will go. Verse 22 states the case for these individuals quite clearly. "Professing themselves to be wise, they became fools." Notice it was "their" profession that they are wise. It is important to notice that "God also gave them up to the uncleanness through the lust of their own hearts, to dishonor their own bodies between themselves".

As we study these verses we will find that God gave them up to 1) their bodies, 2) their Souls and 3) their spirit.

In verse 25 we see man changing the truth of God into a lie and worshipped and served man more than the Creator, God. The very spirit of man is now changed as God gave them up unto vile affections. The very soul of man is given up to lust.

If the above verses are not God's judgement on homosexuals I guess I will never know anything. Our society tells us to be tolerant and the government based on the righteousness of man tells us we are "breaking" the laws to hate the acts of homosexuals. Yet it is these very acts that caused God to "give them up". You read verses 26 and 27 and you decide what God is telling you.

Verse 28 states that "they did not like to retain God in their knowledge, God gave them over to a reprobate mind." Here is the final downward spiral of man. Their very spirit is given up.

The next verses, 29 through 32 really tells us where we are today. We will just look at a few of them.

Haters of God. How can that be? Who hates God? How about the people

that deny His laws? How about the people that deny His very existence? How about the people that enjoy the very things that God opposes? We are not talking about God's people that fall short of His standards. We are talking about people that enjoy doing the things that God tells us not to do.

Without understanding, covenant breakers. We live in a time when a man's word means nothing. If a person tells you that they will do it tomorrow, all that really means is that they are not going to do it today. It has nothing at all to do with tomorrow. What happened to a man's word? We are a world of covenant breakers. We have legal documents that are used to try to enforce a covenant. All this does for us is to provide the lawyers with a good living.

Her ashes were placed in the ocean by the Coast Guard Auxiliary of which she was a member.

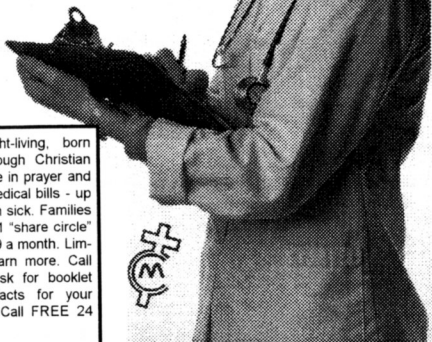

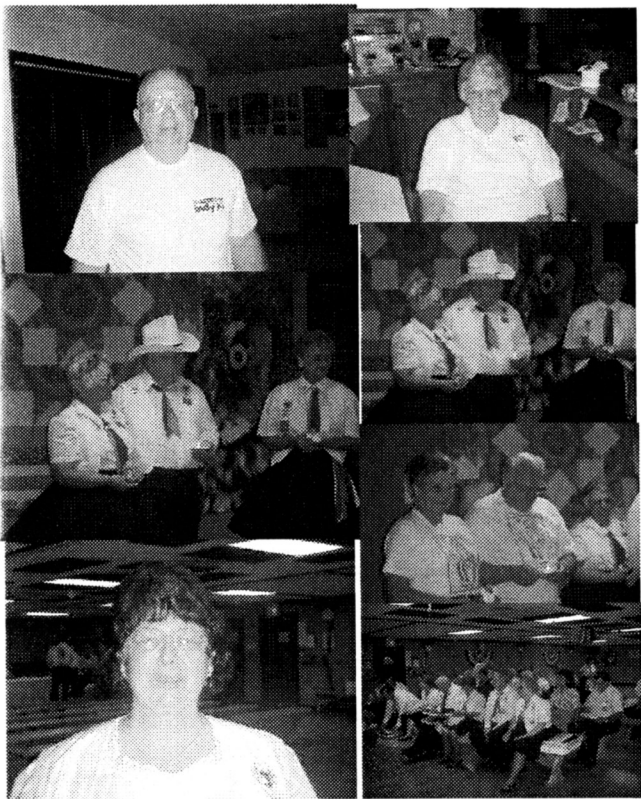
