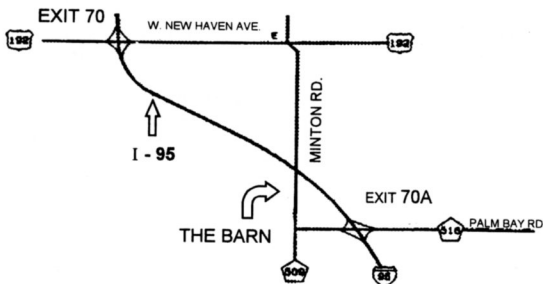

## WORD STUDY OF THE WORD

# NATURAL ALTERNATIVES TO OVER THE COUNTER AND PRESCRIPTION DRUGS

## IMPORTANT: PLEASE READ

The information in this article is intended to increase your knowledge about natural remedies and by no means is intended to diagnose or treat an individual's health problems or ailments. The information given is not medical advice nor is it presented as a course of personalized treatment. There may be risks involved in connection with some of the natural remedies suggested in these articles, just as there may be risks involved in connection with prescription drugs. Therefore, before starting any type of natural remedy or medical treatment, or before discontinuing any course of medical treatment you may now be undergoing, you should consult your own health-care practitioner.

As we enter into the flu season we can find help for many ills from nature.

This month we will focus on Echinacea.

Early Americans and American Indians used this plant as a remedy for snakebites and skin wounds. Research has shown that Echinacea stimulates the immune system, helping the body defend itself against bacterial and viral infections.

Echinacea works best over a short period of time. It is not an effective immune strengthener when used over a long period of time. You should not use this herb for longer than a week at a time.

You should take Echinacea with the first symptoms of the flu. Follow the dosage on the form of Echinacea you choose.

To battle a cold or the flu, take Echinacea at the first sign of symptoms, says Varro E. Tyler, Ph.D, professor of pharmacognosy at Purdue University School of Pharmacy in West Lafayette, Indiana, and author of *The Honest Herbal*. He recommends taking about a teaspoonful of alcohol-based tincture a day to duplicate the effective dose in the German flu study.

A tea made from Echinacea provides a tasty but somewhat less potent alternative. To make a tea, pour boiling water over two to three tablespoons of dried, fresh or powdered herb and steep for five minutes. Sip over a period of 30 to 90 minutes and repeat six to eight hours later. Dr Tyler warns, however, that the lack of standardization in American herbal products makes it hard to guarantee even an approximate dosage of a particular compound. There have also been reports of Echinacea products being adulterated with other herbs. His advice: Purchase herbal products only from well-established, reputable suppliers. Echinacea is generally considered safe, says Dr Tyler, although an allergic reaction is always a possibility. Discontinue use if you experience any adverse effects.

## WHY SUPPORT A CLUB??

The basic foundation of square dancing is "The Club". Every area of the world we have visited, lived in, or heard about has this basic foundation. Clubs come in many different shapes and sizes, but they all serve the same purpose. That purpose is to provide a place for square dancers to gather and enjoy this activity. Hopefully this place will be friendly, pleasant, and comfortable

There are two primary types of clubs. The first and most abundant is the "Board run" club, the second is the "caller/cuer run" club. The board run club is governed by volunteers who have agreed to give their time to the activity. The activity is fortunate indeed to have these people. Without them many clubs would not survive. In fact there are many, many stories about clubs which have been successful, but could not find anyone to serve as officers.

Unfortunately, many times this results in the club "folding"

The job of running a club is challenging and can be quite frustrating, especially if there are numerous complaints about insignificant details. It is our opinion that most of us will have at least one thing which "bugs" us. If this thing is not harmful, hurtful, illegal, nor immoral perhaps we could examine our complaint before voicing it to the club officers. This is not to say we should suffer in silence if something does "bug" us. It seems appropriate, though, to trust the officers we have elected (and who volunteered) to do the right thing for the club. It also seems appropriate to voice our complaints to the club leadership and not to other members. This will allow the leadership to investigate the complaint, take appropriate action, or bring the situation to the attention of the club for resolution. One of the things about a democratic organization is that the will of the majority is the will of the organization. Even if we do not agree with the majority view, it is our responsibility to respect that view and to abide by it.

Some of the areas which come to mind when we think about supporting the club are helping with the "chores" i.e. host & hostess, kitchen help, helping with decorating for special dances, going on banner raids, and other similar "chores". There are some halls where we have to move tables and chairs before AND after a dance, we have to sweep the floor, we have to empty the trash, and clean up the hall after each dance. Doing these chores is not our

## NORWEGIAN CHRISTMAS COOKIES

Doris Dean Castoff Square Dance Club

1/2 pound butter      1 cup currant jelly  
1/2 cup sugar        4 egg whites  
1 egg yolk            1 cup sugar  
1/4 teaspoon salt    1 teaspoon lemon or almond extract  
1/2 teaspoon vanilla or almond extract  
2 1/2 cups all-purpose flour 1/2 cup chopped nuts

Cream butter with 1/2 cup sugar. Beat in egg yolk, salt, vanilla and flour. Batter will be stiff. Spread in 9 x 13 x 2 inch baking pan. Beat jelly with fork. Spread on dough. Whip egg whites until stiff. Gradually add 1 cup sugar until meringue stands in peaks. Fold in chopped nuts and extract. Swirl over jelly. Bake at 350° for 40 to 45 minutes. Meringue must be dry and golden brown. Cool and cut into squares.

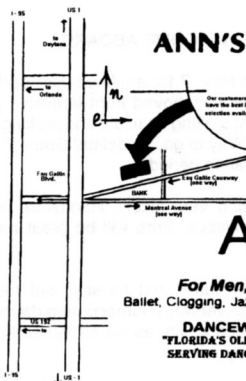

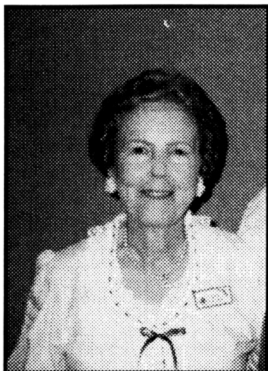
